Phil Blau received his mathematics Ph.D. from the University of Massachusetts. After four years teaching at Boston University's College of General Studies, he has been at Shawnee State University where he is currently a professor of mathematical

sciences and the director of the General Education Program. His service to the Ohio Section of the Mathematical Association of America includes a term as its president.

Presentation Summary:

Despite a brief life of forty years, Bernhard Riemann had a profound impact on mathematics. His inaugural dissertation, published in 1851, is a classic among classic mathematical papers. Dr. Blau provides an overview of this seminal work and the man behind it.
