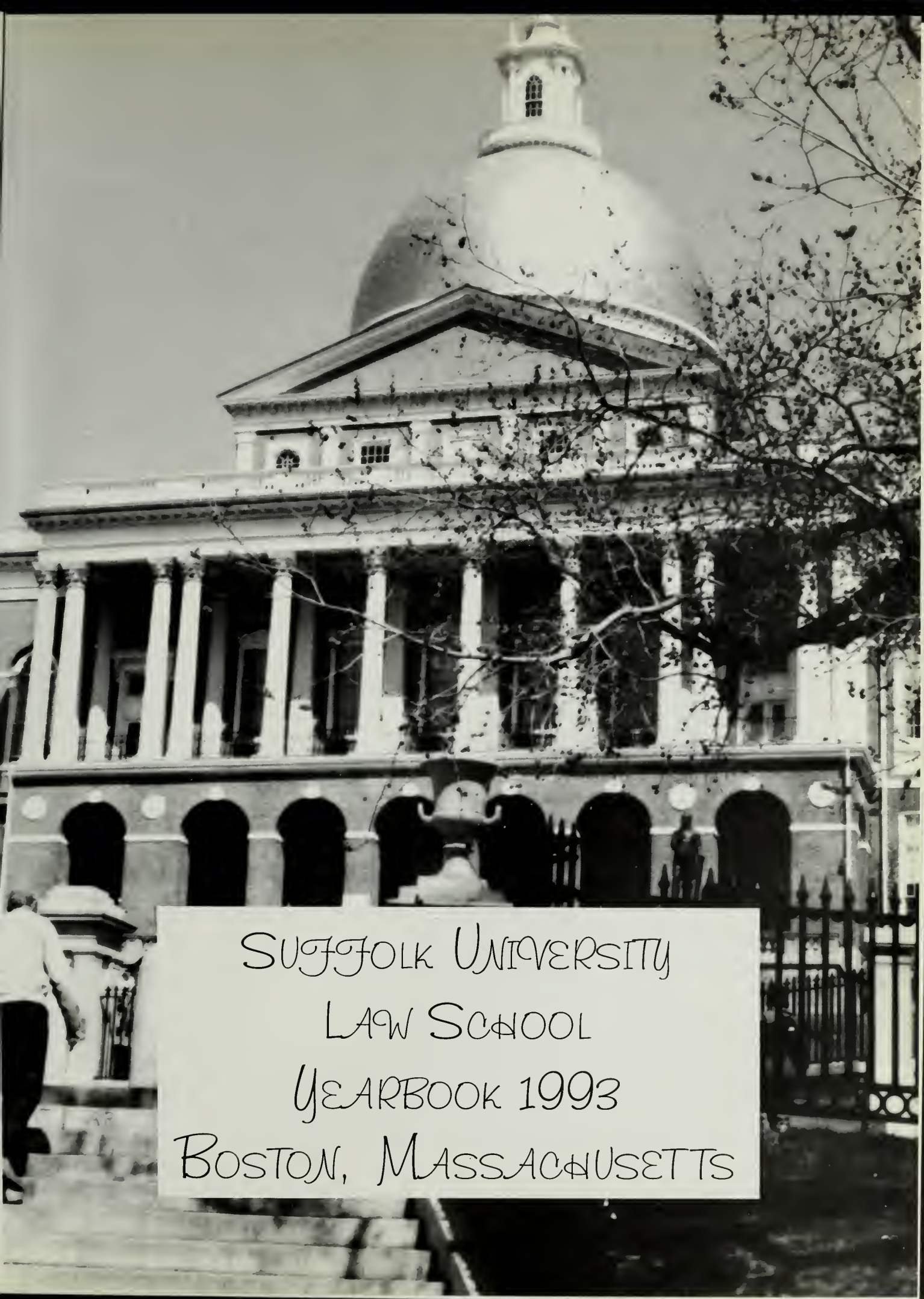

## *In Memoriam*

Austin T. Stickells  
(1914 - 1993)

A graduate of Washington University in St. Louis in 1938, Professor Stickells received his law degree from Boston University Law School in 1947 and held an MBA from Boston University as well. He was an intelligence officer with the Army during World War II and was wounded during an invasion of Germany and received the Purple Heart. Professor Stickells was a former dean and professor emeritus at Boston University Law School and specialized in anti-trust and business law and wrote a number of books on the subject. He joined the Suffolk University Law School faculty in 1983.

## DEDICATION

The 1993 graduating class of Suffolk University Law School proudly dedicates this yearbook to Professor Alexander J. Cella. Throughout his distinguished professional and academic life, Professor Cella has become a respected scholar and teacher both within and outside of the Suffolk University community.

Professor Cella received his juris doctor degree from Suffolk Law School in 1961. He was awarded his bachelor of arts in government degree cum laude from Harvard College and his masters in public administration degree from Littauer Graduate School of Public Administration (now the John F. Kennedy School of Government) at Harvard University.

Professor Cella's accomplishments are diverse and span his lifetime, from his educational achievements at Harvard University and Suffolk University Law School, to his days as a member of the House of Representatives for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and, finally, to his tenure as a Professor at Suffolk University Law School.

While serving in the legislature, he gained international fame for his efforts to right the injustice done decades earlier in the Sacco and Vanzetti trial. Later, he served as legal assistant and legal counsel to former Speakers of the House John F. Thompson, John F. X. Davoren and Robert H. Quinn, and Senate President Maurice A. Donahue.

Throughout his 22-year teaching career at Suffolk, Professor Cella has not only shared his knowledge of the substantive and procedural aspects of the law, he has also provided his students with continuous personal, professional and academic guidance. He has been an active advisor to several student organizations including the Suffolk University Law Review and the Catholic Lawyer's Guild. Explaining his rapport with students, he once said, "First you have to enjoy what you're doing and I do. You must be as accessible as you can and you have to put your cards on the table. Don't con them." The students have responded to his efforts with appreciation. The Law Review has honored Cella three times and the Student Bar Association presented him with the Frederick A. McDermott Award for teaching excellence in 1973.

In April, 1993, hundreds of friends and colleagues, including many past and present students, gathered at the Boston Park Plaza Hotel to pay tribute to Professor Cella. On that evening, Professor Cella was praised as "a friend to generations of students." In response, Professor Cella emphasized the importance of students in his life. The establishment of the Cella Scholarship was announced by Dean Sugarman that evening.

In recognition of his continued commitment to Suffolk University Law School and its students, the Class of 1993 dedicates this yearbook to Professor Alexander J. Cella.

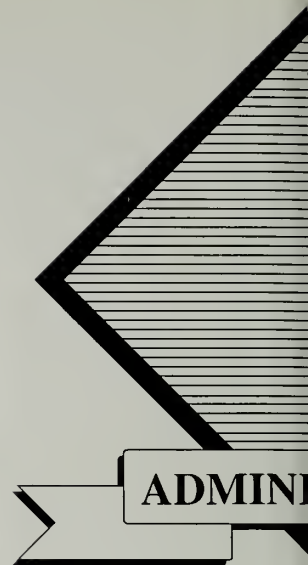

## MARKING TIME

There are a few collections in the apartment where I have lived throughout law school, but there is one collection that grows by the same increment each year. With posterity rather than personal bias in mind, I have saved from each of the past several years one newspaper front page to mark time.

The first front page is from October of 1987. Black Monday had struck Wall Street, the U.S. had struck two Iranian oil platforms, Bernard Goetz had been sentenced, and George H.W. Bush had hired Billy Martin for the fifth and final time. Picking up the paper that day, you had to wonder in what order things were going (a) broke, (b) to war, or (c) insane.

In the summer of 1990 — “on or about August 28th” as we would have us say — the Suffolk Law Class of 1993 began law school with a meeting in the Walsh Auditorium. It was by this time that the world had started to wind the U.S. a little tighter. Iraq already had invaded Kuwait and the U.S. was beginning to respond.

Several people spoke in Walsh Auditorium that first morning of orientation, chief among them Professor Steven Rosenstat. He spoke, if memory still serves me at all, about *L.P.S. v. Rogers v. Rogers*, the case over which I would come to know several sectionmates and the meaning behind a drink called a “woo-woo”. The name Saddam Hussein invariably sprang into these conversations.

At some point late in the fall of first year, a member of the L.P.S. section -- he was ROTC as an undergraduate -- was called to active duty in the Middle East. After hurrying to marry his fiancée, he had learned that a minor medical condition would prevent him from serving in the Persian Gulf. The event was beginning to define First Year.

Much of the discussion around Thanksgiving of 1990 was whether we were headed irreversibly toward war, whether chemical weapons would be used, whether the Middle East would offer the world a black cloud that would rise to alter our seasons. Could we extend the deadline, draw another line in the sand for Saddam? The tones of the discussions had narrowed by the winter break, and the possibility was raised that other unloved

Mediterranean countries (i.e. Libya) would seize the opportunity to become involved.

On January 16, 1991, I was late to meet two friends at the Boston Garden for the Celtics-Golden State basketball game. I had been watching the first network reports of the war at the top of the 7 p.m. newscasts. Most of those in attendance at Boston Garden learned of the beginning of the Gulf War from the Celtics' public address announcer. A moment of silence or prayer followed. Many of those seated around us in the first balcony considered leaving -- some to get to a television, some because the thought of being among 14,890 under one urban roof simply seemed stupid in light of Iraq's threat to unleash the “Mother of All Battles” if the U.S. attacked.

Late in the second quarter of the game, we watched as a number of security guards converged toward the first balcony area behind one of the baskets. Thousands began to rise to their feet to focus on what turned out to be a fistfight started by a drunken thrasher. Fights in the Boston Garden usually do not draw the majority to their feet.

On January 17, 1991, in between and in lieu of classes, students gathered around a television set that the University had placed in the second floor hallway of the Donahue Building. “Are we bombing yet?”

“Yeah, shhhh, Bernard Shaw's still live...” That night some of us who lived on Beacon Hill could hear the chanting and singing from those protesting the war at the steps of the Statehouse.

The first full day of the war, three friends and I walked away from class and toward my apartment to view what we could televise. I didn't have cable television, but that didn't matter in the early days of The Gulf War. I took a picture of the three sectionmates sitting on my couch in the midday sun and watching the war. One of them is wearing his smirk, another a plaster cast on his forearm, and the third a tiny reflection on his black-rimmed eyeglasses of a fighter plane taking off from a U.S. aircraft carrier positioned in the Gulf. I placed *The Boston Globe* in my closet.

By the third day of the war, Bernard Trainor, Tony Cortesman and numerous other retired military types had provided us with a working knowledge of the range, capabilities and derivations of the SCUD missile. The chanting and singing outside our windows returned that night, and many others afterward.

The war would remain with us through the days of researching and writing our Moot Court briefs. The possible consequences of no-fly zones and Kurdish refugees starving in the mountains would parallel the end of classes and then the end of exams.

Whether the Gulf War contributed perspective or distraction, whether it served to energize or enervate the Class of 1993, it increasingly marks our time on Temple Street.
