Thank you for taking the time to contact me in regard to Judge Garrity's action placing South Boston High School under a court-appointed receivership.

I am extremely concerned about the Judge stripping the elected School Committee of most of its power over desegregation matters by establishing independent departments to oversee the situation.

Additionally, I am very dismayed by Judge Garrity's order to have Headmaster Bill Reid, his entire administrative staff, and football coach Arthur Perdigao transferred.

Our Country is a democracy and is ruled by elected officials. Judge Garrity is ruling in a dictatorial fashion. I believe that Garrity has overstepped his bounds by placing control of the school in the hands of an outside authority.

The Judge's actions must be contested in the courts, all the way to the Supreme Court, if necessary.

I am currently investigating all courses of action which might be successful in overturning this unjust act.
