

Dear Representative Moakley:

Please oppose and work actively to defeat H.R. 55. 55, the Strike Bill. This legislation represents one of the boldest power grabs by organized labor since the days of Labor Law Reform in the late 1970s. In fact, efforts to include this measure as part of Labor Law Reform were rejected by the Carter Administration as being too radical.

The right to strike has always been balanced by the corresponding right of an employer to continue operations. The fact that many industries cannot continue operations with temporary replacements means that use of permanent replacements may occasionally be necessary.

Our company, our customers and our community do not intend to stand by while Congress attempts to dramatically reshape labor/management relations in a way that would adversely affect the ability of the U.S. to compete in world markets.

Please inform me of your position on this legislation so that I may report back to my colleagues in the area.
