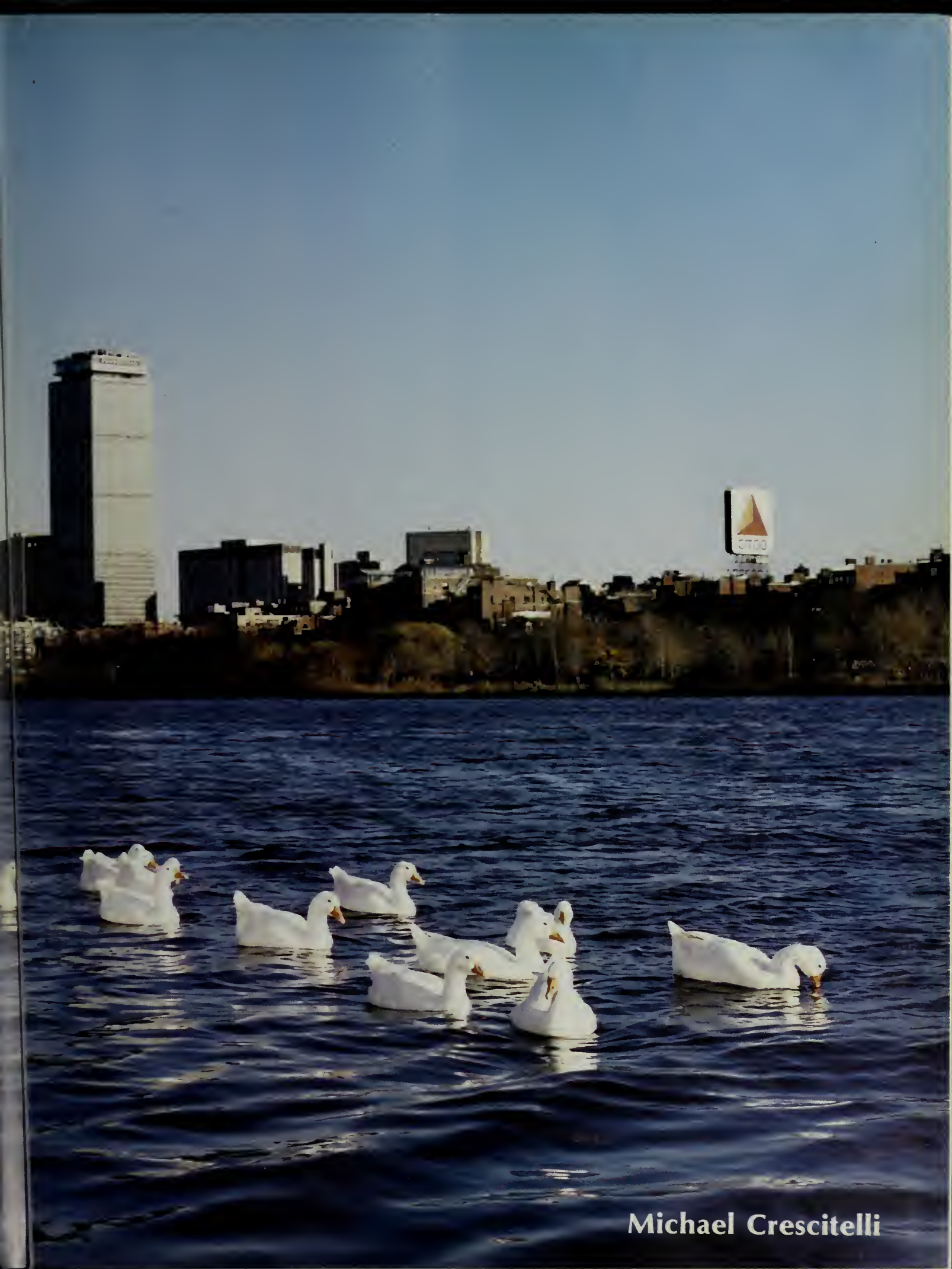

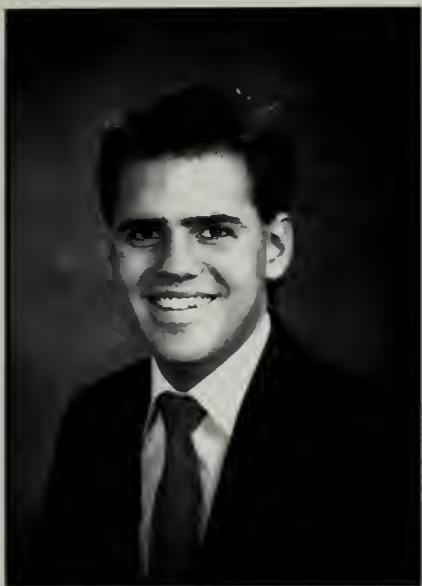

Who knows what other new images the 1990's may have in store for the world and the city of Boston but the next ten years will hold many.





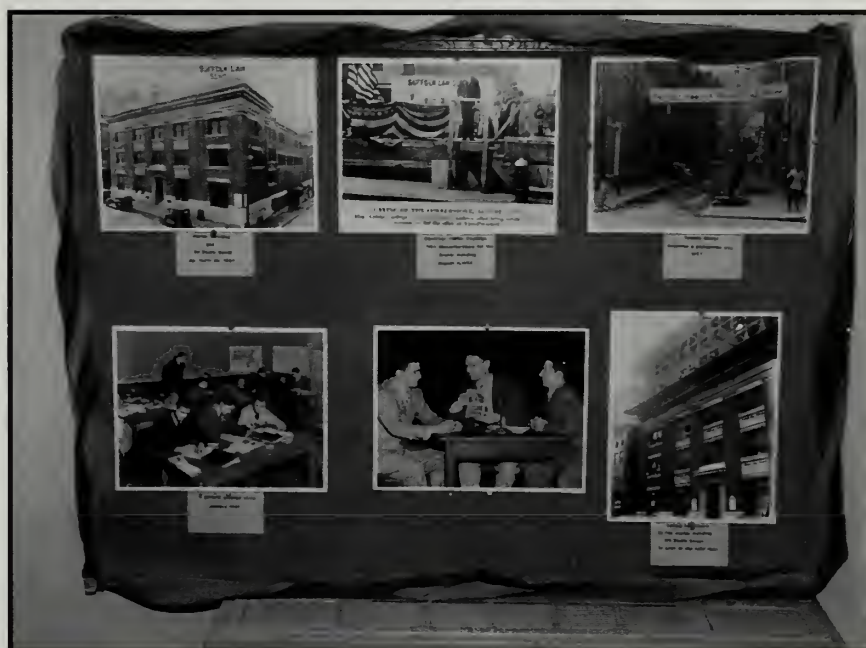

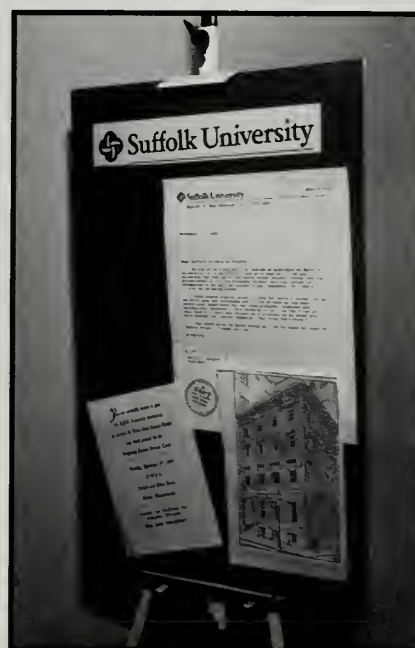

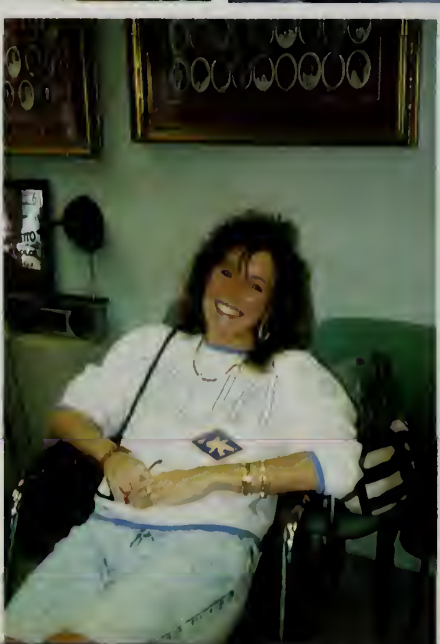
# Seniors

## Hitting 1,000



The 1989-1990 Basketball season was highlighted by two outstanding achievements. Ed Cirame and Kelly Harney, both senior co-captains of the Men's and Women's Basketball teams respectively, broke the 1,000 point career mark.

Ed Cirame was a leading scorer and starter for the past three years and an outstanding contributor his freshman year. Cirame broke the 1,000 point threshold in only the 3rd game of the season, a win against Bridgewater State College. The climatic event came on his 22nd and final point of the night — a free throw. Although Cirame was proud and excited about his accomplishment he said he was glad the pressure was off and he just wanted the team to have a good season.

Kelly Harney's moment came in the second half of the season in a win against Emerson College. Harney became only the 3rd woman in Suffolk's history to score 1,000 points. After being a 4 year starter and leading scorer Harney's 2nd half jump shot put her over the 1,000 point mark. The Women's Basketball team made a big deal of the 3rd highest scorer in Suffolk University's Women's Basketball history. However, Harney down played the accomplishment, agreeing with Cirame that she was glad the pressure was off and she wished the overall season could have been more successful.

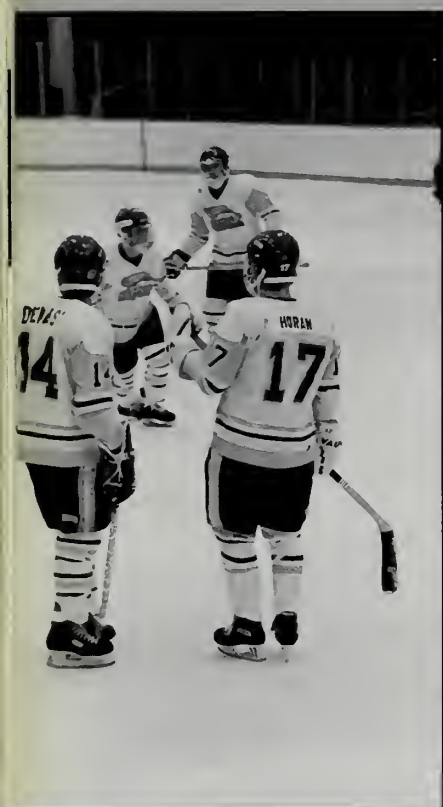
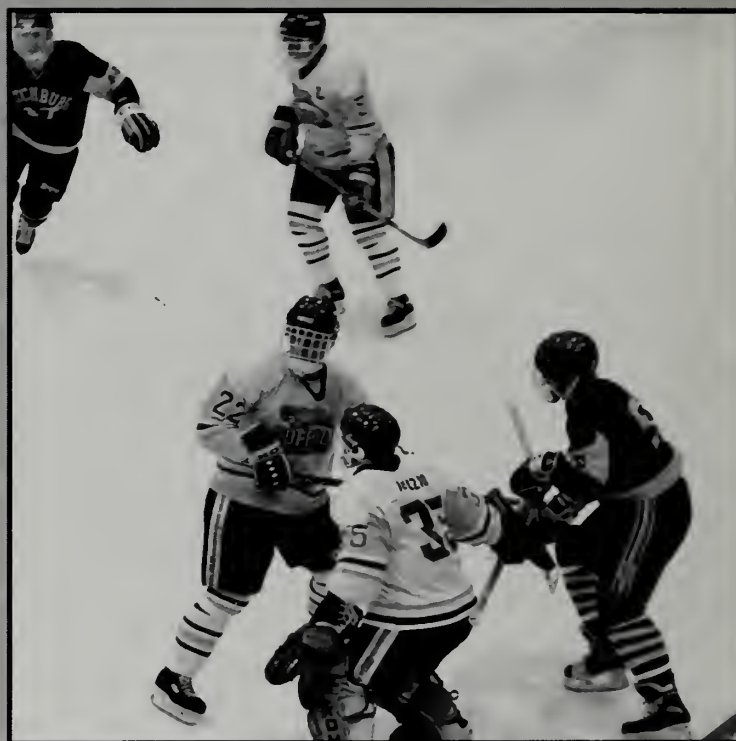
# Hockey

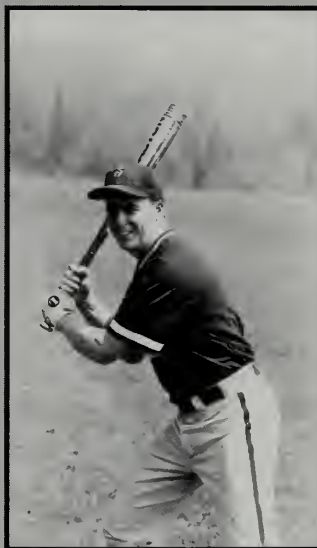

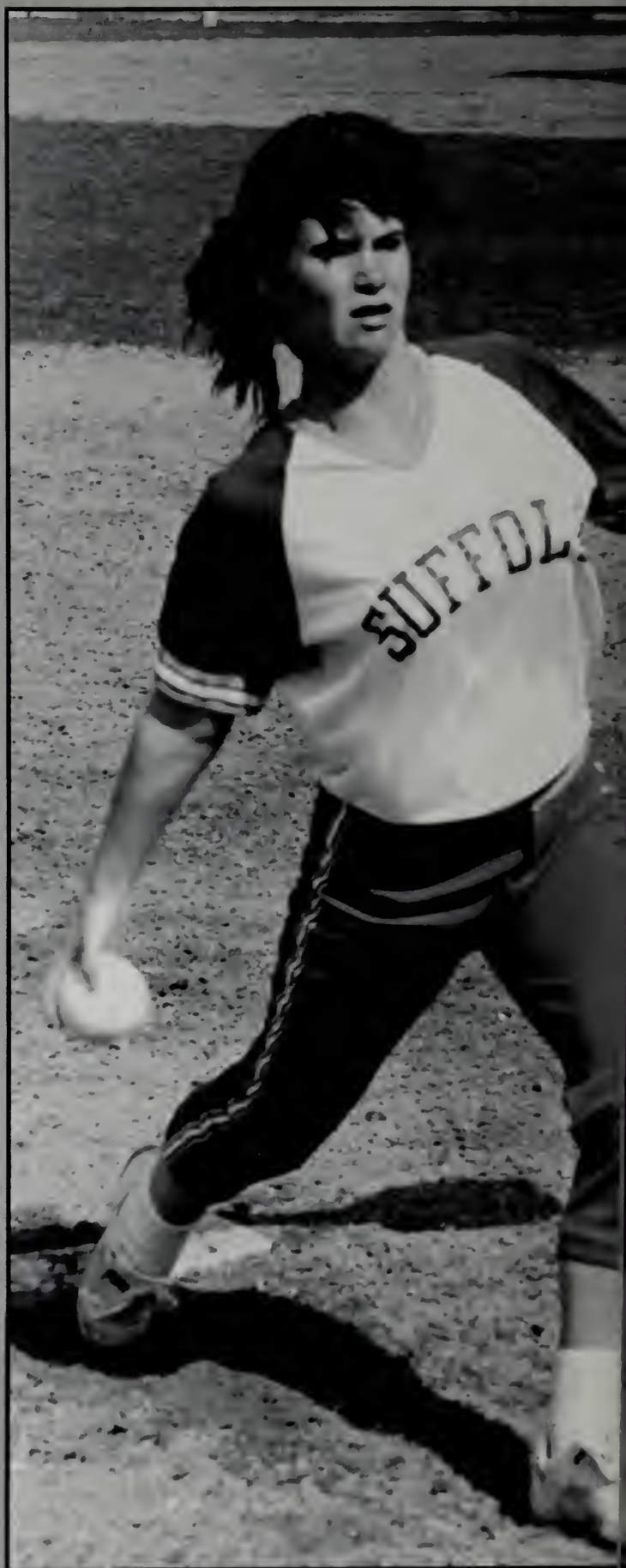
# Softball

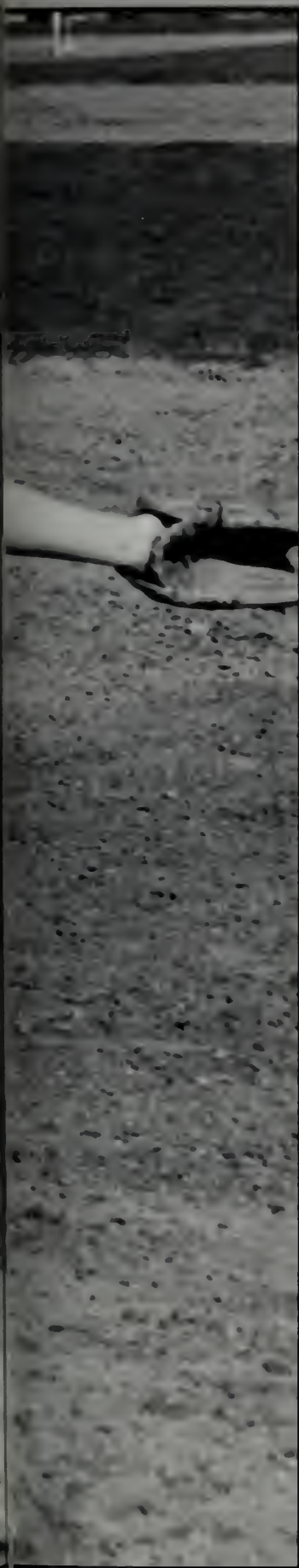
future.
