This aid included \$5 million in reapons, counter insurgency equipment and two beliconters. The U.S. is presently and two helicopters. The U.S. is presently training Salvadorean troops in Panama, and has a total of 250 military advisors operating for the U.S. government. El. Salvador is the most densely populated country in Latin America with a

populated country in Latin America with a total of five million people. According to Amnesty International, close to 10,000 people have been killed there since January, 1980. The daily death toll has been estimated at 50. been estimated at 50.

 El Salvador has been under military rule, since 1932, and has had a long history of economic, political, and social problems. Fourteen wealthy families control most of roureen weatiny tamilies control most of the land and export business in El Salvador, according to Amnesty International, 60 percent of the land is owned by 2 percent of the population. Only 35 percent of the population is employed year round, and 73 percent of the children under five suffer om mainutrition. And of every 1000 babies born, 63 do not live past the first

babies born, 63 do not live past the first year, they said.

Lecturer in Government Ernest A. Greco told the group that the parallels to the Vietnam War are "amazing," and that it is especially interesting for people old enough to remember the role that the US played in Vietnam. Thus, he said, it is possible that a situation like the "police action" of Vietnam could occur, and people should be aware of this


