# IN MEMORIAM

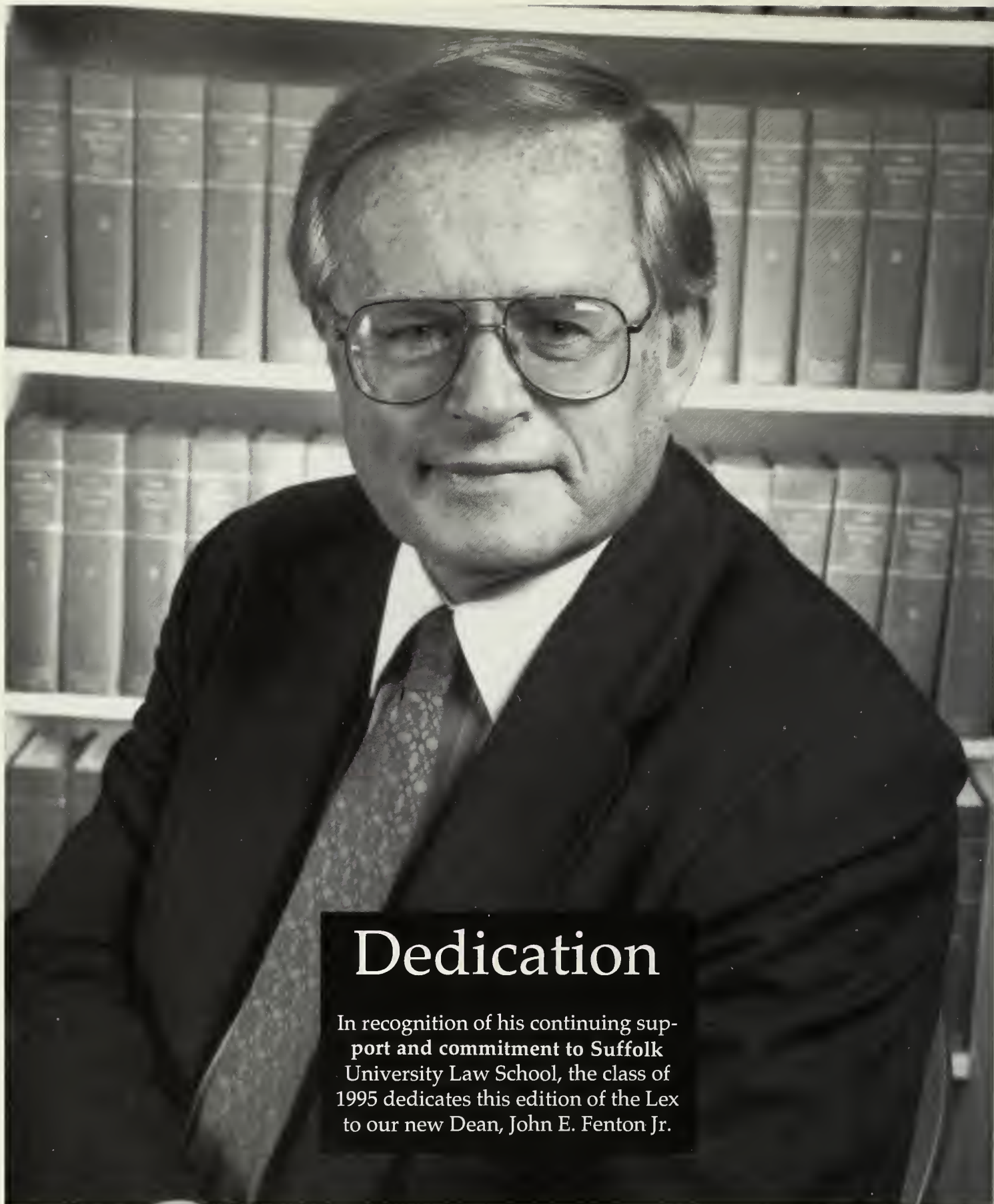
**Professor Alexander J. Cella, '61**, passed away on December 2, 1993. Professor Cella, a graduate of Harvard and Suffolk University Law School, was a true scholar and an admired teacher at Suffolk for the past twenty-two years. The author of a leading three volume treatise on Administrative Law, he taught Legislation and Administrative Law. Professor Cella served with dedication and distinction as the advisor to the Suffolk University Law Review.

**John P. Chase**, passed away on April 1, 1994. Mr. Chase served on the board of trustees from 1965 to 1994. A magna cum laude graduate of Harvard, he was the captain of the 1932 United States silver medal Olympic Hockey team. Mr. Chase was an investment counselor and a life trustee of Suffolk University.

**Walter H. McLaughlin, '30**, passed away on March 13, 1994. He served as an Associate Justice and Chief Justice of the Superior Court of Massachusetts. A longtime trustee of Suffolk University, Chief Justice McLaughlin also served as chair of the Law School Committee. The Walter H. McLaughlin Oral Advocacy Competition at the Law School is named in his honor.

**Bruce Weinberg**, passed away on February 5, 1994. Bruce graduated from M.I.T. and was a member of the class of 1995 who started at Suffolk Law in the evening division in 1991. Bruce was an invaluable member of the Dicta staff in 1992 and 1993. He was "an incredibly bright individual who asked very penetrating questions." After both of his first two years, Bruce was ranked first in his class. Bruce was also a former president of the New England Regional Volleyball Association.
