Since that time, a special Investigatory Commission WXXXXXXXXXX headed by an army colonel, was formed -- and apparantly has now been disbanded. The President of El Salvador Jose Napoleon Duarte -- caliams that prosecution is unlikely. In other words, nothing will happen. And what of the actions on the part of the United States Governm net in regard to this matter? The sad thing --- is that we have done realatively little save for a few symbolic -- politically expedientacts. The Reagan Administration has -- instead -- chose to ignore the murder of these women and the murder of countless civilians in W E1 Salvador. In fact, the Admonistration has stepped up military aid to defend the oppressive Duarte regime.in order to preserve 'self-determoniation and freedom' in El Salvador. What a tragic deception this is. Duarte's brand of freedom means jail for anyone who has the audacity to tell the truth about what is going on in El Salvador. According to a recent report of the United Nations Human Rights Commission---an estimated 9,250 politival murders were committed in the firts six months of 1981. naped F The four women who were murdered in El Salvador were murdered for cotage and determination in carrying the banner for social justice. And let us have the foresight and common sense to not let their murders be in vein.
