## Graduate fellow saves life

The ESL DePlace, right next door to the Capitol Coffee House. <br> At approximately 1:30 p.m., ESL secretary, Maria Oliveira, was viowhen Gary Zerola intervened and performed the Heimlich Maneuver. Zerola, who was tutoring an ESL student, noticed that Oliveira was not breathing properly and that her face so fast," Zerola remembered. "One student went to get a glass of water, while another got a chair. No one was reacting to the emergency. <br> While the whole incident took merely minutes, to Zerola the episode seemed to last forever. After calling the police, Zerola continued to perform the Heimlich on the stricken Oliveira. Sgt. Mike Ryan and Capt.
