

Dear :

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for taking the time to respond to my recent questionnaire sent to your home.

I noted your comments on forced busing and would like to take a few minutes of your time to detail some of my efforts in this area of concern.

I have been working with my colleague Alan Steelman of Texas, to gain additional signatures on a dishharge petition to free anti-busing legislation from the Judiciary Committee.

I was one of three House Democrats to demand and organize a meeting of the Democratic Caucus of consider busing.

I personally rose to tell my Democratic colleagues about the tragedies busing has brought to the City of Boston. I was disappointed that a majority of my colleagues voted in support of busing, but at the very least, our efforts in the Caucus raised the public consciousness to the publicems created by forced busing.

Additionally, I have requested then grongsman Kastenmeier, Chairman of the Subcommittee on the Courts and the Administration of Justice, to look into the Garrity ruling on South Boston High.

As a graduate of "Southie" High, I am deeply disturbed by the Judge's ruling. I support efforts to bring an appeal to the Courts to overturn this ill-advised move.

As you may well see, it has not been easy to effect a real and dramatic shift in opposition to Forced Busing in the Congress. But I shall keep trying. I liken the Forced Busing controversy in the 70's to Vietnam in the 60's.

At the beginning of the American involvement in Vietnam, only a few legislators and government officials spoke out against the War. The same holds true for busing now. I do believe that more and more public leaders will begin to recognize that busing is resegregating our public schools and that the quality of education for blacks and whites is not improving.

I support neighborhood schools and will not let up in my fight to return the Schools to the people.

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to respond to your concern.
