A skinny man with "Keep off the Grast" headlined across his t-shirt approached lie Judiciary Committee at the State House and began pulling out marijuans paraphemalis. Out of leather bound briefcase he placed a "frishee play," a gas mask pipe, a hong, and a copy of High Times magazine on the table and began to testify in favor of a bill before the committee which would forbid the sale of drug related materials.


