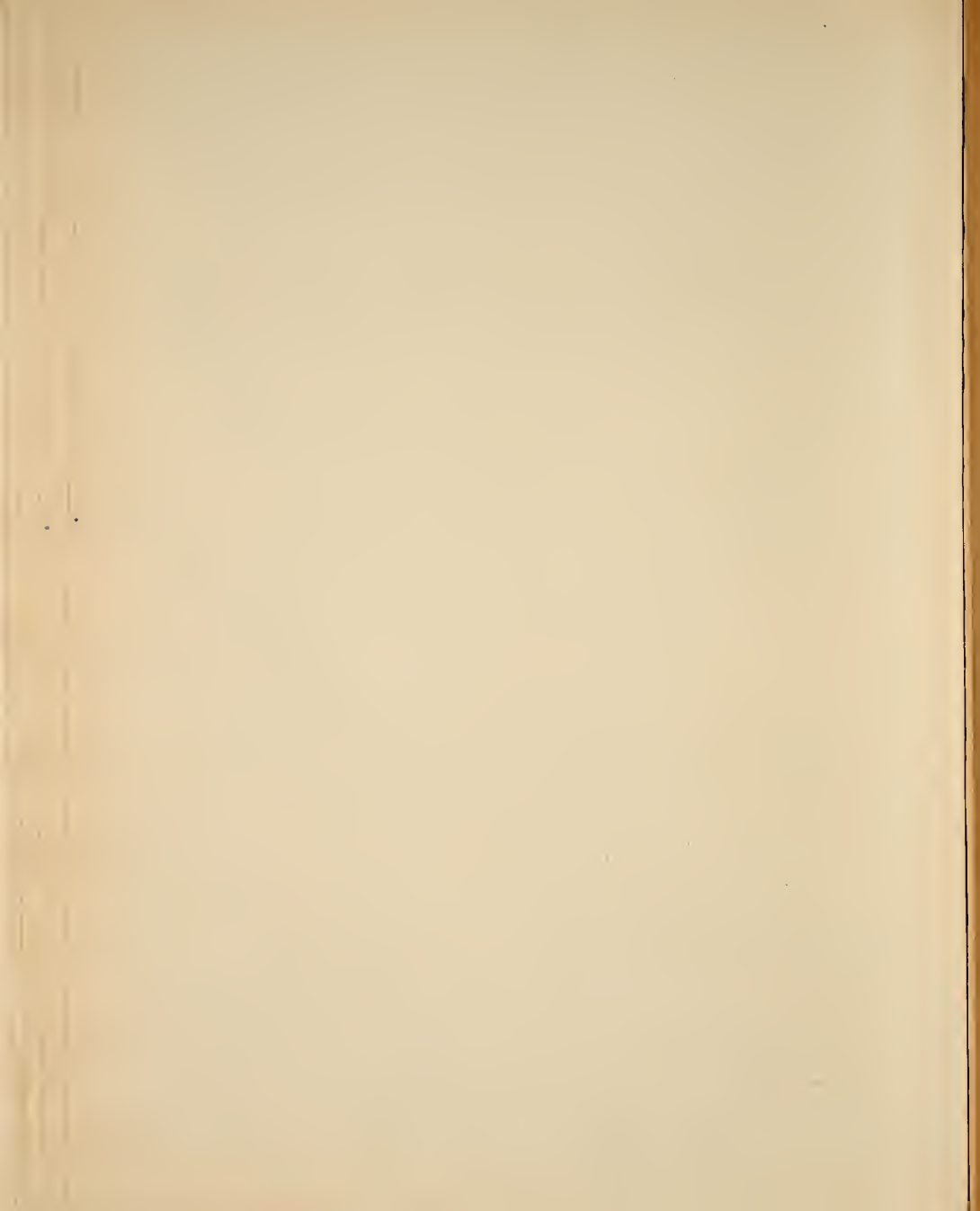
MAP OF

**DOVER**

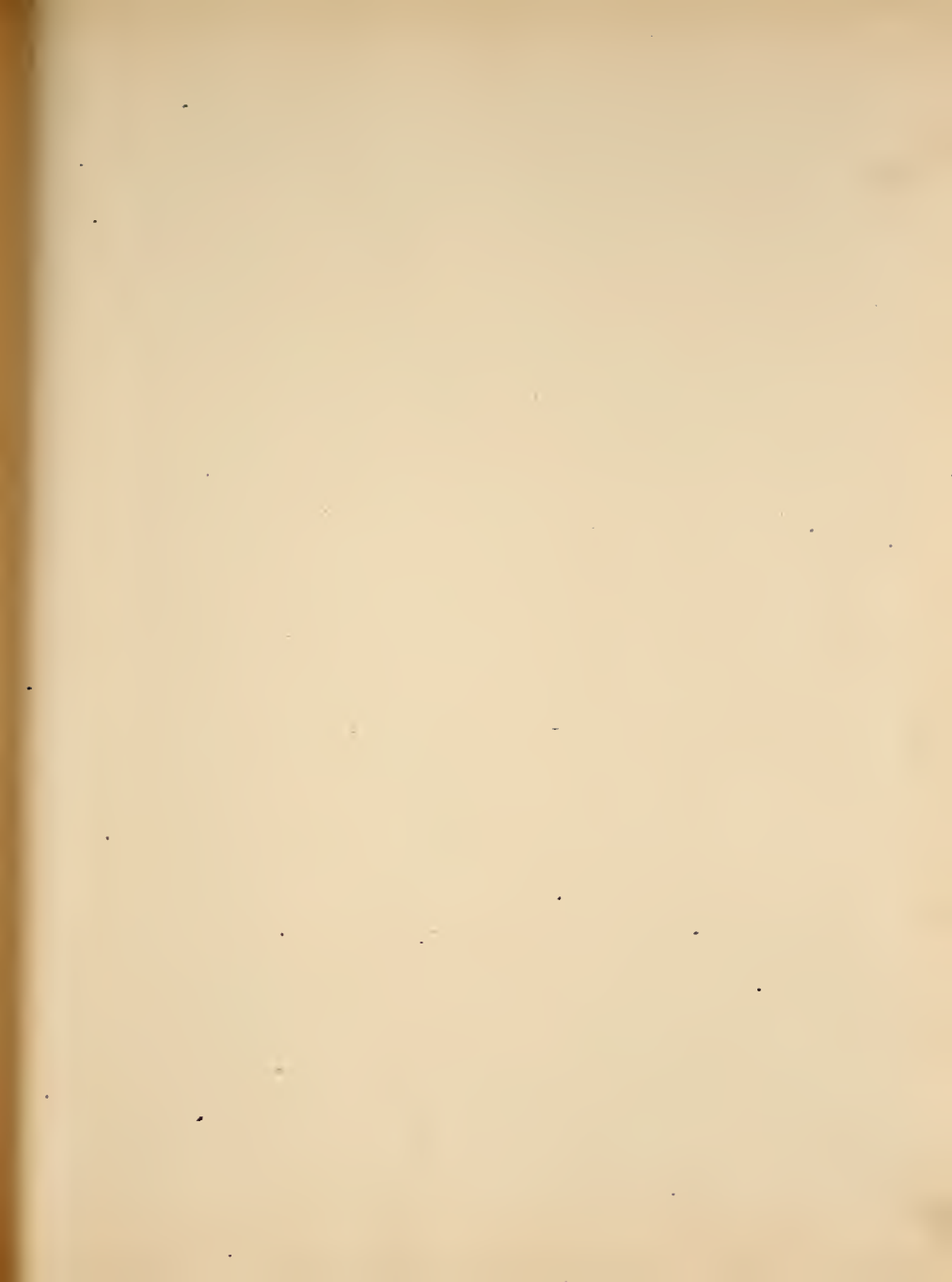
