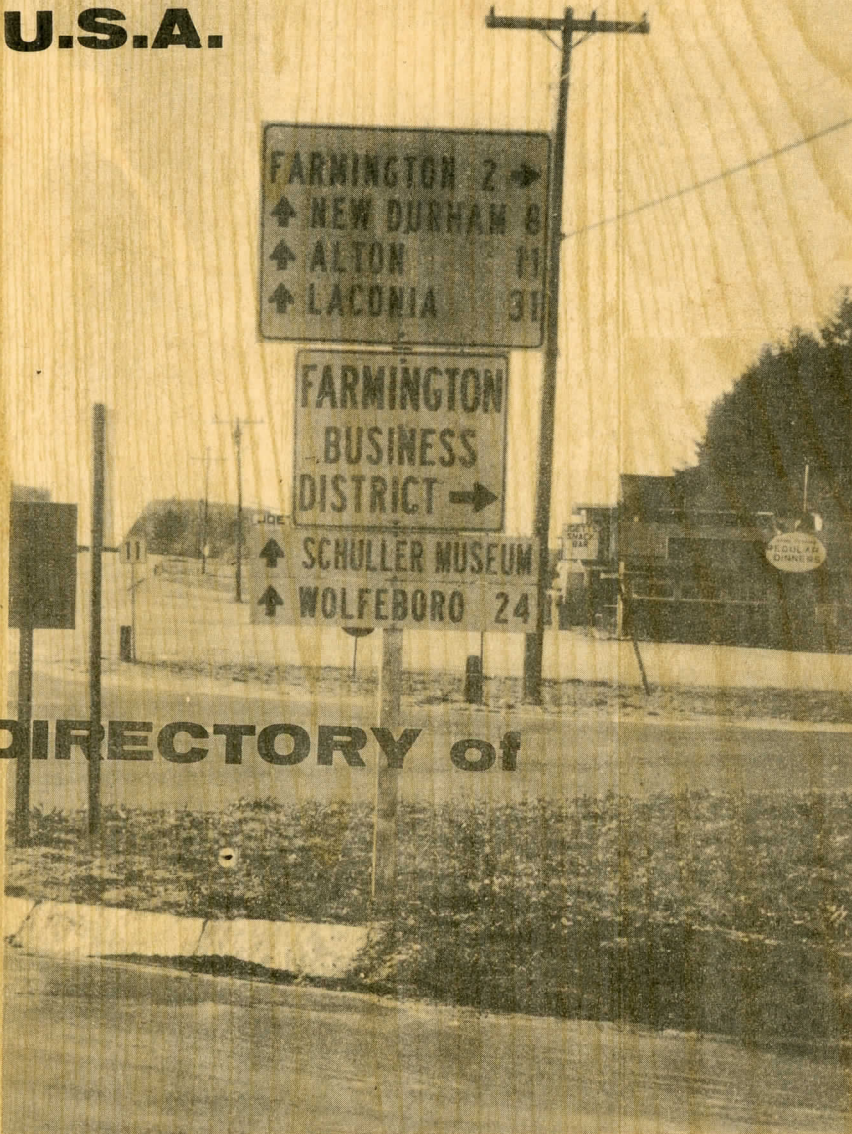

INTRODUCTION

Since its settlement in 1770 by English colonists, Farmington, formerly called Puddledock, has been known for its friendly atmosphere. In this picturesque town of four thousand persons one can find contentment, beautiful scenery, and grand old homes of another era.

Nestled in a valley between two lovely ridges, this peaceful township was formed from the expanses of land between Laco-
nia and Dover. Originally the northwest sector of Rochester, Farmington gained its freedom in 1798, fifteen years after it petitioned for this right.

Located about midway between the ocean and the lake and mountain regions, Puddledock serves as a passageway from both the north and the south to these scenic wonders.

Farmington has had its share of great men, too. Henry Wilson, Vice-President under Ulysses S. Grant, was born here in 1812. Martin Luther Hayes, first of New Hampshire's truly successful shoe industrialists, was born here in 1837 and Henry Clinton Fall and Raymond Peal, both noted scientists originated from this village.

Puddledock does not lack for cultural enlightenment. The Historical Society, D.A.R., C.A.R., the facilities of the Goodwin Memorial Library and the exhibits of the Schuller Museum of Medieval Armor provide excellent opportunities for cultural advancement. Summer theatres are in near reach as are the facilities of the University of New Hampshire.

Farmington's schools and teachers are among the best in the state. The newly built high school is truly one of the best in the area and the Burtman-Rondeau Gymnasium one of the finest in the Seacoast area.

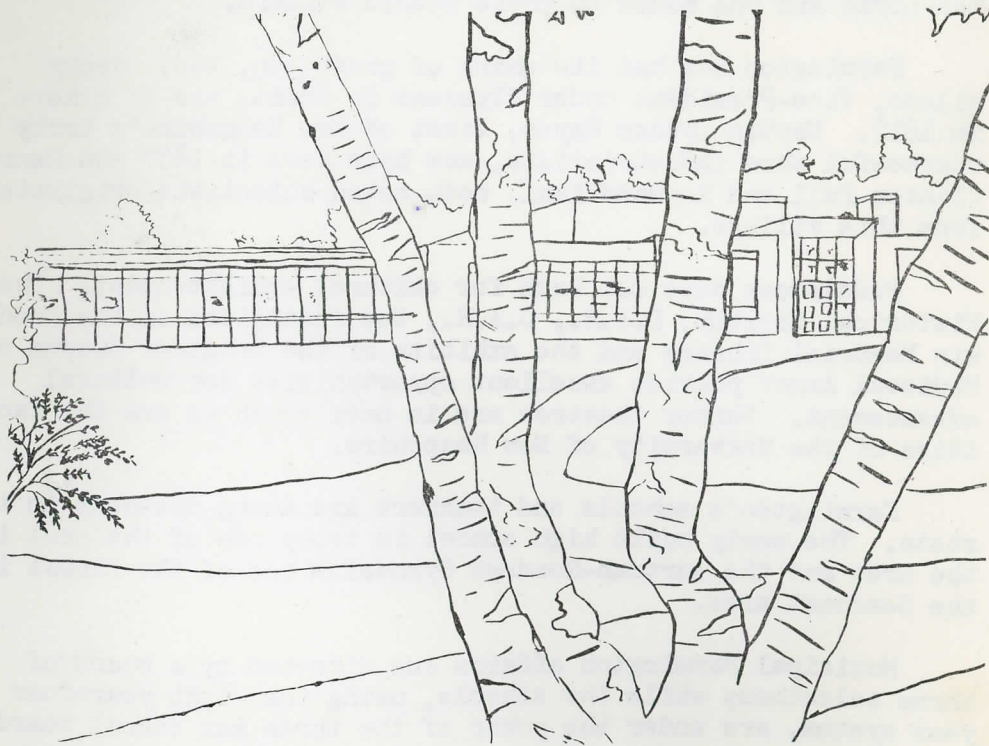
Municipal Farmington affairs are directed by a board of three selectmen; while the schools, using the eight year-four year system, are under the power of the three man school board. Matters concerning the entire town, such as municipal and school budgets are taken care of in the most democratic way, through

town meetings, where all citizens may participate in the running of the town.

Puddledock's fine water is taken from artesian wells that service the entire town. The town also runs the Pine Grove Cemetary, the sewage system, snow removal, road maintenance, and refuge disposal systems.

A volunteer fire department ably keeps all loses by fire to a minimum and an alert police force protects the citizens interests and property.

A fine, healthy atmosphere, beautiful scenery, excellent job opportunities, high quality schools, many friendly social organizations, good recreational facilities are found in and around our town of Farmington. What more could a person want and find in such a pleasing package.

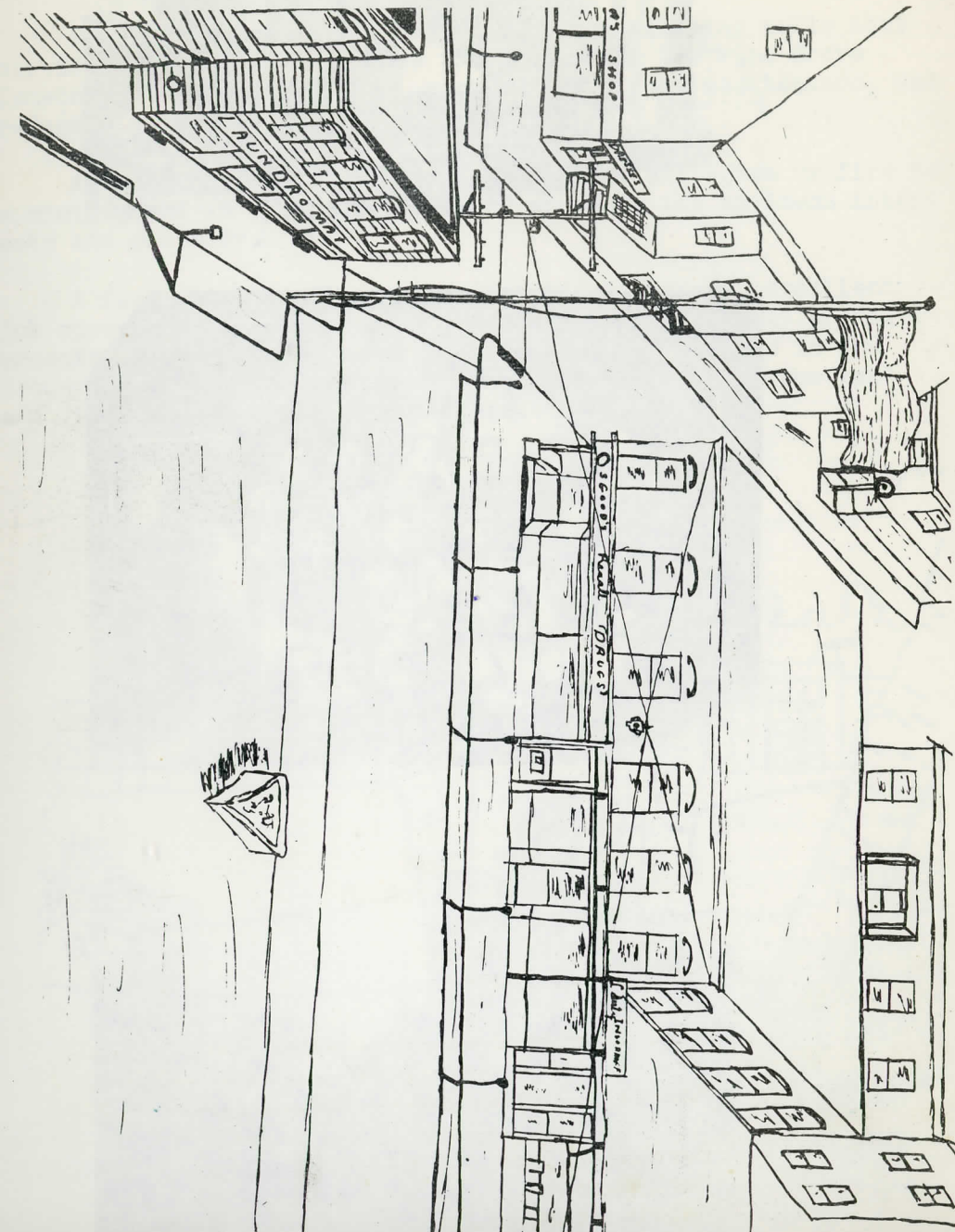

In elections we observe this by registering and voting and by helping to put into office persons who will run our government in a worthy manner.

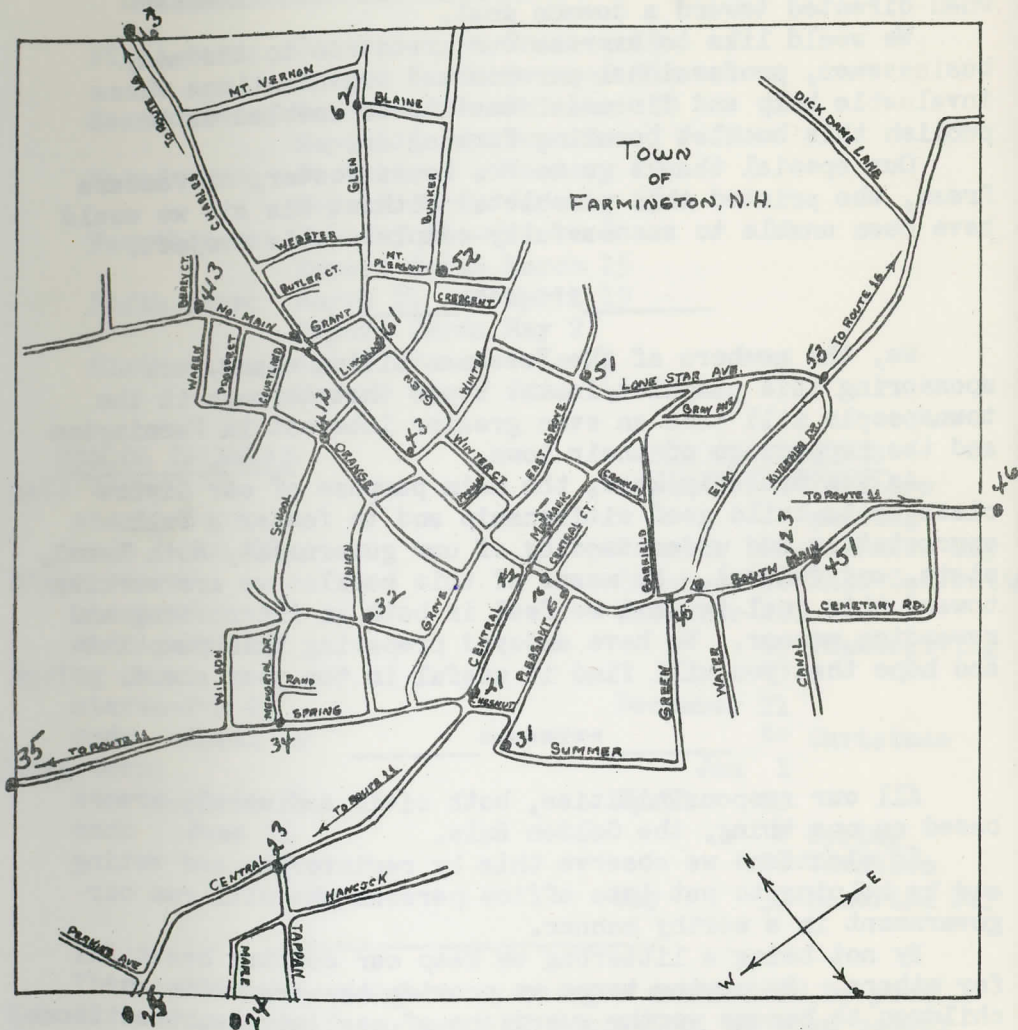
By not being a litterbug we keep our country beautiful for others. By paying taxes we provide the means for our children to become worthy guardians of our American traditions.

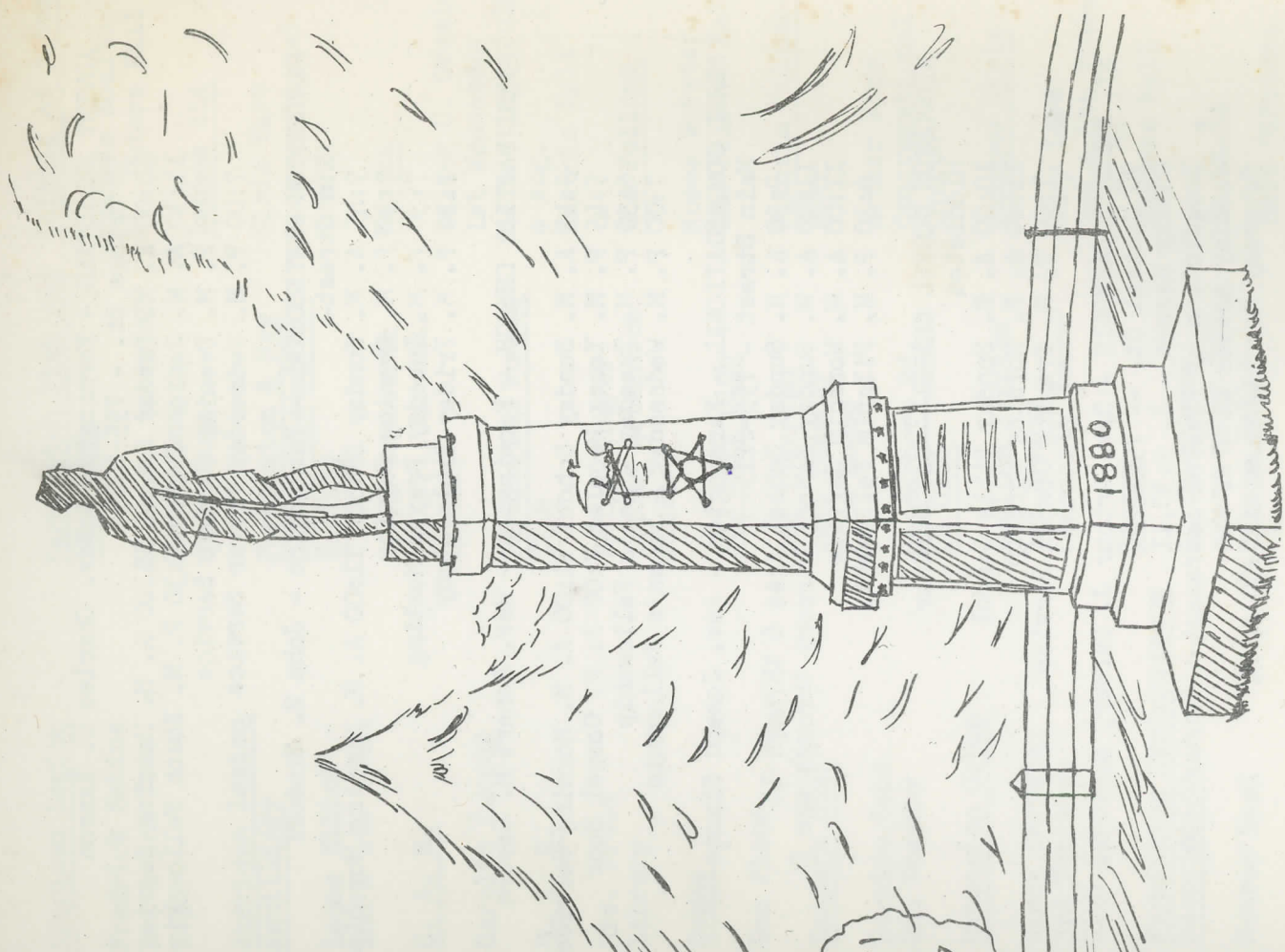
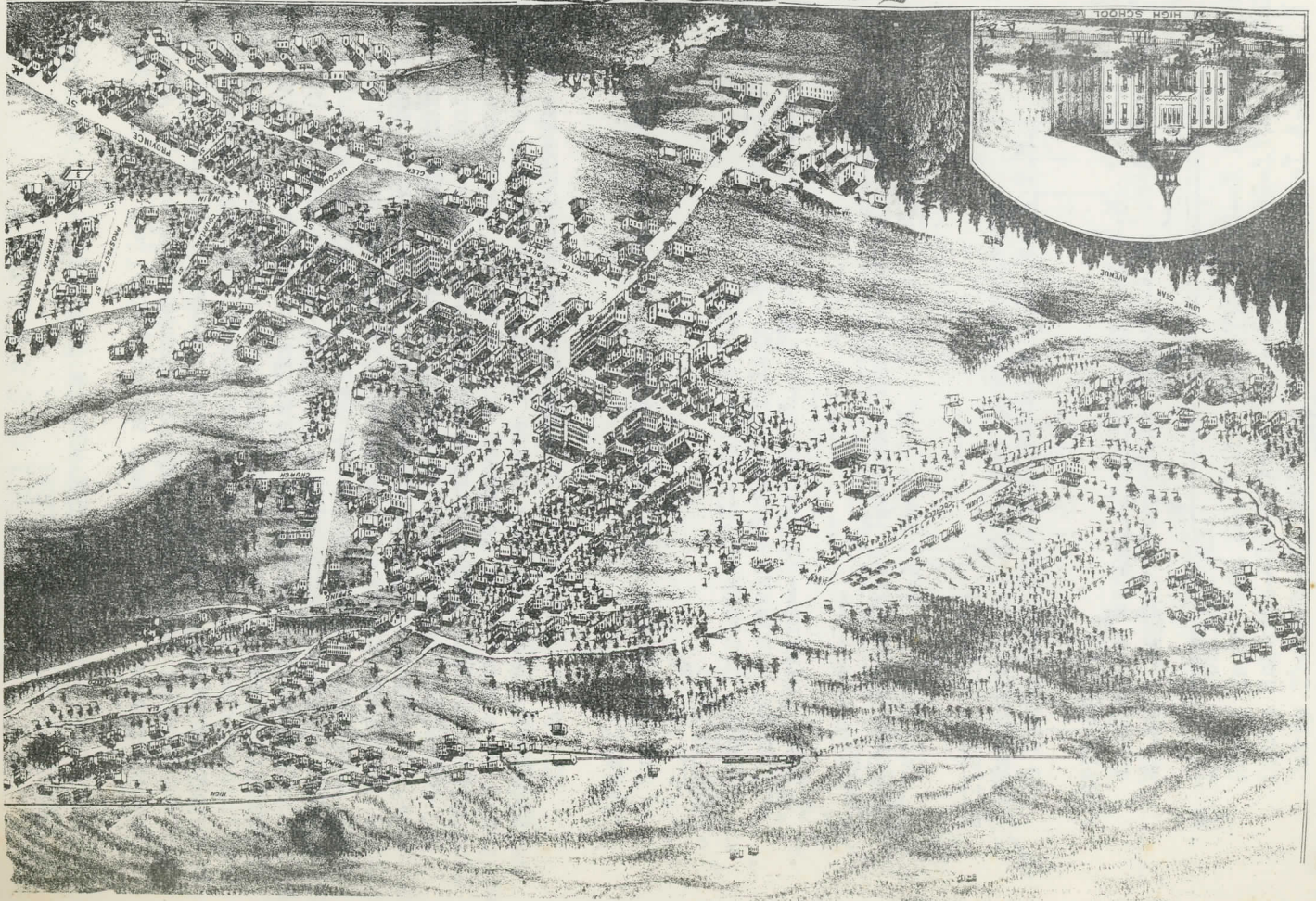

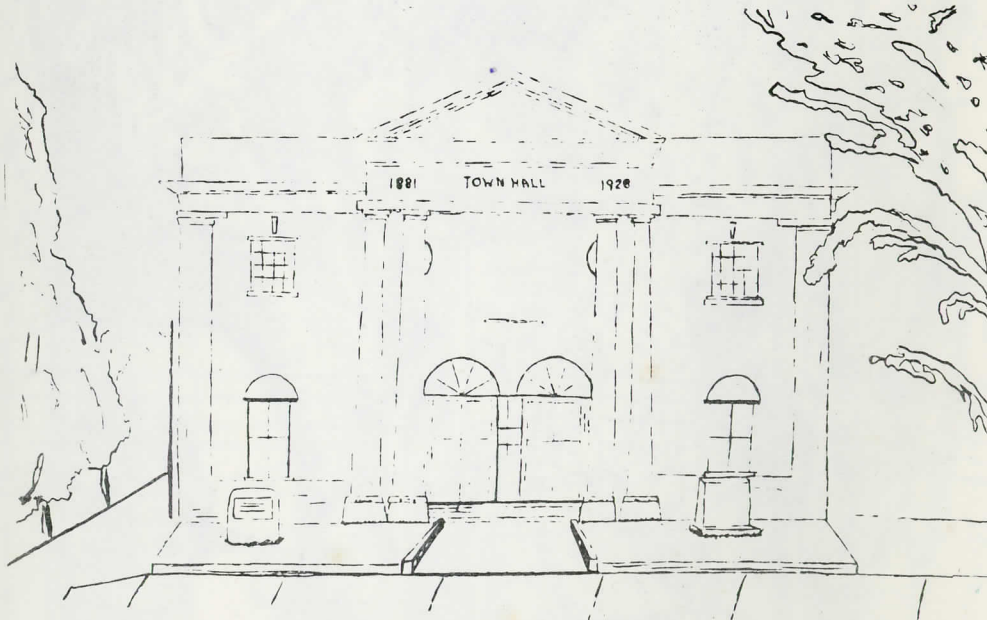
