Farmington Escapes Being Wiped Out By The Greatest Fire in Local History! In Path of Forest Fire, With Adverse Odds, Heroic Work by Hundreds of Persons Saved the Town From Total Destruction.

Charred and desolate remains of square mile after square mile of valuable timber, hardwood growth, pasture lands and farm lands, give mute evidence of one of the greatest fire disasters this town has ever known. Not the scorched earth, but the burned earth, is the only possible way of describing this holocaust...

The outbreak of this fire occurred Tuesday afternoon, October 21, near the Boston and Main railroad tracks, about two miles south of the village off U. S. Route 11, and owing to the extremely dry condition, spread over a considerable area and was a major conflagration in a matter of minutes.

Throughout the night and all day Wednesday hundreds of firefighters, using all available equipment, battled the blaze until it was brought under temporary control, during which time all traffic, except fire trucks and emergency vehicles were routed over the Chestnut Hills road, and through Milton.

On Thursday, following the outbreak of the fire, late showed its hand again, in the form of a sudden strong wind. The blaze which previous to that had been brought under control, was fanned by a 30 to 40 mile an hour gale and quickly broke out of all control, swept across Route 11 in a southeasterly direction, at a point near Gladray's restaurant, where two cottages owned and occupied by the proprietor of this favorite roadside lunch-room, and a third, familiarly known as 'Ben's Rest, owned by Ben Garrow, and situated a short distance away it rolled on like a sea of fiery water through miles of forest between Route 11 and the Chestnut Hills road...

Hundreds of volunteers joined firemen with shovels, brooms, rakes, hoes and anything and everything that could be used in any way to subdue the fire. Fire fighting equipment was rushed from nearby towns and cities, trucks bearing tanks of all sizes for carrying water were rushed to the scene, which eventually covered an estimated area of over 15 square miles in Farmington alone.

Numerous homes along the main highway, the Chestnut Hills road, and Meetinghouse hill road were constantly threatened, but were saved time after time by firefighters, who fought the blaze as if each home belonged personally to them.

New Fires Break Out New threats to the village were seen when a brush fire was discovered on the Farmington-Middleton road late Wednesday night, October 22, and again on Friday, October 24, when a blaze was found a short distance from the West Milton road near the Dick Dame brook. Both fires were extinguished quickly by firemen before a major threat developed.
