point.

On July 20, in exercises which score or more of states, it has been announced, President George Hanthen receive "Old Peppersass," rededicated to recreational New Hampshire. Col. William A Barron of Crawford Notch, chairman of the New England Council committee on recreational development , will act as toastmaster

The exercises of restoration are oing arranged jointly by the raiload and the state with Governor Tobey joining President Hannauer in the formal invitations to the event and the New Hampshire Publicity Board and the New Hampshire Council of the New England Council join ing with the Boston and Maine rail road's publicity and other depart ments to advance New Hampshire recreational interests.

The exercises will be held at the Base Station, a clearing at the foot of Mt Washington, where half a dozen cog engines of advanced type nowadays take their passengers in small cars up the three and one quarter mile cog railway which the "Old Peppersass" first ascended three generations ago The 'Peppersass' will be restored permanently to the view of the tens of thousands of tourists who go to the White mountains annually, by display at the Boston and Maine railroad station at Bretton Woods, within sight of both railway and highway

The interest of Rev Guy Robert of Whitefield was primarily responsible for the rediscovery of the old engine among the collection of old ocomotives gathered from the ends of the continent for the Baltimore & Ohio railroad s Iron Horse fair Communicating the facts to Colone Barron and to President Hannauer of the Boston and Maine, he found an interest by both in bringing the Peppersass" back to its original surroundings When President Hannauer took the matter up with Presi dent Willard-himself a former Nev Englander-the response was imme diate and 'Old Peppersass' returns again to her native mountain sides. She has been gone since 1893 when the 'Peppersass' was sent to the World's fair in Chicago, as the

pioneer mountain-climbing locome tive, on what proved to be the start of an exhibition tour It has been presented to thousands of persons as the first mountain-climbing locomotive, notably at the Field museum it Chicago and at the St Louis World i fair The Baltimore & Ohio ac quired it from the Field museum
