Laura S. Brown, Ph.D. ABPP (L2) is a clinical and forensic psychologist in Seattle and Clinical Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the University of Washington. Among her many written works are two books for adult survivors, and 11 texts and 150 articles and book chapters on topics including feminist therapy practice, cultural competence in the treatment of trauma, and assessment and diagnosis. She is past-president of the APA Division of Trauma Psychology, and received its 2015 Lifetime Achievement Award for Contributions to Trauma Psychology. She is a black belt in aikido, a rank earned at age 63.

ANA GÓMEZ, MC, LPC

Ana M. Gómez, MC, LPC is the founder and director of the Agate Institute and an EMDR Institute, EMDR-IBA and EMDR-HAP trainer. She is a national and international speaker on the use of EMDR therapy with children and adolescents with developmental trauma. Ana Gómez is the author of "EMDR Therapy and Adjunct Approaches with Children: Complex Trauma, Attachment and Dissociation" and several books, book chapters, and articles on the use of EMDR therapy with children. She was the recipient of the 2011 "Distinguished Service Award" from the Arizona Play Therapy Association and the 2012 Sierra Tucson "Hope Award". Ana has developed numerous programs and protocols that include the EMDR-Sandtray protocol and the attachment-informed EMDR program to heal intergenerational trauma.

HAROLD KUDLER, M.D.

Dr. Kudler serves as the Chief Consultant for Mental Health Services for the US Department of Veterans Affairs, a position he has held since July 2014. From 2004 to 2014, Dr. Kudler was Associate Director of the VA's Mid-Atlantic Mental Illness Research, Education, and Clinical Center (MIRECC) which focuses on Deployment Mental Health. From 2010 to 2013, Dr. Kudler was also Medical Lead for the VISN 6 Rural Health Initiative. From 2010 to 2013, Dr. Kudler was also Medical Lead for the VISN 6 Rural Health Initiative. From 2002 to 2010, Dr. Kudler coordinated mental health services for a three state region of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and from 2000 through 2005 co-chaired VA's Special Committee on PTSD which reports to Congress. From 2006 to 2014, he co-led the North Carolina Governor's Focus on Returning Military Members and their Families. In 2012, he was appointed to the North Carolina Institute of Medicine.

He founded the International Society for Traumatic Stress Studies' (ISTSS) PTSD Practice Guidelines taskforce and has served on the ISTSS Board of Directors. He co-led development of the joint VA/Department of Defense Guideline for the Management of Posttraumatic Stress and serves as advisor to Sesame Street's Talk Listen Connect series for military families.

Dr. Kudler received his M.D. from Downstate Medical Center in Brooklyn, trained in Psychiatry at Yale and is Adjunct Associate Professor at Duke. He has received teaching awards from the Duke Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences, the American Psychiatric Association and the American Psychoanalytic Association

SESSION 101 EMDR IN THE TREATMENT OF DEPRESSION Michael Hase, M.D.

Introductory Level | 70% EMDR

Severe depression is one of the most common mental disorders and affects between 5-15% of the general population in their lifetimes. High relapse rates (ranging at 50% after two years), unsatisfactory remissions, and suicidal risks are among the major problems. There is a link between stressful life events and the onset of depressive disorder. The presenter will report the status of research on the subject, a natural history follow up study, and current controlled studies underway to explore the use of EMDR in depressive patients. He will outline the EMDR protocol (DeprEnd) to treat depressed clients.

SESSION 102

THE YOUTH REVOLUTION: USING EMDR WITH PRE-TEENS AND ADOLESCENTS Carolyn Settle, MSW, LCSW

Intermediate / Advanced Levels | 100% EMDR

With the explosion of the digital world, social media, and sexuality/gender identity issues, it is an amazing and challenging time to be a pre-teen and adolescent. This workshop uses the language and interests of pre-teens and teenagers to developmentally modify the Eight Phases of EMDR therapy. Topics to be addressed are: body image, substance abuse, anxiety, and dissociation. Additional areas are bullying, cyberbullying, self-harm, and the pacing of EMDR in intensive outpatient programs and residential treatment centers. Special focus will be on creative techniques for affect regulation, stalled processing, and target selection.

SESSION 103

TREATING MILITARY/VETERANS WITH EMDR THERAPY: WHAT EMDR THERAPISTS NEED TO KNOW TREATING THIS SPECIAL POPULATION E.C. Hurley, D.Min., Ph.D.

All-Levels | 90% EMDR

There is a growing need for EMDR therapists to effectively treat military and veteran populations. This full-day workshop provides essential information for treating this special population including basic understanding of military-related coping mechanisms, addressing the full trauma spectrum including combat and military sexual trauma, treating complex trauma with the eight phase approach, moral injury and other unique treatment issues, and developing a referral network. Dr. Hurley, as Chair of the EMDRIA Veterans' Task Force will present joining the EMDRIA therapists' network for treating veterans as well as professional resources available for EMDRIA members who participate in the EMDRIA veterans' network.

HOW DO WE ENGENDER HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS FOR SURVIVORS OF COMPLEX CHILDHOOD TRAUMA?
Laura Brown, Ph.D., ABPP (L2)

All-Levels | 100% EMDR

Survivors of complex childhood trauma – systemic abuse, neglect, and disrupted attachment schemata – enter adulthood with internal working models of relationship that often lead them into difficult and painful connections with others. I will address the specific challenges in empowering these survivors to stop "paying the price of admission" to intimacy, and discuss how EMDR can be an effective strategy for addressing pre-verbal and early verbal core beliefs about self, being lovable, and being safe in relationships.

SESSION 211
EMDR THERAPY WITH OBSESSIVE COMPULSIVE DISORDER (OCD)
Derek Farrell, BABCP

Intermediate Level | 100% EMDR

Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD) is a bio-psycho-socio-cultural disorder that includes genetic, neural brain anomalies, traumatic experiences, and development of dysfunctional beliefs that can be learnt from others and from the environment. the current empirical research supports the utilisation of a specific form of Cognitive Behavioural therapy (Exposure and response prevention); however not all clients respond well to this intervention. this presentation will consider how EMDR therapy can be used with this client group

SESSION 212 THE NETWORK BALANCE MODEL OF TRAUMA THERAPY D. Eric Chamberlin, M.D.

Introductory Level | 100% EMDR

Driven by Einstein's adage "If you can't explain it simply, you don't understand it well enough", this workshop incorporates cutting edge research in neuroscience to describe how stress causes inhibition of pre-frontal cortical function ceding control to subcortical structures. The resulting imbalance of the three principal resting state networks (nick-named the Me, Feel, and Deal networks) causes memories to remain fragmented. The procedural elements of EMDR, including bilateral stimulation, act on specific networks to re-establish network balance, and set the stage for memory reconsolidation into a more adaptive form. This "natural tendency towards health" results from the brain's drive to minimize the errors of its predictions. Friends don't let friends miss a workshop like this!

11:00 AM - 12:30 PM (1.5 CREDIT HOURS)

SESSION 221

TREATING INTERPERSONAL DEPENDENCE AND PATHOLOGICAL BONDING PATTERNS WITH EMDR

Arun Mansukhani, Psy.D.

Intermediate Level | 70% EMDR

Interpersonal Dependence (ID) and Pathological Bonding Patterns (PBP) are a major clinical and social problem. Related to anxiety disorders, substance addiction, sexual dependence, and to domestic and gender violence. ID-PBP is very closely related to attachment patterns and types. EMDR and the AIP model provide us with a strong therapeutic model to understand and treat different psychological and emotional disturbances. This is also true for adult ID

and PBP. But for these it is necessary to integrate the AIP model with Attachment Theory and the ID-PBP framework, resulting in specific changes in the standard intervention with EMDR.

SESSION 222

BENEFITS & MITIGATED RISKS OF INTENSIVE TREATMENT FOR EARLY TRAUMA EMDR Sandra Paulsen, Ph.D.

Intermediate / Advanced Levels | 80% EMDR

As more EMDR therapists experiment with the intensive treatment format, it is important that predictable and known risks of the format be mitigated with understanding, structure and preparation. This workshop addresses a) reasons the format may be beneficial for some and contraindicated for others, b) predictable hazards including reenactments of abandonment trauma, decompensation, unreliable reporting, and work incompletion, c) ways to mitigate the risks, d) how to structure the work with introductions, breaks, closures, and follow up status checks that render the format safe, ethical and ergonomically appropriate, and e) having a therapist back home for any needed additional care.

SESSION 223 FOUR CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE STANDARD PROTOCOL PRACTICE OF EMDR Howard Lipke. Ph.D.

Intermediate Level | 100% EMDR

While the standard EMDR protocol has been highly successful in treating a variety of psychological problems, it has always been acknowledged that there is considerable flexibility in its application, especially related to the History and Preparation Phases (Shapiro, 1995, 2001; EMDRIA, 2012). This presentation, incorporating the strengths of the AIP, focuses on practice and theoretical related suggestions designed to enhance treatment for clients in general, as well as for some specific problem areas. Each of the items listed below will be explained through lecture and PowerPoint slides, with liberal inclusion of participant questions and comments. Each of the items below will be expected to have roughly equivalent time apportioned to them.

1. Client trauma history can sometimes be more effectively understood with a structured questionnaire such as the Adverse Childhood Experiences questionnaire (ACE. Dube, et al 2001). However, if the questionnaire has a clinical orientation and surveys a wide range of experience, allows details to remain unrevealed (a great strength of EMDR), prompts memory without being overly directive, and offers opportunity for clients to rate relative effects of events, it may be maximally valuable. To this end, a trauma questionnaire that has been used since the 1990s, the Great Lake Event Questionnaire (GLCU,Lipke, 2016) will be shared.

Goal: Participants will become familiar with the Great Lakes Events Questionnaire, administration options and research potential.

2. As EMDR does include unusual activity, the clearer the rationale can be explained the less likely there is to be resistance to acceptance from clients, as well as fellow professionals

and administrators not knowledgeable about the research. The addition of a graphic representation of memory systems, the failure to process memory and the overcoming of that failure (Lipke, 2013), incorporating the chief strength of the AIP, has been found to be clinically and even administratively useful in providing a comprehensible explanation of EMDR effects.

SESSION 224

RESEARCH PAPERS

Simon Proudlock, MSc, CPsychol; Avigail Moor, Ph.D.; Masaya Ichii, MA; Maria Zampieri, Ph.D.; Michelle LeValley, Ph.D.; Michael Ellison, Ph.D., LPC-S; Kie Higuchi; Cynthia Hager, LCSW; Kate Wheeler (moderator)

All-Levels | 75% EMDR

- [Mental Health Crisis/Suicidality] Using EMDR with individuals who are suicidal and in an acute mental health crisis.
- **[Sexual Trauma]** EMDR rape treatment generally follows the standard protocol, which, while highly effective in resolving many of the presenting symptoms, may be limited in its ability to resolve those that are specific to rape. Yet, not much has been written in the EMDR literature about such rape-specific factors. Therefore, for the sake of optimizing treatment, the present paper presents original research that establishes rape-specific peritraumatic reactions that distinguish this particular trauma from others, and outlines relevant implications for EMDR therapy with this population.
- [Research] Investigating whether eye movement, which is used in EMDR (Eye Movement and Desensitization and Reprocessing) therapy, has disturbing or facilitating function for cognitive task.
- **[Techniques/Strategies]** OCD is an invasive disorder that can impair several life domains (DSM-5, 2013). The case of a 36-year-old married teacher with varied psychotherapies since age of 15 is reported.
- [Military/Veterans] A 31 year-old combat veteran, presenting with "anger issues" and recent problems across several critical domains of memory, appeared to manifest the cognitive impairments and behavioral symptoms associated with blast-induced neurotrauma (BIN) incurred 10 years earlier in Iraq.
- [Children/Adolescents] This exploratory study was designed to evaluate the efficacy
 of a relatively brief EMDR intervention on a sample of youth seen in a community
 mental health clinic.

SESSION 225 WRITING FOR THE JOURNAL OF EMDR PRACTICE & RESEARCH Ricky Greenwald, Psy.D.

All-Levels | 0% EMDR

Many EMDR therapists have something to contribute to the field, but may be unsure about how to write a paper for a scholarly journal. Participants in this workshop will learn to identify the types of papers that might be submitted, and how to determine in which category their own project belongs. Participants will also learn a clear structured model

for composing a paper so it will have its best chance of favorable review. Finally, participants will be guided to evaluate their own project and develop a plan to bring the project to publication.

DEVELOPMENTS IN LAW AND ETHICS THAT ALL PRACTITIONERS SHOULD KNOW ABOUT Steve Frankel, Ph.D., Esq.

Introductory Level | 50% EMDR

This presentation focuses on legal/ethical developments that have taken place over the past two years or are developing now. The program emphasizes changes to child abuse reporting laws, laws concerning the reporting of danger to self and others, emerging issues with "death with dignity" laws, the use of telehealth, consultation, and other issues that attendees need to know about.

SESSION 232

INTEGRATING INTERNAL RESTRUCTURING WITH EMDR WITH ADULT ATTACHMENT TRAUMA

Ann Potter, Ph.D.; Debra Wesselmann, LIMHP

Intermediate Level | 50% EMDR

Attachment trauma negatively impacts adults in the development of their sense of self, their personality structure and functioning, and their ability to form healthy attachments in present-day relationships. The adverse effects of attachment trauma can also impede therapeutic relationships as well as clients' abilities to benefit from EMDR therapy. This session teaches participants the skills and strategies aimed at effectively dealing with attachment trauma by employing knowledge about attachment and applying and integrating creative and powerful elements from the internal restructuring work during the preparation stage to assist clients in successfully transitioning to the reprocessing stage and maximizing positive EMDR therapy outcomes.

SESSION 233

IMPROVING HEALTH OUTCOMES FOR ACE* SURVIVORS WITH EMDR (*ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EVENTS)

Carol Forgash, LCSW

Intermediate Level | 90% EMDR

EMDR therapy is a successful model for dealing with the health problems of trauma survivors. The development of an EMDR Treatment Plan, to treat both health and ACE problems, using the ACE questionnaire, a health history, and specific target selection is highlighted. Specialized techniques will be utilized in phases 1-2 to help the patient experience self soothing, develop emotional regulation, and to avoid re-traumatization in the healthcare setting. Phases 3-7 will emphasize specific work on past attachment



ruptures and health issues. Skills development such as rehearsal for medical visits and procedures will be presented.

SESSION 234

UNVEILING THE UPDATED MID ANALYSIS 4.0 AND EXPANDED MID MANUAL Jennifer Madere, MA, LPC-S; D. Michael Coy, LICSW

Intermediate Level | 70% EMDR

The Multidimensional Inventory of Dissociation (MID) is a valuable assessment tool for EMDR Therapists to determine presence of pathological dissociation and readiness for desensitization. This workshop marks the unveiling of the updated MID Analysis (v4.0) and MID Manual (2nd Edition) to the EMDRIA community. Updates include DSM-5 verbiage, bug/layout fixes, and an illustrated guide to reading and interpreting the MID Report. Participants will learn to administer, score, and interpret results of the MID Report. Detailed illustrations, clinical interview tips, case examples, and use in consultation will be reviewed. MID documents continue to be available without charge to mental health professionals.

SESSION 301

EMDR THERAPY WITH CHILDREN WITH COMPLEX TRAUMA: NEW FRONTIERS IN THEORY, RESEARCH, AND CLINICAL PRACTICE Ana Gòmez, MC, LPC

All-Levels | 100% EMDR

Advances in neuroscience have impacted how we conduct EMDR treatment with children with developmentally impaired regulatory systems, deep attachment injuries, and psychobiological responses such as hyperarousal and dissociation. These children come with numerous deficits and unmet needs as well as rigid defenses and trauma related phobias. As a result, EMDR treatment with this population is not just about symptom reduction, but instead about promoting integration, resetting neural networks involved in homeostatic responses, challenging and expanding their window of tolerance, meeting unmet needs, executing empowering actions and reclaiming dissociated material, among others. This presentation will provide an overview of the intricacies, innovations and new frontiers in research, theory, and the clinical application of EMDR therapy with children with complex trauma.

SESSION 321
GETTING PAST YOUR PRESENT - A CHILD'S PERSPECTIVE Frances Klaff, Ph.D.

All-Levels | 90% EMDR

"Sure I know the protocol but some kids don't have past traumas to target so I don't use it much." This workshop will give you some ideas of how to expand your use of EMDR to deal

with both minor and major present day troubling issues, because the present is where the past is. Unrevealed impactful material may well be revealed. Tips will also be offered to dig into and also expand your existing clinical tool set to creatively boost EMDR therapy, while keeping true to the standard protocol. Videos and live action promised.

SESSION 322

INCORPORATING 'TALKING TO THE VOICES' INTO EMDR THERAPY Colin Ross, M.D.; Dolores Mosquera, PsyD

Intermediate Level | 40% EMDR

An emerging literature describes the adaptation of EMDR to the treatment of individuals with auditory hallucinations, including those with dissociative and psychotic diagnoses. In this workshop, the presenters will describe an approach of 'talking to the voices' as it is used in the treatment of dissociative disorders, its extension to individuals with psychotic diagnoses, and then its potential integration into the first two phases of EMDR therapy. Most of the workshop will focus on a detailed description of strategies and techniques with a preliminary review of the relevant theory and literature. Videos will be shown to illustrate the techniques.

SESSION 323

EMDR THERAPY WITH EMOTIONALLY FOCUSED THERAPY FOR TRAUMATIZED COUPLES Mark Knox, LMFT, Ph.D., D.Min.

Introductory / Intermediate Levels | 70% EMDR

The symptoms of posttraumatic stress not only bring distress to the one who experiences them, they also have a detrimental effect upon intimate relationships. Similarly, a conflictual or insecure relationship may aggravate PTSD. Traumatized couples are often experiencing symptoms of posttraumatic stress and a conflicted relationship with their spouse. Integrating EMDR Therapy and Emotionally Focused Therapy may provide a brief therapy that effectively treats symptoms of PTSD while enhancing marital satisfaction and attachment. Participants will be equipped to reduce the symptoms of posttraumatic stress, enhance marital satisfaction and attachment, and enrich the lives and relationships of traumatized couples.

SESSION 324 INTENSIVE TRAUMA-FOCUSED THERAPY Ricky Greenwald, Psy.D.

Intermediate / Advanced Levels | 90% EMDR

This workshop will outline the potential benefits and pitfalls of intensive trauma-focused therapy, review the research, and explain, in detail, how to do it. The focus is not on a specific intervention such as EMDR, and no modifications of Phases 3-6 of the EMDR protocol are proposed. Rather, the focus is on how to sequence the various types of interventions that are normally done over the course of treatment, how to manage certain types of clinical issues, and how to manage the business aspect.



SESSION 325

EMDR THERAPY: INTEGRATING PSYCHOLOGY AND PHYSIOLOGY IN CLINICAL PRACTICE Darra Murphy, MFamMed

Intermediate Level | 100% EMDR

This presentation aims to more fully reveal the power and flexibility of the Adaptive Information Processing (AIP) model, by clearly relating the psychological understanding of what is happening in EMDR therapy to our emerging understanding of the physiology and neurobiology. In highly vulnerable clients, the sudden return of repressed affect (associated with the memories of particularly disturbing experiences) can overwhelm adaptive memory networks and require immediate and considered variation of the standard protocol. Taking a developmental perspective, I will demonstrate the integrity of the model across multiple paradigms, so EMDR therapists can prepare all clients for effective resourcing and reprocessing.

SESSION 326

EMBODIED CULTURE: A SOMATIC APPROACH TO DIVERSITY AWARENESS IN EMDR Arielle Schwartz, Ph.D.; Barb Maiberger, MA, LPC

Introductory Level | 80% EMDR

This presentation applies somatic psychotherapy principles to the practice of EMDR when working with culturally different clients. Fifteen researched multicultural competencies will be introduced deepening into nonverbal communications as a form of Embodied Culture. Embodied Culture is defined as the interactions of physiological, emotional, mental, cultural, social, and behavioral factors. Diversity awareness will be integrated into all Phases of EMDR including sensitivity to use of space, eye contact, and posture as related to power and privilege. Participants will practice two self-reflective exercises to increase awareness of one's body-mind connection as it relates to working with clients who are culturally different.

SESSION 331 HOW WE GET INTO TROUBLE Steve Frankel, Ph.D., Esq.

Introductory Level | 50% EMDR

This presentation examines that types of professional acts which result in loss of license, probation and lawsuits. We review data samples of actions against professionals, with an eye toward issues that EMDR specialists should particularly know about in order to practice safely and effectively. A particular focus deals with licensing board complaints and actions

SESSION 332

FALLACIES, TRANCE & MONSTERS: THINKING ABOUT DISSOCIATION SYSTEMICALLY Sandra Paulsen, Ph.D.

All-Levels | 70% EMDR

Many EMDR practitioners are surprised to encounter unsuspected somatic or structural dissociation well into treatment with trauma patients. This presentation provides necessary and perhaps painful insights needed to avoid the therapeutic misadventures caused by such fallacies such as "I'd See Dissociation if It Were There," "Introjects are Monsters," "What I Don't See Can't Hurt Me," "Parts are People" "The Porch is the House," and more. Additionally, the presentation will offer a systematic decision process, by EMDR therapy phase, to determine degree and type of dissociation, best resourcing strategies, and a treatment approach that takes the client's self-system into account.

SESSION 333

PHASE ONE: SIMPLIFYING CASE FORMULATION, HISTORY TAKING AND TARGET SEQUENCE Andrew Leeds, Ph.D.

Intermediate Level | 100% EMDR

In the EMDR approach to psychotherapy, each patient is approached in an individualized manner. This presentation will clarify core elements of history taking and AIP informed case formulation including pacing, methods and depth of history taking and simple ways to screen for factors that complicate EMDR therapy. Participants will consider best practices for responding to Phase one case vignettes including: pacing history taking, prior adverse EMDR therapy experiences, and fears of facing a traumatic past. Forms for organizing patient history, triggers, symptoms and concerns will be presented and reviewed. Sample target sequences will be presented for common treatment plans.

SESSION 334 THE TRANS-GENERATIONAL IMPACT OF TRAUMA Karen Alter-Reid, Ph.D.; Ruth Heber, Ph.D.

Intermediate Level | 90% EMDR

For patients with intergenerational trauma histories that include oppression, war, genocide, and immigration to a new culture, it is important to develop a treatment plan that includes attention to the patient's affective and cognitive narratives of this history. Therapists will learn how to widen the lens during history taking, preparation and case conceptualization beyond the patient's individual trauma experiences to identify possible transmission of trans-generational wounding and related themes for EMDR processing targets. Therapists will learn to assist the second-generation patients toward the development of a coherent, regulated narrative that includes pre-oppression generational experiences, parental trauma experiences, and post-trauma adaptations and resources.



SESSION 335

RESILIENT CLIENT, RESILIENT THERAPIST: AN ADVENTURE IN EMDR THERAPY Rajani Venkatraman Levis, MFT; Anastasia Pollock, LCMHC

Introductory / Intermediate Levels | 80% EMDR

This workshop proposes an antidote to the very real challenges of vicarious trauma and burnout. Through a collaborative exploration of client videos, participants will experience the positive impact of vicarious resilience within EMDR therapy. Using video, lecture, discussion and experiential activities, we will identify ways to elicit and integrate a wealth of invisible resources with the AIP model. You will leave this workshop empowered with Community Cultural Wealth Resources as a dynamic therapeutic ally for attending to social injustices in our varied roles as therapist & client, educator & student, community member, activist and leader.

SESSION 336

INTEGRATIVE EMDR/FAMILY THERAPY MODEL FOR TREATING CHILD ATTACHMENT TRAUMA

Debra Wesselmann, MS, LIMHP; Cathy Schweitzer, LMHP

Intermediate Level | 60% EMDR

Traumatic stress in children often manifests as reactivity, aggression, defiance, and other challenging behaviors. Traumatized children require a secure holding environment to safely address trauma, however, under the circumstances, the parent-child relationship may be stressed. The presentation describes an integrative model that integrates trauma-informed parent psychoeducation, family therapy, and EMDR therapy to strengthen attachment security and resolve past trauma simultaneously. Participants will be able to apply strategies for shifting parents to a specialized, trauma-informed approach, increase efficiency through a family therapist-EMDR therapist team. An EMDR resource approach for deepening attachment will be demonstrated along with "interactive interweaves" utilizing parents.

SESSION 401

EMDR IN VA HEALTHCARE: A HISTORY AND A FUTURE Harold Kudler, M.D.

Level and Percentage of EMDR Coming Soon

EMDR has been among the most highly recommended evidence-based treatments in the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)/Department of Defense (DoD) Clinical Practice Guidelines for the Management of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and Acute Stress Reaction since their first edition in 2004 yet Veterans have continued to encounter inconsistent access to EMDR when seeking VA care. This presentation by the senior policy officer for VA's national Mental Health Service will provide a perspective on the history of EMDR in the VA healthcare system and describe current efforts to ensure that, whenever a Veteran presents to VA, he or she will get to make an informed, individualized choice of PTSD treatment and that, when it is his/her preference, he/she will be able to access EMDR at any site of VA care.

GETTING BACK TO OUR ROOTS: PROCESSING TRAUMA AND

BASIC PROTOCOLS OF EMDR

Introductory / Intermediate Levels | 100% EMDR

This 3 hour presentation will focus on the basic EMDR therapy protocols (Shapiro, 2008) to help participants gain confidence with EMDR therapy and trauma processing. There will be an emphasis on affect tolerance to enable more rapid and profound trauma processing with EMDR therapy. We will focus on how to choose appropriate targets for trauma processing. We will discuss how to implement the EMD protocol for more controlled processing in complex PTSD.

SESSION 432 OVERCOMING ATTACHMENT-RELATED TREATMENT IMPASSES Ricky Greenwald, Psy.D.

All-Levels | 100% EMDR

This workshop features a series of three interventions that can be helpful in working with clients whose parents fell short in some important way. The interventions are simple, structured, and scripted. Participants will be able to implement any of the interventions with their clients with no further training. 1. Guided visualization to develop/enhance secure attachment status. 2., For clients who might otherwise block processing due to fear of becoming too angry at the parent, a "parent protector" container. 3. Guiding the client to engage in a resolution conversation with a dead parent — whether or not the parent is actually dead.



SESSION 434 OVERCOMING CONFLICT USING AN INTEGRATIVE BOWEN & EMDR (iBE) GROUP PROTOCOL Dana Terrell, LCSW

Intermediate Level | 80% EMDR

Bowen Theory is reviewed as an effective, disciplined way to increase differentiation of self. Bowen Theory is integrated into EMDR focused on relationship targets and psychoeducation to allow EMDR-AIP to enhance differentiation of self faster, "like Bowen on steroids!" Lecture covers ways conflict causes stress or trauma and methods differentiated persons use to deal with conflict, in an approach applicable to individuals or groups. Video will demonstrate differentiation-related resourcing as a Phase 2 intervention. You will experience a practicum lead by the presenter in iBE group processing of one conflict target, adapted from and inspired by Jarero and Artigas' EMDR-IGTP-0TS.

SESSION 435 TEN KEYS TO CULTURALLY ATTUNED AND EFFECTIVE EMDR THERAPY Mark Nickerson, LICSW

All-Levels | 80% EMDR

From AIP consistent macro concepts to innovative EMDR strategies and protocols, the Ten Keys integrate best practices in cultural competence into EMDR therapy and highlight issues such as the importance of cultural identities and resources, adapting EMDR interventions to cultural norms and needs, psycho-social assessment, social information processing and the AIP model, expanded NCs/PCs for social trauma and well-being, spotting and reprocessing culturally based trauma, and a protocol for dismantling prejudice. EMDR therapy methods, enhanced with a cultural awareness and innovative skills, guide a therapeutic approach that is relevant and impactful in a politically charged and multicultural world.

SESSION 436

EMDR FACILITATED BY INTERNAL FAMILY SYSTEMS: OVERVIEW AND INTERVENTIONS Joanne Twombly, MSW

All-Levels | 50% EMDR

Sometimes clients are blocked from utilizing the healing process of EMDR. This workshop will teach the basics of Internal Family Systems (Schwartz, 1995), an ego state model that offers practical ways to facilitate EMDR processing. An IFS exercise to sort through therapists' countertransference reactions will also be taught.
