

Welcome to your PACU Co-op Experience

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Introduction/Problem

> PACU RNs provide care for many different types of patients, from outpatients to those requiring ICU level of care. Nursing Co-op Students who are hired to work in the PACU spend six months in this Perianesthesia setting, where they have an opportunity to increase their knowledge and develop a variety of nursing skills. Previous unstructured orientations led to variations in the Nursing Co-op student's competence, and Perianesthesia Nurses verbalized uncertainty as to the students' abilities to assist with patient care. Nursing Co-op students also expressed frustration if they were not able to support the RN caring for PACU patients. An opportunity to enhance the orientation and PACU experience for the Nursing Co-op students was seen as a method to improve the student's overall nursing education.

Aim/Goal

> The aim of this project was to develop an individualized, structured orientation program for the Nursing Co-op students who spend six months in the PACU. The program is designed to develop the student's critical thinking and communication skills as they work to improve their nursing skills.

The Interventions

- > A small group met to review and discuss current orientation, with input from Nursing Co-op students.
- Learning objectives for the Nursing Co-op student were established.
- Nursing Co-op role and responsibilities reviewed and revised.
- With input from RN staff, a skills checklist was developed.
- Nursing Co-op student must review, observe, practice and be signed off by a PACU RN three times before student is able to perform independently.
- Students have a binder with updated educational information aand are responsible to maintain their checklists.
- Nursing Co-op Tiers of Success Checklist implemented to enable students to begin with basic skills, and subsequently build on these skills to perform more advanced skills.

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

- > A structured orientation program tailored for Nursing Co-op students working in the PACU is an important addition to the student's overall nursing education.
- > PACU RNs are invested in developing and mentoring Nursing Co-op students.
- Nursing Co-op students have expressed positive feedback to the orientation program.

Next Steps

- Orientation program, originally developed in the West Campus PACU, is currently being utilized in the East Campus PACUs.
- Continue to review and revise program, with input from RNs and students.
- Collaboration with other units to develop similar orientation programs.
