# eMAR Implementation

## The Problem

How do we maintain patient safety, and support staff while we transition an inpatient unit from a paper based MAR to our new eMAR (electronic medication administration record)?

### Aim/Goal

To transfer the orders on all inpatients on a given unit over to the eMAR in the most efficient and safe manner. To ensure that staff, patients and families are informed and prepared to accept this new process.

5 Stoneman Staff & The eTesting team


#### The Interventions

- Education of staff before planned go-live date
  - Basics class
  - o Reference Manual on unit
  - Educational material on hand
- Communication to all involved departments
  - Letters to patients
  - o On unit signage
  - Emails to staff & Physicians
- Planned approach of how to implement
  - o Planned by RN, then one patient at a time
- Support plan in place
  - eTesting team in place
- Structure in place for communication and feedback
  - o Help Desk Model

## The Results/Progress to Date

Successful implementation on 5 Stoneman, CC6, & 12Reisman





## Lessons Learned

- Clinical staff adapt more easily to changes when they are well prepared and they understand the process.
- Having front line staff involved in our planning, development and support assisted in early adaptation.

## Next Steps/What Should Happen Next

- Continued implementation to PACU, ED and all inpatient units.
- Continued assessment of go live process to ensure it is meeting the needs of each area
- Development of enhancements to improve workflow for front line staff such as: compatibilities, ability to set alerts, and improved tools to provide patient education.
- Developing competency assessment tool to ensure continued best practices
