BACKGROUND

As the deadline for the proposed implementation of the Trillium Drug Program approaches, (April 1st 1995), there has been various discussions and negotiations at the Ontario Ministry of Health regarding issues of catastrophic drug funding and which drugs will be covered.

So far, the Ministry of Health has announced that it will only cover drugs currently listed on the Ontatio Drug Benefit Formulary and Non-Formulary Lists. (The government currently only covers 100% of four AIDS drugs through the Special Drugs Program.)

However, there are many products already approved by the Federal Health Protection Branch and already in use for the treatment of AIDS related illnesses that are <u>not</u> covered by the Provincial government. Most private insurance companies also do not cover these products, as they are often considered "experimental".

The announced Trillium Drug Program barely begins to address the barriers that people face when trying to treat HIV. By including not only all approved drugs but experimental treatments and nutritional supplements as well, the Provincial government could go a long way in removing at least the financial barrier PHA's face when trying to access these treatments.
