Dear Friends and Colleagues.,

I am writing this letter on behalf of the Black Outreach Project, sponsored by the Nova Scotia Persons With AIDS Coaltion. The Project started in 1991 as a result of a growing need to address the issue of IIIV/AIDS in the Black community of Nova Scotia. Through a process of providing culturally specific information, education, and support services, the Black Outreach Project strives to decrease HIV infection, specifically within the Black Community.

The needs assessment which was completed in Phase I of the Project's operation, brought to light some very disturbing conclusions. Some of those conclusions were that the awareness of HIV/AIDS in our community is low, that there is a significant denial of AIDS and its effects, and that many people feel that AIDS does not affect Black people in Nova Scotia. AIDS does affect our community, and together we must address this issue.

I would urge you to raise the awareness of HIN/AIDS in your community, at your workplace, in your oranization and at home. The only way we can protect ourselves, our friends, family and loved ones, especially our children, is by talking about it, educating ourselves, and raising the awarness so that people will take the necessary precautions.

I am available to talk to you, your friends and family, or your organization about this issue. My accessability also applies to areas outside of the Metro area but within the province. The Black Outreach Project is developing materials and methods for the purpose of others to be AIDS educators in their perspective communities. Also, Irondale Theatre Ensemble in conjunction with the Black Outreach Project and AIDS Nova Scotia, is currently developing a culture-specific theatre piece with six of our Black youth. This theatre piece will be travelling throughout the province to the Black communities. This will be an excellent means of HIV/AIDS education, please take advantage of it. Irondale will be available to perform the last week of July and the first two weeks of August.
