Support and Community Development

Support services for this month included, but was not limited to making referrals, skills development, helping to get winter necessities, (i.e. furnace oil, gloves), and helping to access ACNS overall support services. The Project continues to work on the resource manual by meeting with organizations to prepare for training, editing, and testing the manual by a focus group in Digby. The Project also continued with general community involvement through the C.E.C. Black Community Work Group, the National Organization of Immigrant and Visible Minority Women, and the African Canadian Education Project. Community Development programming continued such as the Outreach Team.

Education

The Black Outreach Project has done presentations, information sessions or workshops in the following areas: Stop and Think program at the Community Y, Sunnyville education committee, Upper Hammonds Plains community centre, and Lucasville community centre.
