PCP Prevention: What is the treatment of choice?

Pneumocystis Carinii Pneumonia (PCP) has been the leading cause of death among people with AIDS. A number of extremely effective treatments are available for preventing PCP but each has different side effects and benefits. This forum will focus on the pros and cons of three primary treatments: Aerosolized Pentamidine, Dapsone, and Septra (Bactrim).

Dr. Chan is one of the founders of the Toronto AP Clinic, which now has over 1000 patients. Dr. Chan will also discuss upcoming trials of 566C80, a promising new anti-PCP drug.
