OUR SERVICES

Services to members are provided directly, or through referrals to carefully screened programs and/or professionals.

Legal Services

Preparation of wills, power of attorney, debt problems, Landlord/tenant relations, and other general legal needs.

Pastoral Services

Ongoing spiritual support, assistance in dealing with death and dying issues, grief counselling, and assistance with funeral arrangements.

Practical Needs (activities of daily living)

Assistance with homemaking tasks, grocery shopping, banking, paying bills, transportation to appointments, etc.

Financial Planning

Assistance with applying for disability pensions, social assistance, insurance claims, practical advice on how to manage on a significantly reduced income.

· Community Resources Support

Assistance accessing social assistance, homemaker services, meals on wheels, home nursing or other home care services, hospice care, substance abuse and other support agencies.

Work directly with Correction Facility
Management, to promote AIDS education

Food/Clothing/Household Needs Bank Collection and distribution of food

The Coalition strives to maintain current information concerning the use of experimental drugs, advises on the use of such drugs, and promotes research into the effects of using such drugs.

Drop-In Social Centre

An open house lounge facility for PWA's and active volunteers. Regular social nights for PWA's to enjoy social activities together.

Meeting and Conference Rooms

To promote community awareness of the Coalition and its goals, and to educate individuals by making them more aware of PWA issues through contact with the organization, meeting rooms are provided free of charge to community groups.

RESIDENTIAL HOUSING PROGRAM

· Housing

Assistance accessing reasonable and affordable housing, help with landlord/tenant relations.

Hostel Residence

Operation/management of residence/hostel for PWA's, affordable accommodation for out of town PWA's, their families, and friends.

Morton House

A residence for persons with AIDS, operated by CARAS. The PWA Coalition helps support the residence with financial assistance, gifts of furniture and appliances, and volunteer labour.

COUNSELLING SERVICES

Individual Counselling

One-on-one counselling with HIV+ persons, persons with AIDS, their families, or significant others.

Couple Counselling

Help for couples in coping with the added stress of HIV+ diagnosis upon their relationship.

Facilitated Group Counselling Group counselling for PWAs, facilitated

by two trained counsellors.
