RUBBER SEX IS SAFE SEX

- Use condoms with all your tricks there's no way of telling if he has the AIDS virus by checking him
- Only buy condoms made of latex the ones made of lambskin membrane break more easily
- Use lots of lubricant, but only use watersoluble lube (like K-Y or Lubafax). Never use Vaseline, Crisco, butter, or other oilbased lubes — they weaken condoms made of latex
- Make your trick want to use them... "Oh, it turns me on when you wear one of those," etc.

SAFE SEX FOR HOOKERS

- WHAT AIDS IS: AIDS is a fairly new, and
 often fatal, illness that can be transmitted sexually. It can also be transmitted when sharing
 needles so if you shoot up, make sure you're
 the only one who ever uses your needle.
- WHY IT'S IMPORTANT: when AIDS first came to North America about five years ago, it seemed to only hit gay men. But very soon after that it became obvious that it affects other groups of people. It's clear now that AIDS can be transmitted through heterosexual activity.

It's also clear that AIDS is here to stay. We hope that cures and vaccines will come along soon, but AIDS is just going to increase over the next five or ten years, and maybe longer.

The more sex partners you have, the higher your chances of getting any sexually-transmitted disease, including AIDS. But there are things you can do to cut down your chances of getting AIDS. One of the easiest ways, and probably the most important, is using condoms.
