BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Rev. Robert P.Wheatly, b. 1919 d. October 31, 2002, was a Gay Unitarian Universalist Minister and social justice pioneer who lived and worked in Massachusetts from 1949 until his death in 2002. He attended Harvard Divinity School. He lived in Cambridge until his death and was active in several positions in the Unitarian Universalist Church, LGBT groups, specifically in Boston and 3 Cambridge and also groups related to aging and affordable housing groups. In 1998-2000 Rev. Wheatly had contacted THP concerning disposition of his collection of materials and papers related to LGBT issues. At his death, his partner, Kenneth J. English arranged with The History Project to receive his papers.

Throughout his tenure as director of the Unitarian Universalist (U.U.) Office of Gay Concerns, he traveled extensively throughout North America to attend conferences and workshops, and speaking engagements associated with LGBT and church issues. Wheatly's first church position was as an ordained minister in the Disciples of Christ where he worked at a church in Gainsville, Florida from 1942-1943. Following that position, he served in the Air Force from 1943-1946 stationed in Alaska. After World War II he returned to Florida and earned a B.A. degree from Stetson College. At this time, he became a Unitarian and served in U.U. churches. Wheatly served U.U. churches in Westboro, Lawrence and Manchester, N.H. He also attended Crane School of Religion at Tufts and graduated in 1968, prepared for the ministry in the U.U. churches. Wheatly also worked in credit management and personnel at Beth Isreal Deaconess and Children's Hospital and coordinator of services for the Cambridge Committee of Elders and executive director of the Cambridge Council on Aging. In 1977, he was appointed Director of the Unitarian Universalist Association's Office of Gay Concerns (which was re-named during his tenure as the Office of Lesbian, Bisexual, and Gay Concerns, currently the Lesbian,

Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer Ministries or LGBTQ Ministries). Wheatly retired from that position in 1987.

During his career, Wheatly traveled extensively to Unitarian Universalist conferences and churches presenting the case for new understandings, attitudes, rights and services for gay people. He lobbied at the State House in Boston, took part in the Annual Boston Gay Pride Parade, and gave leadership to Gay Pride Worship Services. He also compiled A Planning Guide for a Same Sex Holy Union Ceremony, published by his office in 1987. He officiated at same-sex holy unions throughout his career. Wheatly was known for his humor, once speaking on Groundhogs and Fairies for Groundhog Day. Wheatly was a founding member in 1987 of Prime Timers, a group of older gay men, now a worldwide organization with thousands of members. Upon his death, he was survived by his life's partner of 45 years, Kenneth J. English, who died in 2006.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection totals 5 boxes of Wheatly's papers relating to LGBTQ ministry. Many of these documents pertain to his role as Director of the Unitarian Universalist Association's Office of Gay Concerns (later changed to the Office of Lesbian, Bisexual, and Gay Concerns, currently the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer Ministries or LGBTQ Ministries). Other papers and correspondence were donated by Kenneth J. English and the History Project to Andover Newton Library at Harvard Divinity School. In It has been attempted to retain Wheatly's original folders of papers, particularly those related to memorial services, sermons, and research topics. In one case Wheatly officiated at both the holy union and the funerals of a couple and papers related to these individuals have been kept together. Wheatly preached a sermon entitled, "On Being Homosexual," at a number of churches in the United States throughout the late 1970s and early 1980s. These are foldered by location. The collection includes several brochures and clippings on sexuality as related to theology and/or religious institutions.
