Biographical Note:

AIDS Coalition to Unleash Power (ACT UP) is an international advocacy group working to impact the lives of people with AIDS, and the AIDS pandemic to bring about legislation, medical research and treatment and policies.

ACT UP was formed in March 1987 at the Lesbian and Gay Community Services Center in New York. Larry Kramer, American playwright, author, public health advocate, and LGBT rights activist, was asked to speak as part of a rotating speaker series, and his well-attended speech focused on action to fight AIDS. Kramer spoke out against the Gay Men's Health Crisis (GMHC), which he perceived as politically impotent. Kramer had cofounded the GMHC but had resigned from its board of directors in 1983. Approximately 300 people met two days later to form ACT UP.

The Boston Chapter of Act Up officially formed on January 6, 1988 at their first public meeting held at Boston City Hall. By March of that year, the held their first event, a public "die-in" held at Mass General Hospital.
