


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What would Lou Reed do?

Do-it=Yourself: Make Your Own Dildo Street OIL

-Materials

Plaster of Paris, Molding clay(won't dry out) Spray cooking oil Silicone, in tubes for sealant purposes Caulk gun

Aluminum can
Tin snips, something to cut the can

Rubber bands Bowl and spoon for mixing

You can substitute plaster for alginate, which is that stuff dentists use to make teeth molds. If your mom is a dentist, you should ask her 1. Fun part. Mold your ideal dildo with the clay. Add a flange if you can, which is a wide base(for harnesses and ass safety). You will be casting this and filling it with silicone. So ribs and smooth bumps are a great addition, but harsh angles will be hard to fill in.

2. Spray the mold with cooking oil.



3. Cut the can into three inch by one inch rectangles. Stick them in the mold, bisecting it along the whole shaft.

There are make your own dildo kits that run \$80! Do it from scratch, and perplex your local hardware store with a large order of silicone.



4. Mix the plaster with water. Cover the mold with the plaster. The aluminum squares are there so that the mold can come apart in halves, so do not cover those pieces completely. I would apply one thin coat and then another thin coat. The plaster needs to be able to dry and a thick coat won't dry even in a day or two's time. It is difficult to get a mold that will dry and not break apart, but you can do it. If the plaster needs to sit for a whole day, let it.



We Want good clean Fun:

Contraception and viral protection: This should be a duh, but sadly it's not. Always have condoms on you. Don't that you won't be having sex because you're going to your partner's parents house or just running errands or going to the library or going to church. Be optimistic and ready.

Also, share condoms (not after use). If you have roommates, keep a stash for everyone to take from. Buy a big box at half price and give 'em to friends. Don't hoard 'em, and don't be shy.

Condoms don't just apply to straight vaginal sex. Use em.

Make a safe word: Especially if you are into some dynamic where 'no' doesn't actually mean 'stop,' you need a safe word. Partners (even for the first time) should establish a safe word that actually means stop. It should be something you would never normally say in bed. Fruits and vegetables seem to be a good choice for most people. If you are into gagging or choking, make some obvious nonverbal cue to use.

Consent: More on that later in this zine. Remember that some people won't care if you say no. Use your gut, and please do not take anybody home that you can't entirely trust. Also, make sure to communicate with anyone you have any kind of sex with, one time or long term partner: what about STDs? Contraception? How far do you want to go? Can this emotionally aggravate you?

Safety tips for bondage, sadism and sadomasochism!

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Not everything you may need is here, but if you are interested in trying it out here are some basic safety tips. Overall, consent is the biggest safety must.

Communication- Use a safe word! What is off limits for you might not be the same for your partner. The only thing I would assume from a safe, sane and consensual S&M intercourse would be that the person isn't trying to kill you. Even then, if partners don't communicate, a very bad accident could happen. No joke people. Have a conversation, before anything hot starts, about limits and desires. During sex, give cues to your partner (use a safe word) that everything is alright. Some people aren't okay with bruises and some want to bleed. There really aren't any absolute no goes in S&M. Inflict to the highest degree that you and your partner want. The more damage you might inflict, the more explicit and detailed your conversations should be. The feeling is what they want, not some surprise.

Also, know your body. The worst thing would to be hurt in a way you didn't want because you simply misunderstood how your body would react. Remember you have precious bones and organs. Know what exactly ropes and whips can do you your body. Go slowly and feel out new territories.



Hitting-Flog until one of you bleeds for all I care. Be careful where you are hitting somebody, though. Don't aim anywhere near an organ or artery. Your mama wouldn't have been so cruel as to spank your stomach, so don't do it to your partner. Like a mother's love, the butt is a good place to start spanking. Stay away from the torso. If you need to hit or be hit there then do some research on what bones and parts are positioned where.

Bondage- You can tie somebody up with different kinds of natural and synthetic ropes. Each one acts a little different on the skin. Ropes can rub and burn the skin (which you might like) in different degrees. Don't cut off anyone's circulation. Ropes around necks are a bad idea. Santa Claus- on the first floor with the window open.


Role of sex in your life? How often do you think about it?


Because the terms are NOT at all fundamental

And a binary, at that, which places a severe social preference for one side over the other.













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GWZ's number one tip for hot sex

Get CONSENT

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Consent is hot! Consent can prevent straight up assault, but even in a relationship or with two people attracted to each other, something can go wrong if we don't communicate well. Just because someone likes you doesn't mean they want to go to bed in X amount of dates/days. Or they might need to talk to you about your sexual history before they're comfortable engaging in anything.

The only fear shouldn't be being called out(having someone accuse you of assault). You probably won't be called out by a date that didn't actively communicate their wants, but the emotions will be off and it probably doesn't make for hot sex.

The least sexy thing you can do in bed is disregard your partner needs for your wants. It's so sexy to tell your partner/potential partner what you are interested in and have them say 'yes'. How hot is YES! compared to an unsure and reluctant 'okay'. When everyone's needs and wants can be respected you're gunna have a good time.

1. **Needs and wants** Needs- Your boundaries. Any information you need from your partner (STDs, past sexual history, what will this *mean*). The pace at which you want to become involved. Ability to communicate these needs and communicate your wants.

Wants- Whatever kind of play you are interested in with this person. You are entitled to ask what you

want, but not to the act itself.

2. Talk before you get hot and heavy. You can more accurately discuss your boundaries and wants beforehand. The stress is less demanding beforehand, neither party is immediately questioning, uncomfortable or feeling guilt about their needs. Plus, it's sexy to talk about sex outside of the bedroom, get yourself excited for what and your partner both want to do.

However, late is better than never! Just because you are in bed with someone doesn't mean you can't say 'stop' at anytime.

3. Intoxication makes everything even less clear. Someone can not really give their full consent while intoxicated. Even if you are completely explicit, someone could get called out. It's not smart to go to bed with anyone for the first time completely out of it.

REALLY LIKE YOU BUT ... MEANS NU YOU'RE NOT MY TYPE MEANS NO

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A much better question to ask is simply "what do you want to do?". It's very easy to be unsure of what you want, or feel pressure to do some things. So getting a 'sure' or 'okay' probably means they aren't feeling it.

Ask open ended questions that concern their needs. If the other person won't look at you or gives some other physical signs, notice those too.

- their gender: don't assume that guys always want it. And just because his member is up, doesn't mean he's down for it. Don't assume that girls are playing hard to get or are naturally shy and bashful. That is not the case at all. Sure coy works when you meet someone, but in bed shyness means no.

- their reputation: I don't care if you've heard this person likes to have all kinds of sex, it doesn't mean they want to do it that way with you.

- you two did it before. Maybe the person regretted the first time, or figured out they didn't want that sort of relationship with you. Even if everything was great the first time, there are plenty of reasons they wouldn't want to have sex this time/stop having sex with you entirely.

-you're in a relationship. There are plenty of reasons why a partner might not want to have sex. Fights, outside stress, fatigue. I don't even want to think about it if I haven't bathed in a while. Most times it reflects nothing on the other partner, just that person's particular mood at the time. No sweat, you'll both *** respectively, don't assume you have to put out because of these assumptions*** want it soon enough.

6. Speak up. Not everyone is aware of explicit consent, so engage in it first. At least tell your partner what your needs and wants are and invite them to talk about them too.

7. Try not to be freaked out by people's wants. We want to encourage people to ask, instead of just doing it. So when someone asks you, politely refused them instead of calling them a 'gueer' or a 'slut'.


8. Need some consent practice? Role play with a friend that you are in a scenario where you two could potential hook up. What would you say?



Self Cervical Exam

Why self exam?

Why is the cervix so important? As the opening to the uterus, it is the cervix through which menstrual blood flows, babies are born, and pregnancies are terminated. Several methods of birth control work by placing a barrier over the cervix and keeping sperm out. When a woman ovulates, cervical mucous has a distinctive texture and appearance. With the aid of a speculum, viewing the cervix can be easy.

Self cervical exam is not a replacement for regular Pap Smears, nor does it substitute for screening for sexually transmitted infections, both of which rely on microscopic analysis of cells.

The cervix appears as a rounded or flattened knob about the size of a quarter or half-dollar. The hole or opening in the center is called the cervical os.


How to:

Three Easy Steps to Self Exam
In addition to the hand-held mirror, flashlight, and speculum, you may want KY lubricating jelly or water on the speculum for easier insertion. Before you start, practice opening and closing the speculum; and make sure you understand how to lock it open, as well as how to unlock and close the bills. Then sit comfortably; leaning back with your legs open, knees up, on a bed or couch with pillows behind you.

Put some KY jelly or water onto the bills (the rounded part) which you will insert into your vagina). Take a deep breath. As you exhale, let your muscles relax. To insert the speculum, hold it in one hand, handles up, bills together. Using your other hand, spread the labia and insert the bills of the speculum as you would a tampon.



When you have inserted it as far as it will comfortably go, open the bills using the mechanism on the handles that you practiced with earlier. You will feel the speculum stretch your vagina open. Lock the speculum into place. Then you can let go of it. With both your hands free, you can now hold the flashlight and mirror. You can shine the beam of the flashlight into the mirror so it reflects into the vagina lighting up the internal space. Or you can shine the flashlight directly inside. Adjust the mirror and flashlight so you can see inside. At the back of your vagina is your cervix. It looks like a small donut with a very small opening in the center. [Refer now to "What You See" section.]





Your cervix may be pink and smooth or it might have reddish blemishes. It can also be uneven, rough or splotchy. All of these are normal.

There may be mucus covering the cervix or coming out of the os. Mucus is natural. The character of the mucus changes throughout the menstrual cycle in response to hormones. It ranges from pasty-white (non-fertile) to clear and stretchy egg-white texture (fertile). It does not have a strong odor.

Recognizing what is normal for you is the primary reason for performing self exam. By knowing what is normal, you can tell what is unusual — for you.

With the exception of visible sores caused by the herpes virus, sexually transmitted infections cannot be seen visually during self-exam. Chlamydia, gonorrhea, HIV, hepatitis — all require testing by a clinician for diagnosis and prescription medication for treatment.

Similarly, when you have a Pap test, the clinician removes a few cells from the cervical os. The cells are sent to a laboratory and examined under a microscope for signs of cancer. Your visual exam is not a replacement for a Pap smear.

The cervix may have fluid-filled sacs on it that look like blisters. These are called Nabothian cysts and are not a problem. They are caused by a blockage in the mucus-producing glands of the cervix. In some women they come and go, and others have them for years. They do not need treatment.

You may see polyps, outgrowths of tissue that dangle on a stalk and protrude through the os. They may bleed easily but do not need to be removed unless they bother you.

Cervical bluing may be the first sign that a woman is pregnant. Fifty percent of women who are pregnant will have a blue or purplish colored cervix due to an increase in blood circulation. During pregnancy, the cervix may also look puffy and softer and the os more open.

What's Not Normal

It is normal to have vaginal and cervical discharge. However, if any of the following are found during self exam, it may indicate an infection. A health professional can take a sampling of cells, put them under a microscope, and let you know.

- > green, gray or dark yellow discharge
- > discharge with a texture that is curd-like (like cottage cheese)
- > significant change in amount of discharge from what is normal for you
- > strong odor that is unusual for you.

SPECULUM CARE

Wash your speculum with soap and hot water before and after using it. Do not put it in the dishwasher or microwave It is not necessary to sterilize the speculum because the vagina is not sterile.

Self Testicular Exam

A simple three-minute self-examination, once a month, can detect one of the cancers most common among men ages 15-34. If detected early, testicular cancer is one of the most easily cured. The best time to check yourself is in the shower or after a warm bath. Fingers glide over soapy skin, making it easier to concentrate on the texture underneath. The heat causes the skin to relax, making the exam easier.







2. Now examine your epididymis. This comma-shaped cord is behind each testicle. It may be tender to the touch. It's also the location of most noncancerous problems.



3. Continue by examining the vas (sperm-carrying tube that runs up from your epididymis). The vas normally feels like a firm, movable smooth tube. Now repeat the exam on the other side.





What are the symptoms?


In early states, testicular cancer may be symptomless. When symptoms do occur, they include:


- Lump on the testicle
- Slight enlargement of one of the testes
- Heavy sensation in testicles or groin
- Dull ache in lower abdomen or groin


If you do find any hard lumps or nodules, see your doctor promptly. Only your doctor can make a diagnosis.





PLAYBOYS NEVER


