

Bill Called Socialistic By Solons

SACRAMENTO, June 30
(AP) — The legislature is
against a congressional measure
creating a Franklin Delano
Roosevelt memorial forest of
the redwoods of Del Norte,
Humboldt, Mendocino and
Sonoma counties.

The assembly voted 60 to 9 to-
day to join the senate in protesting
the plan, proposed by California
Congresswoman Helen Gahagan
Douglas. The protest resolution
was introduced by Senator Edwin
J. Regan (D), Weaverville.

Said Assemblyman Samuel W.
Yorty (D), Los Angeles, in favor-
ing the protest:

"I don't believe Washington is
capable of coming into California
and setting up two and a half mil-
lion acres of planned economy."

Assemblyman Laughlin E. Wa-
ters (R), Los Angeles, said the
Douglas plan is "frankly social-
istic" and Eureka's Assemblyman
A. W. Way said it would strike at
"the heart blood and the life-line"
of all the people living in the four
coastal counties.

The Douglas legislation was
supported by Assemblyman Au-
gustus A. Hawkins (D), Los An-
geles. He said the redwoods belong
to the people — not the lumber
companies.
