The cutting done in August and September should have left about 200 feet between the logged area and the park boundary, Casebier feels. But, it is impossible to say because of the hazy status of the line.

DRAFTSMAN Louis Viredaz is a half-inch to the mile. The map line used to mark the park boundary is thick enough to measure 600 feet wide on the ground. To attempt a fair measurement, G-P has plotted the line from the center of Redwood Creek to the center of the 600maps of the area.
