utterable grief fill from my
eyes & more sincere, more deep
& more eloquently than

words, they ^{can} portray to you
some idea of my heartfelt
& intense grief. Oh could
we but bring him back
to us again even for only
a moment to say farewell
to Mother, Father, & Bro's & friends.
Alas he is gone, gone, forever,
"Gone but not forgotten"
What a sad journey you
had to Memphis - how your
dear Mother must suffer,
for her devotion to her sons
was deeper than most
mothers have. I have
dear Avery's last letter to
me where placed it among
other tokens of sad remembrance.
Have you heard
from Rivers? since I saw
you? I trust he is safe
& well - let me know - I had

a letter yesterday from my
Mother she feels very sad
over the death of Avery.
we all loved him & know he
loved us.

I shall leave here for a
visit to my mother & sister
about the 10th remain
thru weeks at sisters(Cedar
Chapel) then take my nice
to school at Staunton
Vir. I have not decided
on the route to take, possi-
bly may not reach Memphis
at all - should I go to M-
my first pleasure will be
to acquaint you of my arri-
val. Send me two copies
of your paper in memoriam
I wish to keep one & send
the other to a friend in
Cheyenne - I have so often

spoken to this friend
of Avery & yourself.

Let whenever you think
of me have time to write
to so - I shall soon have
a picture of myself to
send you - if you have
one of Avery I can have
without depriving the
family please send to me
also of yourself. My love
to your mother & tell her
I am deeply grieved over
the loss of dear Avery -
Mrs P. wishes to be remem-
