In the British Columbia Baskets we have a good old Taltan Basket 7" high by about $8\frac{1}{2}$ " diameter, painted with the heraldic design of the Frog price \$8.00. We have some very fine specimens of old Fraser River Baskets, open and with covers, carrying and cooking from. The Salmoet, Fort Douglas Sechelt, Yale, Lytton, Harrison River, Ruby Creek and other Fraser River Miles, also some fine old Clam Baskets from the West Coast of this Island.
