Replying to yours of recent date, in addition to the Sioux shield I mentioned I have another larger shield, made of thick rawhide, and formed in a concave shape with a boss in the center, this has a covering of white buckskin very thick and heavy, with a pictograph painted on it, in the way of a large bird, crosses etc. done in yellow and black, nothing on it to become destroyed except a few eagle feathers suspended at the top and sides, a very fine specimen. However, I can not hold these indefinitely, I am also offering them to a large collector of shields in Washington, D.C. If you think you want to see them, better let me know very soon. The price of the last named shield I have is \$45.00 and a very fine specimen.
