Yours of March 17, 1916, is just received. In this letter you request me to send you photograph of the "bundle" as it was taken without the war-club. I do not understand this. Do you mean that you wish another print of it? By letter of January 25, 1916, I sent you two photographs, one, of the "bundle" taken by itself without the war-club, and the other, of the stuffed hawk lying in its case of buffalo heart-sack; its pouch of a fawn skin; the bundle of cedar fronds; and the little bird all in one group. By letter of January 29, 1916, you acknowledged receipt of both prints, by saying "I appreciate very much the two photographs showing the Osage bundle and its contents," So you see I have not been remiss toward you and although you did not request it I sent you the prints referred to above, thinking you might like them.

However, if you want another copy of the "bundle photograph I shall be glad to try to get it for you, although it may be some time before I can secure it, as the photographer is just now crowded with work. I am preparing for a western trip and shall start before long.
