Replying to your two letters of the 15th and 16th inst will say that I have been absent for several days which explains the delay in answering.

As to the Parflesche and Clothes Bags, we have always sold them in pairs as that is the way they are made and handled. Generally when they are purchased, it is by the pair, and they are never offered by the single piece. We sell quite a few of these to the Indians themselves and they are always by the pair.

We note what you say about the small Chetimaches, and so enclose invoice of seven which go forward by this mail, registered. We think the largest one very unique in the colorings as it has no red whatever, a thing which is rather rare in these goods.

We have no means of securing the Attakapa and Choctaw baskets for you. We have tried for the latter but have failed. As to the location of these tribes, the Choctaws are allotted in the south-eastern part of Oklahoma, and the Chetimaches are in the southern part of Louisiana, but we do not recall where the Attakapas are located.
