Dear Mayor White,

I am writing to you about forced bussing. I am a mother and want the best education I can get for my daughter, but I will not let her participate in forced bussing.

I will not let her be forced to South Boston, because she may get hurt, because her father is black. I will not let her be forced to Roxbury, because she may be hurt, because her mother is white.

I am not in any organization. I believe in integration, but not forced. Bussing is hurting the city and state financially, but most of all it's destroying the atmosphere for learning and doing irreparable psychological damage to children. It increases bigotry.

As positive solutions, I support two things:



1. The Voucher system for schools

2. More subsidize housing in city and suburbs

a) integrates more poor blacks + whites in the suburbs (economic integration)

b) elimination of Boston housing projects where people are poor, neglected, apathetic

c) more constructive jobs.
