

Research Project—check 1—October 2

- Identify format of project PRIOR to due date via email and conference with instructor
- Include a brief history of your country from c. 500 to c. 1450
- Minimum of 5 sources with varied points of view/perspectives
- Unbiased coverage of the period c. 1450 to c. 1550
- Must cover all major events, people, social, environmental and economic issues
- Use your country's 2010 geographic borders to identify the region your project covers (for example: include Sicily with Italy and Crimea with Ukraine)

Research Project—check 2—December 14

- Minimum of 5 sources with varied points-of-view/perspectives (you may use not more than 3 of the sources from the last check)
- Unbiased coverage of the period c. 1550 to c. 1800
- Must cover all major events, people, social, environmental and economic issues
- Use your country's 2010 geographic borders to identify the region your project covers (for example: include Sicily with Italy and Crimea with Ukraine)
- Remember to pay special attention to topics covered in class (for example the Enlightenment)
- Your project at this point should look like a half finished history of the country you chose and should have an evident purpose/thesis/theme
- You should also have (by this point) ample use of visuals/maps/etc. to supplement your project

Research Project—check 3—February 22, 2016

- Minimum of 5 sources with varied points-of-view/perspectives (you may use not more than 3 of the sources from the previous checks)
- Unbiased coverage of the period c. 1800 to c. 1900
- Must cover all major events, people, social, environmental and economic issues
- Use your country's 2010 geographic borders to identify the region your project covers (for example: include Sicily with Italy and Crimea with Ukraine)
- Remember to pay special attention to topics covered in class (for example the Industrial Revolution)
- Your project at this point should look like a 3/4 finished history of the country you chose and should have an evident purpose/thesis/theme

- You should also have (by this point) ample use of visuals/maps/etc. to supplement your project
