The Cameron Aggies started the season with a two weeks' session of summer training in the Wichita Mountains during late August. At the opening of the official season the boys were all in good shape and inil into the early work with a hearty cooperation that was pleasing to Coach Bill Huff.

The first game, a non-conference one, was with the Southwestern Bulldogs at Weatherford. The Aggies held the Bulldogs to a 9.0 score, showing little difference between: the Junior College and the Senior College teams.

The strong Oklahoma City University eleven were the next opponents for the fighting Aggies. The score up to the fourth quarter was 12-6 in favor of the Goldbugs, the Aggies scoring on a lony pass to Ward who ran about twenty yards for the counter. In this stage of the game the Aggies' first string men were nearly all taken out on account of injuries. Due to the limited supply of men, the remainder of the game was all in favor of the Goldbugs. Hi Wolf, gigantic right guard, Toby Waggoner, tackle, Vern Page, midget All-State center, and Frank Ward, the galloping ghost, showed in this game the stuff that, later in

the conference games, made them feared by all Aggie opponents.

The first Conference game was with the Oklahoma Military Academy Cadets of Claremore, who were champions in 1928. The game was played on the home gridiron and was viewed by the largest crowd of the year, being the occasion of the Annual College homecoming. The Aggies steamrolled their traditional foes to the score of 18-0.

Randolph College Loboes of Cisco, Texas were next on the Aggie schedule. The extreme heat of the southern climate proved to be a great handicap, and the Texans won, 26-13.

At Goodwell, Cameron faced the Panhandle Aggies, another fouryear college. The Cameron Aggies were the first to score on a long pass to Sargent, elusive right half-back who twisted and wiggled over the line. The goal was kicked and Cameron led, 7-0. The Panhandle Aggies came back strong in the last period of the game and made a touchdown but failed to kick goal. As a last resort Panhandle Aggies tried a place kick from the 25 -yard line, which was good. The score was 9-7 in favor of the Panhandlers.

The next conference game was with the Murray Aggies, the real dark horses of the conference. This game was full of thrills and real football. The Cameron Aggies were 6 points behind when only one minute remained of the game. Hoss Julian, small but mighty quarterback tossed a pass to Ward who galloped over the goal and then kicked the placement, nosing out the Murray boys by the close score of 19-18. In this game Ward also ran about 95 yards for a touchdown on the kickoff on a criss-cross play cleverly handled by Ballard, who received the ball and slipped it back to Ward. Nearly every Cameron player got a man and Ward outran and dodged his remaining opponents by a very clever exhibition of broken field running.

The Chilocco Indians of Chilocco, a powerful team, late in starting, turned back the invading Aggies by a score of 26-6 in a hard fought game upon a fast field.

In the Conference standing the Cameron Aggies stoot 500 percent by winning three games and losing the same number. Cameron player, who made the all-state team, was Vern Page, first team center.
