






ARE ENROLLED IN AT LEAST 1 DISTANCE EDUCATION CLASS























FIRST-TIME, FULL-TIME BACHELOR'S DEGREE SEEKING COHORT SIX-YEAR GRADUATION RATES




MOST REQUESTED MAJORS BY LOCAL EMPLOYERS (2013-2014)



HOW MANY PROGRAMS DO WE OFFER?




