## Friends, good times recalled at reunion

Swapping memories with old grads at Homecoming '92, held Sept. 25-26:


William C. "Dick" Whetsell, '39, of Pawhuska, visited with Cowley C. Banks, '40, of Willow. Whetsell for years has managed the sprawling Adams ranching interests in Osage County. After graduating from Cameron he attended Oklahoma State University, graduating in 1941. Banks was a teacher and soil conservationist for many years.

They remembered Irma May Casey, a beautiful young zoology and botany teacher who was always trying to baffle their classmate, Carl Smith Jr. "Carl was the brightest student I ever knew, without a doubt," Whetsell recalled. "As far as I know, she never succeeded in baffling him." Smith, who was from Apache, became a vocational agriculture teacher and now lives in Elk City.

Tom Wilson, Class of '24, and one of the five Distinguished Alumni honored at Homecoming '92, was former chief carpenter at OU, and he and his wife Hazel may be the Number One Sooner athletic fans. Soon they will purchase OU season football tickets for the 50th consecutive year. "They don't start the games until I get there," Wilson said with a smile.

Distinguished Alumnus Robert S. "Bob" Johnson, '41, boxed with the Cameron team when he was still in Lawton High School. He fought a total of 29 bouts, winning all except two draws and one loss. His last bout was unscheduled. He was sitting in the stands watching the bouts with his girl friend, Barbara Morgan. (They celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary last February.)

"Speck" Sanders, '40, was running the boxing bouts that evening," Johnson said. "I had just finished eating a bag of peanuts when he came to me and asked if I would fill in for a fighter who was ill. I was scared to death, but not wanting Speck to know that

I was a coward, I said yes."

Johnson weighed about 145. His opponent weighed about 175 pounds. The big boxer, a southpaw, hit Johnson in the stomach. Johnson still remembers that the blow hurt to the backbone. He managed to stay on his feet, and avoided the big man the rest of the round. Johnson switched to south paw, and knocked out his opponent early in the second round.

The little man, who also played guard on the Cameron football team, continued his fighting ways. As a fighter pilot during World War II, he had 27 confirmed kills of Nazi planes to become the fourth-ranking American flying ace of all time.

### Noted Grad stresses communication, teamwork



Written and oral communication skills are vital, and being able to work in teams with other people is very important.

Vicki Elliott, Cameron business grad who is a financial consultant in New York, gave that counsel when she returned to campus in October and spoke to several hundred high school and college students during high school business day. Elliott is senior manager of Financial Institutions Consulting, Peat Marwick Main & Co., New York City.

Discussing the kind of person business looks for when hiring, she said multidiscipline capabilities, lifelong learning, and being able to speak a second language are also important.

Elliott graduated from Cameron in 1974 with a B.S. in business administration, and earned a masters in management in 1978 at OU. She is a frequent speaker at the American Bankers Association and other financial conventions on market and organization planning, and mergers and acquisitions.

## Dr. Hamm teaches healthy aging

Success in growing old should start when you are young, said Dr. Elsie Hamm, Cameron adjunct professor.

"The key to success in aging involves taking care of one's health, having a diversity of interests and talents, and nurturing warm relationships with those around you," she said.

She taught a 1992 summer intercession course entitled healthy aging. The three-hour class was offered through the department of human ecology.

"Fifty percent of the elderly prefer to work," Hamm said.
"Some people who have retired are absolutely lost. Only five percent of the elderly are in nursing homes."

Many agencies reach out to the elderly. Some 3,200 individuals have taken advantage of 34 crafts and activities offered by the Center for Creative Living in Lawton, she said.

Hamm's students discussed social security and elderly abuse, and studied proper nutrition and exercise as the basics of preventive health care.

Dr. Hamm said there are more people over the age of 65 in the United States than the entire population of Canada. More than half of all women over 65 are widows, and women living alone are the poorest segment of our population, she said.

"Americans age 85 and older make up the fastest growing age group in the United States. Their number has multiplied 17 times in the past decade, Hamm said. They are also the most vulnerable segment of our society."

Hamm offered this light-hearted statistic involving the birthdays of centenarians announced by Willard Scott on "Today," the morning TV news show.

"They receive over 200 requests a week for birthday announcements on the show."


Hamm received her undergraduate degree in public health nursing at Loyola University in Chicago. She received a masters in human relations at the University of Oklahoma. At the age of 62, she earned a doctorate in gerontology at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center.

The healthy aging course is open to everyone, and she hopes to teach it again next year.

"From the second I started teaching this class, I watched the change of attitudes of the students," Hamm said. "Many may

have felt in the beginning that old age meant sick, lonely, and poor, but by the end of the course they were saying they were looking forward to becoming 90 or 95."

## Grandmother works, attends CU full time

Margaret Smith, at age 58, works almost 40 hours a week as a professional housekeeper and takes a fulltime schedule of classes at Cameron University each semester.

She does this in addition to spending a good deal of time with her family, and she earns a 3.58 grade average.

A junior majoring in art and minoring in history, she is the mother of six and the grandmother of 13.

She plans to graduate from Cameron in May 1994.

Since childhood, she has worked in art, mainly producing pen and ink drawings. After graduating from parochial school in New Jersey, Smith was offered a scholarship to the Philadelphia Institute of Art, but she did not attend the school because her mother feared a career in art would not provide a stable lifestyle. In the 1950s, she worked for the Curtis Publishing Co. in Philadelphia.

Later she married William Esslinger. She did not work outside the home during their marriage but produced some art as an extra source of income.

"I did drawings of churches and houses. I did this to pick up extra pocket money, but I also just enjoyed being able to produce art work," Smith said.

After her husband died, Smith worked as a technician at the Vineland, N.J., State School for the Mentally Retarded. Later, she was employed as a cook at the Sacred Heart Catholic Church.

In 1979, Smith moved to Lawton. She was encouraged to make the move by her daughter, Peggy, and her son-in-law.

"They moved to Lawton with the Army," Smith said. "They saw Lawton as a well-balanced community which had good recreation and education and suburban-type living. Lawton was also a town which allowed quick access to the country."

Before working exclusively for clients as a housekeeper, Smith worked as a care giver in three day cares and as a housekeeper at Great Plains Hospital and McMahon Tomlinson Nursing Center, both in Lawton. In preparation for her job in the day cares, she took courses in child care at Great Plains Vocational-Technical School.

She credits a Cameron professor for inspiring her to return to school to acquire a degree.

"I have worked for Dr. Mary Shanahan (professor of English) for six years. She thought that I had the qualities to be a successful student; she saw qualities in me that she thought I should cultivate," Smith said. "She felt age was no barrier."

Smith is an active member of Phi Alpha Theta, the history honor society. In addition to her strenuous schedule as a housekeeper and a student, Smith enjoys hiking, church functions, writing poetry and fiction, and activities with her family.

After graduation, Smith wants to attend the University of Oklahoma and obtain a masters of liberal studies with a museum emphasis. Her goal is to work in a museum.

Age should be no barrier to individuals wanting to return to school, Smith said.

"We all have many talents we don't realize we have. We need to take a chance, to be bold."
