Built in 1922 by Pablo Garza as a family home. Over the years, doubled as a grocery store/gas station. Canopy over pumps has a 1934 date scratched into the concrete. Two trees flanking pumps are made of concrete. Building was leased to many businesses until 1983 when Pearl's Oyster Co. renovated and evidently purchased the building.
