INTRODUCTION

The Mary E. Von Mach Collection was accessioned into IWASM in May 1975. The papers and objects were donated by Mary Von Mach to the Museum Trust of the Ninety-Nines which formed the beginning of the International Women's Air & Space Museum. The collection is listed on the original Museum Trust inventory list as "1 plaid suit case of Mary Van Mock [sic] items". A 1975 written inventory list is in the accessions file drawer under "Von Mach".

The papers in the collection date from 1928 to 1935 and are organized into the following series:

- 1. Biography
- 2. 1929 Women's Air Derby
- 3. Organizations
- 4. Newspaper articles and Clippings
- 5. Photographs

In addition to the archival material, there is a list of accessioned items at the end of the Finding Aid. The material fills one Hollinger box and there are no restrictions on the use of these materials.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Mary Elizabeth Von Mach (1895-1980) was the first woman in the State of Michigan to be granted a pilot's license (#4117) and was the first woman to own and operate a plane in the state. She received a Travel Air airplane from a relative and traveled to Phoenix, Arizona to complete her training. She was the first woman accepted at Parks Air College in St. Louis, where she graduated in 1931. Also in 1931 she became the first woman in Michigan to receive an air transport license and earned a flight instructor's rating. During WWII, Von Mach worked as a final inspector for Pratt-Whitney on their B-24 engine line at the Willow Run plant in Michigan. She later became a saleswoman for a paint company [what company?].

Mary was a participant in the first Women's Air Derby and a charter member of the Ninety-Nines. She established the Michigan chapter of the Ninety-Nines in 1934, holding many offices in the organization.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The papers in this collection are arranged into six series. They comprise items relating to the 1929 First Women's Air Derby. The file folders and the papers within each folder are generally ordered chronologically.
