# CONSTITUTION.

ART. I.

NAME.

This association shall be called "The Woman's Club of Evanston."

ART. II.

OBJECTS.

Its objects are mutual helpfulness in all affairs of life, and united efforts toward the higher development of humanity.

ART. III.

DEPARTMENTS.

The work of the club shall be done by means of Departments, representing its chosen lines of work.

ART. IV.

The officers shall be a President, four vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, a Board of nine Directors, and the Chairmen of Departments. These officers shall constitute the Executive Board, and shall be elected by ballot at the annual meeting, except the Chairmen of Departments.

ART. V.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

Section 1. The Duties of the President and vice-Presidents shall be such as usually pertain to their offices in similar organizations.

SEC. 2. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of each meeting of the Club, and also the minutes of the Executive Board, and read them at the next

meeting. She shall make out from her minutes an order of business for each meeting for the use of the President.

SEC. 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Club, send out notices, apprise committees of their appointment, and officers and mem-

SEC. 4. The Treasurer shall be the custodian of the funds of the Club, which she shall pay out only upon the order of the Executive Board. She shall take vouchers for all disbursements of money, and shall retain and file them; and also keep an account of all receipts and expenditures. A bond shall be required of the Treasurer in such sums as the Executive Board may elect. A monthly report shall be required of her by the Board and she shall make a full report of the finances of the Club at the annual meeting, the correctness of which must be attested by the Finance Committee.

SEC. 5. The Executive Board shall transact the business referred to it by the Club.

# ART. VI.

This constitution may be amended at any meeting of the Club by a two-thirds vote of the members present; the amendments having been approved by the Executive Board, and notice of the intention to amend and a copy of the proposed amendment having been presented by the Executive Board not less than one month previous.

# ART. VII.

All questions of order arising not provided for by the constitution shall be decided by Roberts' "Rules of

# BY-LAWS.

#### ART. I.

#### MEMBERSHIP.

Section 1. To become a member of the Club the name and address of the candidate must be submitted to the Executive Board by the proposer on the blanks provided for that purpose, and have the full signature of two additional members as endorsers. No member can propose more than two candidates during a Club year.

SEC. 2. Members of the Executive Board may propose candidates but cannot endorse while holding office.

SEC. 3. Candidates must be recommended by the unanimous ballot of the Executive Board; and confirmed by a majority vote of those present at a regular meeting of the Club.

SEC. 4. Unless a candidate shall signify her acceptance of membership within three months of her notification, such election to membership shall be declared void,

SEC. 5. A name rejected shall not be reconsidered during the official term of that Executive Board.

SEC. 6. No member may propose a candidate until she has been a member of the Club one year.

#### ART. II.

#### DUES.

Section 1. An entrance fee of two dollars shall be paid upon the acceptance of membership.

SEC. 2. An annual fee of one dollar shall be required of each member at the annual meeting before she shall be entitled to vote. All rights of membership shall be forfeited until such dues are paid.

SEC. 3. Tickets of membership shall be issued to all members upon the payment of annual dues.

SEC. 4. A forfeited membership shall be restored only by the unanimous consent of the Executive Board the payment of back dues being left to the discretion of the Board.

# ART. III.

# MEETINGS.

SECTION 1. The annual meeting shall be held the third Friday in April and shall be called by individual

SEC. 2. The general meetings of the Club shall be called by individual notification for the third Friday of each month during the Club year, which shall be from the last of September to the last of May inclusive. The time of these meetings shall be between 2:30 and 5o'clock p.m. Fifteen members shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of the Club when business is transacted.

SEC. 3. Special meetings of the Club may be called by the Executive Board by individual notification.

SEC. 4. The meeting of the Executive Board shall be on Monday preceding the second Friday of the month. Five shall constitute a quorum.

# ART. IV.

The Executive Board shall at its first meeting after the annual meeting appoint the Standing Committees on Program; Rooms; Finance; and Social affairs; the chairmen of these several committees to be appointed from the nine Directors.

# ART. V.

Section 1. The duty of the Program Committee shall be to arrange a program for the year.

SEC. 2. The duties of the Room Committee shall be to provide and have general charge of the place of meeting and its properties, and to provide all necessary furnishing for the same.

SEC. 3. The Finance Committee shall approve all bills before payment, except those for rent and light, also audit the accounts of the Treasurer, and report to the Board in January, and to the Club at its annual meeting.

SEC. 4. The Committee on Social affairs shall have charge of social meetings, and shall receive and introduce new members and guests.

#### ART. VI.

#### HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS.

Section 1. The Secretary of the Club shall call a meeting of each Department for organization. Each Department shall elect its own chairman, who shall arrange and attend stated meetings of her Department. The shall prepare and provide for the work of such meetings as may be under the charge of her Department, of which proposed work she shall make report to the Executive Board at its May meeting. She shall be present at the Club meetings conducted by her Department and superintend the fulfilment of the program. At each meeting of the Executive Board she shall report the progress of work undertaken by her Department, and at the annual meeting the work accomplished during the year.

NEC. 2. Each Department of the Club shall bear its and expenses, so far as such expenses are personal to the Department, and not incurred in providing enterminment for the Club as a whole.

# HISTORY.

The first half decade in the life history of the Woman's Club, has been a complete realization the faith in the possibilities of organized societies for which lent inspiration to the formation of one of Man first Woman's Clubs. What Alice Cary accomplished Morosis, Mrs. Elizabeth Boynton Harbert has conand amplified in Evanston.

Like Alice Cary, she recognized the important part the latent abilities of woman were destined to play in sublic affairs, and the necessity of preparation to meet men on their own ground, and from the little coterie which first assembled to formulate plans, the personal implication, enthusiasm and wise government of Mrs. Marbeth Boynton Harbert has largely caused the Club mattain to its present state of healthful activity and influence.

The initial step toward the organization of the Club was taken in the month of March, 1889, when a meeting was held at the residence of Mrs. Harbert. The result of this assemblage was a preliminary organization, of which Mrs. Harbert was elected President and Mrs. T. P. Stanwood, Secretary.

For a time the meetings were informal, different members being called upon to preside. Early in the season of 1890, such a marked growth in membership and interest was perceptible, that a constitution was adopted and regular officers elected.

The programs during the first three years were of an excellent, but miscellaneous character, no particular line of work being pursued. One of the prominent features of this period was a reception tendered by the Club to the school teachers of Evanston, during which an address was given by Colonel Parker, of Englewood, on "The Relation of the Child to the School and Home." During these years the Club enjoyed the hospitality of its President, Mrs. Harbert, who generously opened her home for its meetings. The spirit of harmony and love that pervades all the work of the Club, is well illustrated by the devotion of the members to the rooms in which the first meetings were held.

In December, 1892, the limit to membership having been removed, the increased attendance made it necessary to procure larger accommodations. The arrangement did not prove a success, however, and so great was the attachment for the rooms associated with the early life of the Club, that when Mrs. Harbert again asked the Club to be her guest, the kind invitation was heartily and gratefully accepted. At the present time, the membership having increased to two hundred and fifteen, it has again become necessary to seek larger rooms. The long-cherished plans to build a permanent home for the Club has already begun to materialize, and it is expected that before another year has passed, the meetings will be held in a house especially planned to meet the requirements of the different branches of work in which the Club is engaged.

In the year 1892 it was decided to join the Federation of Clubs, and Evanston has been ably represented at the two conventions held in Chicago and Philadelphia. In a letter to Mrs. Harbert, Mrs. Elizabeth Cady

Manton urged the necessity of a clean city before the World's Fair visitors arrived. Although not officially represented on the committee of Chicago women appointed for that purpose, yet Mrs. Henry Wade Rogers, from our Club, embodied all we could ask of worth and ment in this new departure of woman's work. During the season of 1891-92, after the World's Fair was assured to Chicago, the Club was honored by the presence of Mrs. Potter Palmer, Mrs. Charles Henrotin, Dr. Julia Holmes Smith, Mrs. George Dunlap, Mrs. M. M. Wallace, Miss Maria Hofer, Mr. Lorado Taft, Mr. Mehriber and others, who addressed it at various times on the interests and place of women in the coming Exmultion. It was decided to form a World's Fair Demartment, for the instruction of the members in the various works of interest connected with the Fair. This Department begun in 1891, continued through the season 1894, and proved to be not only of intense interest, an educator, enabling its members to enjoy intellicently the many wonderful exhibitions of the great Exposition. The club gratefully recognizes that much of the marked success of this Department was due to its Chairman, Miss Mary Harris.

Among the many helpful papers of this season was one by Mrs. Charles Henrotin on "Household Economics." So inspiring did the words of the speaker prove, that plans were at once made to organize a Department for the furtherance of this object. Meetings were held twice each month and papers on "Domestic Science," previously read at the World's Fair Congresses, were presented to the members.

At a meeting of the Club held November 13, 1891, the earnest words of Mrs. A. L. Butler proved the impetus that made the Emergency Hospital an assured success. The ladies of the Club, working with others interested, were enabled by the profits resulting from a Kirmess, to bestow over thirty-six hundred dollars on the cause. During the latter part of the past winter, a bureau of information was supported by the Club, thus enabling many worthy women to find work. At a meeting held September 10, 1894, it was decided that all lines of philanthropic work hitherto carried on by the Club should be combined in one Department, which should be known as the Department of Philanthropy. This Department elected a Chairman and Secretary, and a committee will be appointed to take charge of the different features of work that may come within its scope.

At the same meeting a Department of Art and Literature was formed, a committee being appointed to formulate a program for the year. Many of the charter members of our organization have earnestly worked in the interests of the Club during the five years of its existence, and we desire to always hold their names in loving remembrance, as well as those of Mrs. H. F. Olmsted, Miss Julia A. Ames, Mrs. J. E. Miller and others who labored faithfully with us until taken away.

We would also speak with all honor of Frances E. Willard and Anna A. Gordon, whom, although not seeing often, we love. In these, as well as in the active members of the Club, the intellectual and social life have always exemplified our motto—"In essentials, unity; in non-essentials, liberty; in all things, charity."
