1. A Frankenthal tea caddy painted on one side with a Gentleman and on the other side with a Lady. 4-3/4" high. OT with crown and the numeral '71' mark---indicating the year of manufacture as 1771. Perfect. \$225.00
2. A Meissen cylindrical cup and saucer painted with botanical flowers. Blue crossed swords mark. C. 1740. Perfect. \$175.00
3. A Meissen tea bowl and saucer painted with figural scenes in the white reserves, which are framed with feathery scroll work. The outer edge of cup and saucer with gilt scroll work. Numeral '11' in gilt' mark. Porcelain dates about 1722. Perfect. \$375.00
- X 4. A Meissen deep dish with wide molded border with three molded sprays of polychrome flowers; the center with an onion and bouquet of flowers. 9-3/4" in diameter and 1-3/4" deep. Blue crossed swords mark. C. 1745. Perfect. \$190.00
- X 5. A Meissen tea caddy and cover painted with botanical flowers; a large red rose with green leaves on one side and a large yellow flower on the other side. Crossed swords mark, circa 1745. Tiny chip on rim of cover. \$275.00
- X 6. A Frankenthal pitcher with gilt stripes and with large colorful clusters of fruit. 3-1/2" high. OT mark with crown; c. 1765. Perfect. \$150.00
7. A Meissen saucer dish with large yellow botanical flowers, smaller sprigs and insects. 3-1/8" in diameter. Blue crossed swords mark. Perfect. C. 1740. \$95.00
- X 8. A Meissen yellow ground bowl with botanical flowers in the white reserves; one side with red flowers as pictured and the other side with a large blue tulip and two large green leaves. 3-5/8" in diameter. Blue crossed swords mark, c. 1740. Perfect. \$725.00
