## *Annual Report of the President and Director*

A statistical review of the Museum's activities for the past year might give the erroneous impression that the efforts of the staff had been partially suspended during this period. The celebration of the Museum's Silver Anniversary was the most memorable event of the year. It brought many demands on our staff and was a dominant factor in affecting our program both before and after the event.

### EXHIBITIONS

To emphasize the wealth of our collection after 25 years we continued the policy, commenced in the previous autumn, of having successive exhibitions featuring our historical coverage of the creative art of successive regions and periods, as well as our indebtedness to our major donors.

Such exhibitions of a wide variety of objects take far more time to display and to label, and yet since they are drawn from our storage it is difficult to get either the press or the general public to realize often the supreme quality or the rare opportunity that these all too fleeting events represent. Although many of these exhibitions could be allotted only a few weeks, we did not have the time and space to cover even the highlights of our entire collection and still meet the demands of the annual exhibitions, the local one-man shows and the traveling exhibits in which we were participating. In the latter category came the extensive retrospective shows of the work of two great moderns who died in the early part of the century, namely, Tomioka Tessai of Japan, and Andre Marquet of France.

The most demanding and expensive exhibition in which we participated was that of "Masterpieces of Korean Art." Our showing of this official collection immediately followed its display at the National Gallery in Washington, the Metropolitan Museum and the Boston Museum of Fine Arts. By contract it had to be shown under a fee with any profits going to the restoration of art in Korea. Unfortunately its subtle beauty and its coincidence with an exceptionally hot summer caused it to end with a substantial deficit, the precise amount of which will not be ascertained until the final proration of expenses at the close of the circuit.

Another exhibition that deserves special mention is the one that we prepared from the Museum collection to honor the delegates to the meeting in Seattle of the nations participating in the Colombo Plan. We devoted five galleries to a display of much of our material from South and East Asia exclusive of China, featuring the comparative religious, folk and secular arts of this region. The Museum arranged for transportation for the delegates to the reception for this event.

A far more fleeting event which was also very demanding was the display of the material donated and drawn from the Museum collection for the auction sponsored by the Museum Guild. The catalog was prepared by the Museum staff.

Following their European and Pacific tours, the termination of the two exhibits of Eight American Artists, which we assembled in 1956 for the U. S. Information Agency, entailed many demands on our staff. By the close of the year the material had all been returned to its owners.

We continued to be active in lending original material to more than 20

other organizations outside the state, including both the Brussels International Exhibition and the Venice Biennale where Seattle's Mark Tobey was the first American since Whistler to win the award. Our largest loan was 22 items to the exhibit of "The Art of Japan in the Edo Period" at the Rockhill Nelson Gallery of Kansas City and the City Art Museum of St. Louis. Of about 20 loans within the State the most extensive have been to the new downtown gallery of the Tacoma Art Association. We also lent about 600 facsimiles to 46 local organizations. This service for various reasons had to be curtailed due to congestion in our storage area for several periods of considerable duration.

### SPECIAL EVENTS AND PROGRAMS

The outstanding special event was of course the very successful Silver Anniversary Banquet in the Grand Ball Room of the Olympic Hotel on June

11th under the most able chairmanship of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph E. Gandy. Special thanks must also be given to Mayor Gordon S. Clinton and two very noted collectors, Avery Brundage of Chicago and Vincent Price of Hollywood, for contributing their services as our principal guest speakers. We also are most grateful to our friends and members who so generously participated in this notable affair either through their presence or through their contributions.

We presented 12 Sunday afternoon chamber music concerts under the direction of Ronald Phillips. Half of these were generously sponsored by the Music Performance Trust Funds of the Recording and Television Industries. During the course of the Korean exhibition we had several special programs in cooperation with the Far Eastern Institute of the University of Washington.

We had the pleasure of presenting two Japanese lecture demonstrations: one by Houn Ohara, Master of the Ohara School of Flower Arrangement, the other by Juji Abe on scroll mounting. We also had two excellent lectures by European scholars: one by Dr. Eleanor C. Consten of Aachen on *The Image of Man in Far Eastern Art*, the other on *Indonesian Temples Recovered from the Jungles* by Dr. J. E. van Lohuizen of Cambridge University, one of the leading archaeologists in this field.

In the late autumn the Museum served as one of the regional centers for the invited artist Fellowship competition for the Ford Foundation.

#### LIBRARY AND LENDING MATERIAL

The facilities of the Library were vastly improved by the construction of a large counter according to specifications devised by the Museum staff. This was accomplished by the carpenters of the Park Department from material supplied by the Museum. During the year the Museum added over 209 volumes and over 150 museum catalogs, hand books, guides and brochures, many of Germany and Holland. The principal gift was 57 volumes of Japan's famed art periodical *Kokka*, donated by the Director.

Our collection of slides continued to play a very important part in our educational service. Our staff and docents used nearly 7000 of them. Aside from Mr. Rogers' lectures, the University of Washington borrowed over 550 and other educational institutions and organizations more than 2000. During the course of the year nearly 500 obsolete slides were discarded while over 1000 colored slides were added, bringing our total collection to well over 19,000.

#### ACCESSIONS

The extensive accessions for the past year attained an exceptionally high standard due to the happy coincidence of funds and rare opportunities at prices within our means. The Anniversary Fund was of course a very important factor and to a large extent has been expended. The accessions with their sources are gratefully acknowledged in a list commencing on page 44.

#### ARCHITECTURAL EXHIBIT

The Ninth Annual Architectural Exhibit under the title of Vintage Years featured outstanding examples of domestic architecture at Windermere built during the scope of the Museum's life, again emphasizing the anniversary theme. This very important event, under the excellent chairmanship of Mrs. John W. White, brought over \$6,000 to our general fund. We are also most grateful to her able Vice Chairmen, Mrs. Irving S. Smith and Mrs. David R. Bollong, as well as to Mrs. James F. Lyons as Secretary and Mrs. A. Talcott Ostrander as Treasurer.

Through 16 subcommittees the responsibility for this highly organized

#### PUBLICITY

We are as usual most grateful to the Seattle Post-Intelligencer and the Seattle Times and some of our neighborhood papers for their generous coverage of some of our principal activities. Our very important cooperation from the broadcasting stations falls in the report of the Educational Department. We were also fortunate in receiving some national publicity.

The response to the Engagement Book exceeded our expectations and resulted in a small profit notwithstanding the large number given away here and abroad. We have decided that its good will makes it well worth the effort and are therefore continuing its publication in spite of my previous statement to the contrary.

#### TRAVEL EXPENSE

A small travel grant permitted Allen Wilcox, Assistant Curator, to have a limited tour of South India on the termination in Australia of his responsibility for the Pacific Circuit of the U. S. Information Agency exhibit.

At no expense to the Museum the Director had two trips abroad, one as the guest of the West German Government. He also attended the meetings of the American Association of Museums and the Art Museum Directors in the East. Our expense account included assistance to the Associate Director, Millard B. Rogers, for attending the California meetings of the Western Association of Museums in Los Angeles and to Edward B. Thomas, the Director of Education, for attending the National Committee on Art Education meetings in New York, the American Association of Museums meeting in Charleston, the Pacific Art Association meeting in California, and the Washington Art Association meeting in Yakima. All three also visited the Van Gogh exhibition at the De Young Museum in San Francisco to prepare for our installation.

#### MAINTENANCE AND EQUIPMENT

The Museum purchased a label typewriter and an electric mimeograph, as well as a desk and two chairs for the Education Department. Aside from the extensive job in the Library and the usual fine maintenance of the building there were no major projects through the Park Department during the past year, although there will be many notable items to report a year hence.

#### BOARD OF TRUSTEES

In July a special meeting of the Museum membership unanimously approved the resolution of the Board increasing membership dues 50 per cent and the number of elected Board members from 18 to 24. This permitted the election of Willis L. Campbell, Edmund F. Maxwell, Willard J. Wright. Joseph E. Gandy had been previously elected to fill a vacancy. William G. Reed was elected after the first of the year and the complement became full with the election of Alfred Shemanski and William S. Street. The Board has been active in a limited membership campaign which has brought response of some encouragement.

We are most grateful to our faithful members for their wide acceptance of the increased membership dues which have been vital in meeting our inevitably increasing budget. The generosity of the major year-end donors has also again played an essential role in our financial solvency.

In closing I as usual take pleasure in expressing my gratitude to all the members of the staff for their initiative and faithful service which has been essential to the success of our organization.

## *Annual Report of the Education Department*

The greatest number of people were reached in our educational program through the medium of television. There was a total of 107 Museum broadcasts during 1958. A one-hour broadcast commemorating our 25th Anniversary and 42 half-hour programs were presented on KING-TV's Community Workshop. These weekly programs have now been on the air for more than seven years and are the oldest continuous series of local programs in Northwest television.

This year we kinescoped six new TV programs called *Our Neighbors: The Japanese* and two programs titled *Our Neighbors: The Mexicans* for use in third grade classrooms. Each Japanese program was rebroadcast three times a week during the spring 1958 semester with an average audience of 6,421 youngsters for each broadcast. The series was again rebroadcast three times during the fall 1958 semester with an average audience of 4,859. The Mexican series, also shown three times, had a 4,262 audience. These figures are from Seattle Public Schools only. For all King County Schools they would be more than double. The Japanese series also was aired on KVOS-TV for use by the Bellingham schools. Kinescopes from our *Man's Story* series for high school students were used in demonstrations by the Asia Society in New York City and at the Eastern Art Association convention in Washington, D. C.

KTNT-TV did a series of seven Museum programs and KIRO-TV had seven shorter interview broadcasts. Mrs. Lahr did an evening program for KCTS-TV and Mr. Rogers did an evening remote Broadcast with KOMO-TV from our Christmas exhibit gallery. Mr. Rogers also did the weekly radio programs on KXA and KOMO. The above television and radio stations generously contributed their services and valuable air time for our broadcasts, and in addition have been helpful to the Museum with publicity and news interviews and spot announcements.

All our regular educational activities were continued as usual. Mrs. Lahr and I gave 82 lectures and tours in the Museum and ten outside lectures.

During spring semester the exceptional students' class for high school seniors studied painting with Mr. William Hixson, and in the autumn, printmaking with Danny Pierce. The professional classes for Seattle school teachers covered Principles of Art.

The Educational Director completed for LIFE magazine an educational guide to the Illuminations exhibit for use in other museums and wrote an Acoustiguide tour of the Korean Treasures exhibit. The Acoustiguides were used by 1,186 persons (more than 15 per cent of the paid attendance), reached both men and women and all occupational groups, but were most widely used by people in the professions.

As usual the Museum is deeply indebted to the many volunteers who have made our diverse educational activities possible and particularly to the Guild Docent Committee and to the Junior League Treasure Box Committee whose members visited 256 Seattle and Bellevue classrooms and worked with 7,900 third grade youngsters.

# Report of the Seattle Art Museum Guild

1958-59

As chairman of the Seattle Art Museum Guild, I have the pleasure and privilege to report briefly on the year's activities.

The fine work of the Program Committee has resulted in near capacity attendances at the Guild lectures held in the auditorium on the first and third Thursdays, October through April. The morning series of lectures entitled *Creative "Isms" of 19th Century Painting* were given by Dr. Fuller, Mr. Rogers and Mr. Thomas. This gave a fine background preparation for the van Gogh exhibition held this March and April. For the afternoon series *The Designer Speaks*, the Program Committee assembled an interesting group of speakers covering a broad field. Included were such subjects as *The Brussels Fair, The Mural in Relation to Contemporary Architecture, Modern Designs in Stained Glass, Jewelry Design and Redesign, Creating with Paper, Cartooning—the Art of Humor, Seattle Sponsors the Arts*, to mention but a number. We are greatly indebted to all the speakers of the series for their generosity and cooperation.

For the Docent Committee this has been an exceedingly busy year. Besides the Conducting Docents, there is a large enthusiastic group in training. In addition to their regular study program, this year on *The Art of India from the Gupta Period up to the Islamic Invasions*, they have initiated a series of seminars devoted to the study and discussion of the Museum's current exhibits. A panel and a moderator were assigned for each month stimulating group discussion. The Korean exhibition in the fall and the van Gogh exhibition this spring greatly increased their work in both preparation and tours. For the van Gogh exhibition alone there were 61 public tours and 494 group-arranged tours serving 11,060 people. This represents 555 docent hours of service, three-quarters of the docents giving 11 or more tours and one-third gave 17 to 19 tours.

The Membership Committee is active 12 months of the year securing new members for the Museum. One very effective means is the Coffee Brunch. Three were given this year. After a talk by Mr. Thomas on the needs and uses of the Museum, new and prospective members are taken on a "behind the scenes" tour of the Museum's facilities, returning to the Activities Room for sandwiches, cake and coffee.

The Project Committee, with the assistance of the Museum staff, sponsored an auction in October. The results were most gratifying and \$4,000 was presented to Dr. Fuller for the Museum. It was used to purchase *The Pieta*, a Flemish oak sculpture of ca. 1525.

On Guild days our Hospitality Committee has served most efficiently over 1,100 persons with tea and coffee during the noon hour between Guild lectures. As the Activities Room has been filled to near capacity, this is not an easy task. Members of the committee also serve as ushers for the lectures in the auditorium. During the two entrance-charged exhibitions, when refreshments were served, the committee has given assistance to the Public Relations Committee.

The Public Relations Committee has arranged for and served as hostesses at four teas, given at the Museum for various groups and organizations. It is the aim of this endeavor to acquaint more people with the Museum and its activities; to promote an awareness of the Museum's need for support; and to

obtain new members. To this end, the groups were taken on a Docent conducted tour of the galleries, given a brief talk, and each supplied with a fact sheet and membership blank preceding the tea hour. During the Korean and the van Gogh exhibitions the Committee members served refreshments each afternoon. This service has been greatly appreciated by the public and is a definite contribution in public relations. For the van Gogh exhibition 25 volunteers spent about 350 hours of service, at least 10 of them spending 24 hours apiece.

Staffing the sales areas at the van Gogh exhibition for the sale of reproductions of the paintings, post cards, slides, books and catalogs was taken over by the Guild, thereby contributing to the financial success of the exhibition and increasing the interest of the workers in the Museum. 217 different volunteers contributed over 2500 hours of service.

The Christmas Party for Foreign Students was omitted this year as it was felt that that particular type of party had served its usefulness. Instead, a party is being planned for next fall soon after the school year begins. We hope thereby to give a welcome to new Foreign Students and introduce the Museum to both new and former students.

The Publicity Chairman has received splendid cooperation from the daily and community newspapers. We are most grateful to these publications. We are indebted to station KXA for the monthly broadcasts which have been so well presented by the Radio Chairman.

I have reported on the works of the standing committees of the Guild, but also important has been the cooperation and able assistance of other Board

members and advisors. I also wish to express my sincere appreciation to all Guild members for their valuable contribution toward a successful year for the Guild.

I find it difficult to convey in words the value of the assistance and co-operation given by the Museum Staff to the Guild Board, and most especially to me. As always, they give of their time and knowledge above and beyond the call of duty, making the association with them a rare privilege. To them we are most grateful.

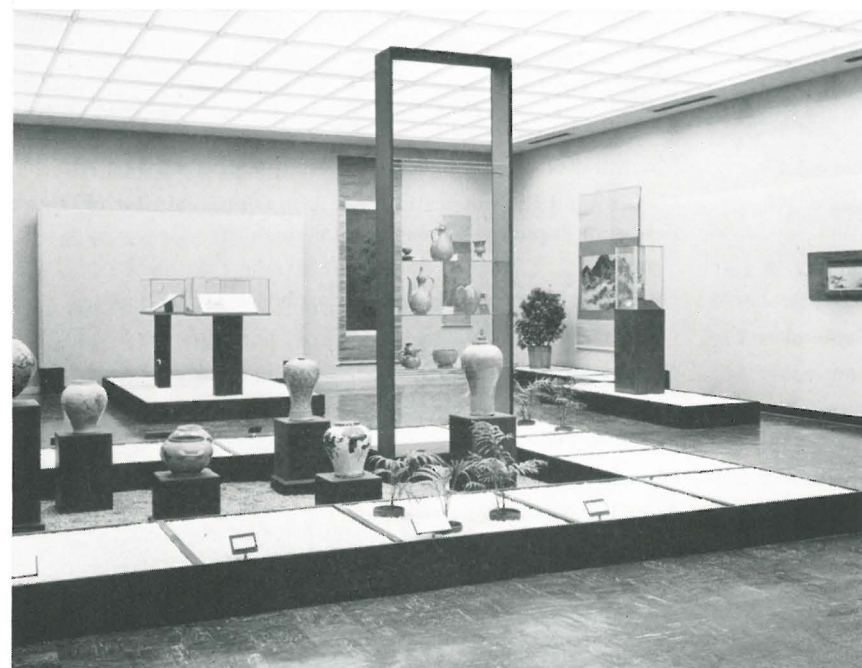

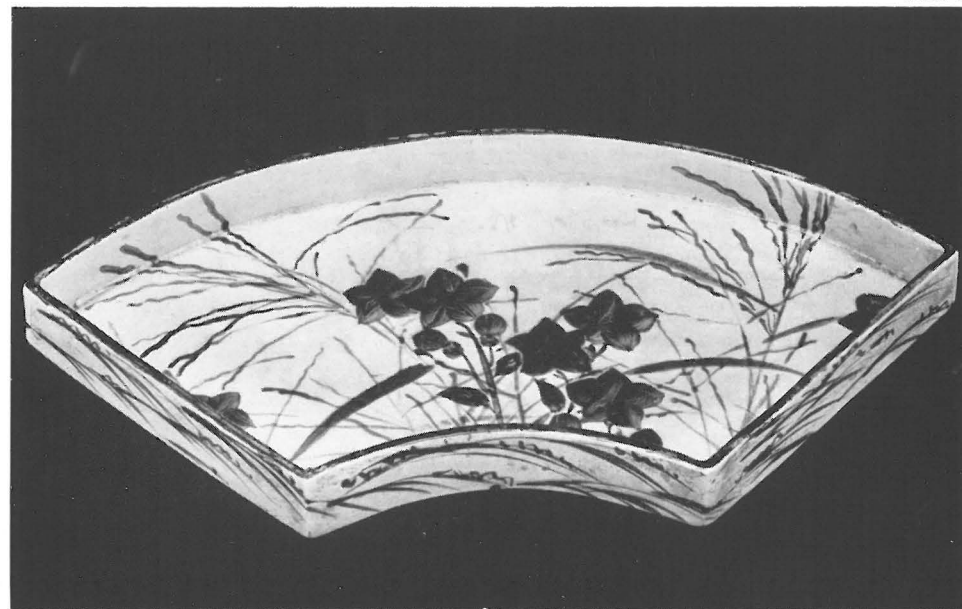

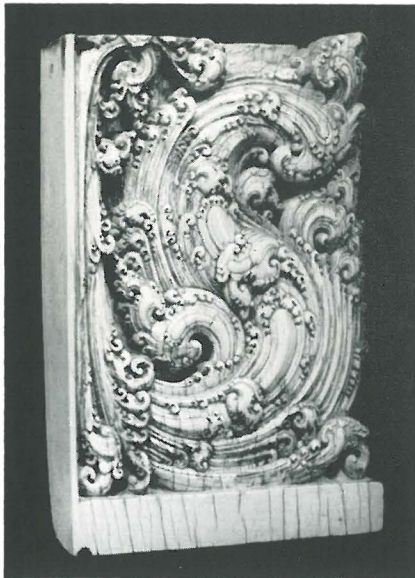


FIG. 13. Part of a door jamb, carved in vine leaf design, ivory; Ceylon, 18th cent.;  $6\frac{1}{4} \times 4\frac{7}{8}$  in. (FIn10.7). Eugene Fuller Memorial Collection

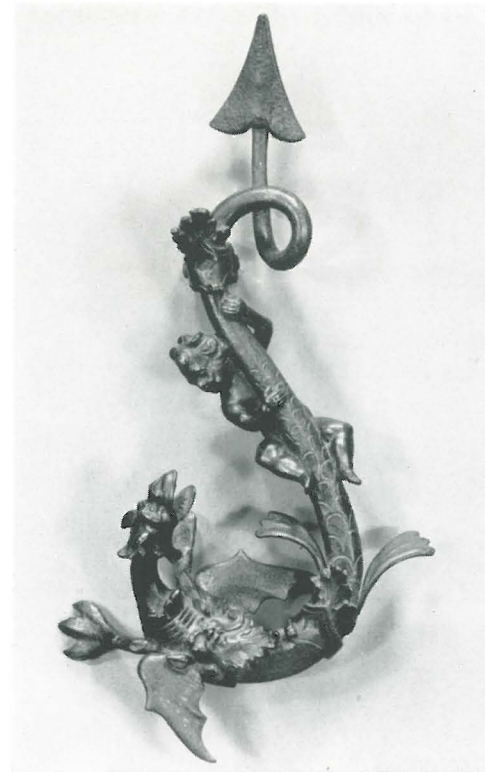

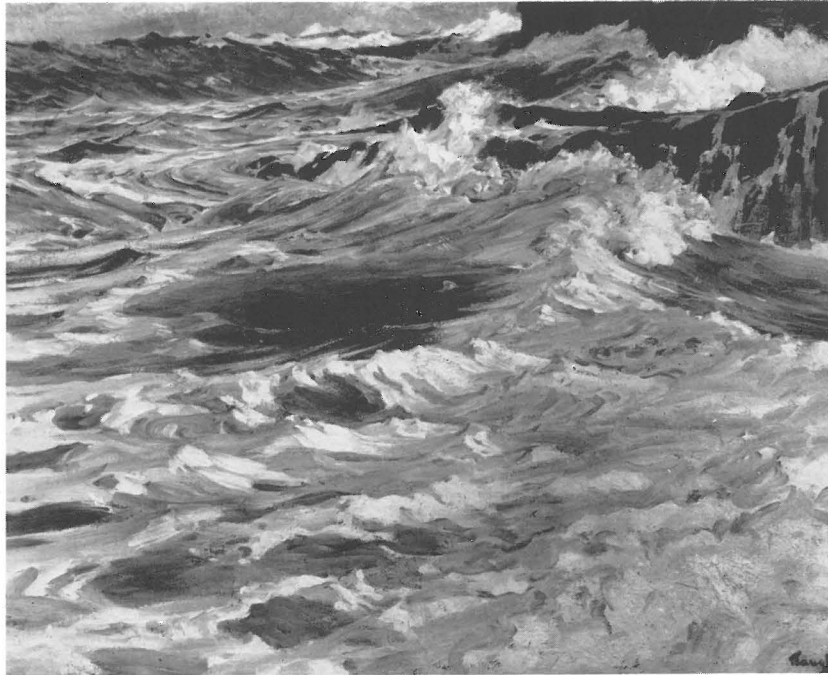

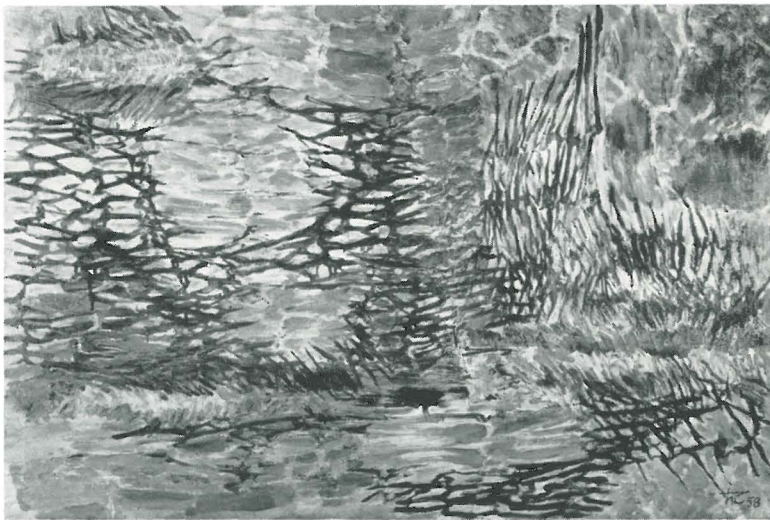

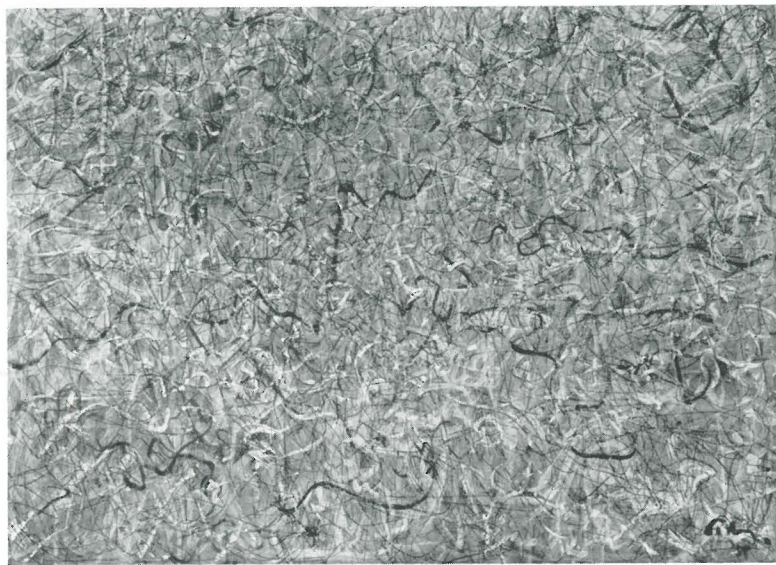

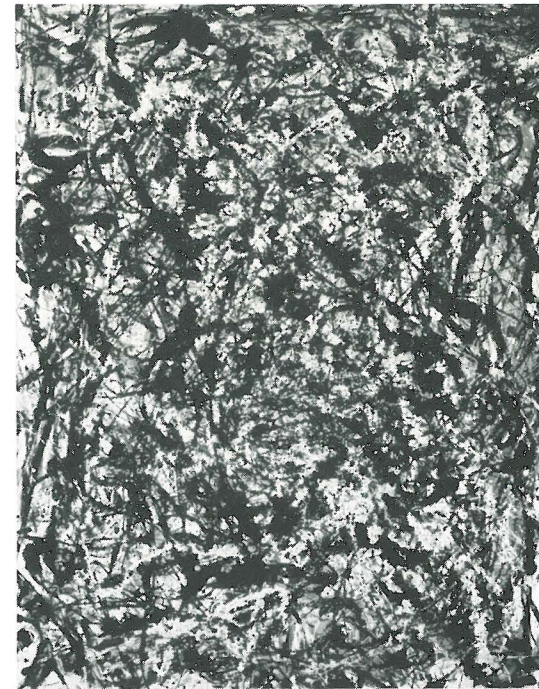

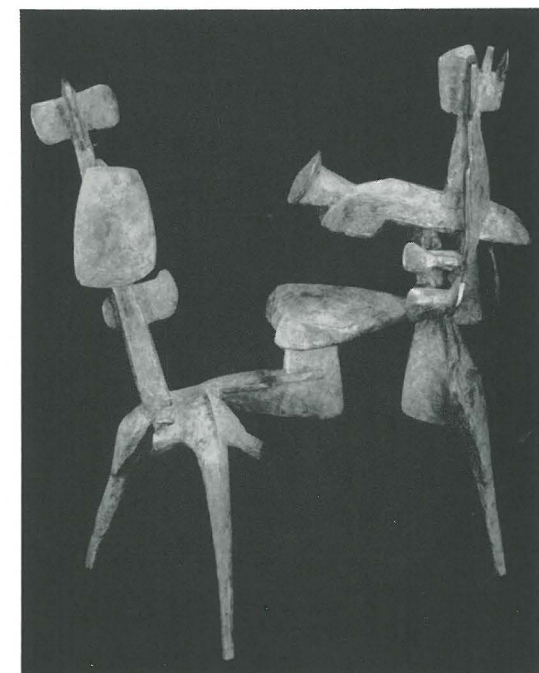


FIG. 41. *The Neo Shang*, by James Lee Hansen, 1925-, Vancouver, Wash.; bronze; H. 22 $\frac{7}{8}$  in. (A11/H1983.2). Norman Davis Sculpture Award

### AUDITORS' CERTIFICATE

We have examined the accounts of the SEATTLE ART MUSEUM for the calendar year 1958 and have prepared the attached statements which, in our opinion, correctly set forth the financial condition of the Museum at December 31, 1958, and the results of its operations for the year then ended.

Securities carried on the balance sheet at values when acquired of \$772,578.51 had total approximate market values of \$1,118,370.00 at the close of the year. During the year the proceeds of security sales were less than the carrying values by \$12,629.46 and were deducted from the several surplus balances.

It should be noted that the attached statements are made on a strictly cash basis and no attempt has been made to evaluate the Museum's collections, library, equipment and properties other than money and securities.
