Three Omaha U footballers were named to the 1964 Central Intercollegiate Conference first team.

Quarterback Marlin Briscoe, the CIC total offense leader with 1,309 yards, was named to a backfield post. Briscoe, a sophomore, passed for 939 yards and added 370 rushing yards in leading OU to a surprising 5-4

Senior Guard Harlan Aden mans one of the guard posts. Aden was the only OU senior and is still hoping for another year of eligibility on a "hard-ship" appeal. The Scottsbluff native was a great pulling guard and led the OU power sweep that was so badly damaged by the loss of Gerald Allen midway through the year.

Defensive Tackle Ron Stave was a demon on defense. The 223 pound soph is tremendously quick and very strong. He likes defense but could go both ways in the opinion of the coaches.

Stave appears headed for stardom at OU.

## Second Team

Omahans Don Crum, Dave Rak and Mike DiBiase made the second team and weren't far behind the first group.

Crum was the leader of OU's defensive secondary that was mediocre at times but brilliant on others. He is a junior.

Rak is another fine OU sophomore. The 6-2, 210 pounder is quick and strong and a good blocker. He switched to defense this year after being a part time offensive started in

Mike DiBiase, another soph, was the CIC's third leading pass receiver with 19 grabs for 280 yards and five touchdowns.

The rangy end possesses great hands and is coming into his own in blocking and other points of the game. He is the son of pro wrestler "Iron Mike" DiBiase, a former football great himself.
