



Wagner College

- New York City, Borough of Staten Island
- Privately-owned college, 105-acre campus
- ▶ 2,200 bright students; about 80% live on campus
- ▶ 96 full-time professors
- ▶ Nearly all classes taught in person, with maximum 30 students per class





Very Short Time Frame

- ► March 2, 2020
 - ► First request to faculty for whether they would be able to transition to online courses.
- March 10, 2020
 - ▶ Decision to cancel in person classes from March 11 until March 30.
 - ► March 14 to 22 was spring break.
 - There would be 1 week of online classes from March 22 to 29.
- March 20, 2020
 - Decision to cancel in-person classes for the remainder of the semester (to May 10).
 - Governor Cuomo ordered non-essential employees to work from remote locations.
 - ▶ Students were away from campus for spring break at this time.

Interpersonal Classroom Issues

- WebEx meetings
- Weeks 1 & 2
 - Students used webcam and participated a great deal
- Weeks 3 to 5
 - Most students avoided using Webcam
 - Professor gave high-energy presentations to keep students' interest and decrease their sense of defeatism from being on lockdown
- Week 6
 - ► All students used webcam
 - Students wanted to see each other and be seen as a final goodbye

Grading and Feedback

► All assignments were submitted via email as Word documents.

- Professor provided copious feedback using Track Changes.
- ► Some students had phone calls and private WebEx meetings with the professor.
- ► All students received many individualized emails about their assignments and course progress.
- ► All students were given detailed listing of all of their assignment grades three times over six weeks.

Academic Advising

► All Wagner students have an academic advisor to help them choose classes.

Because Wagner is a close-knit community, professors made extra effort to remain in touch with their advisees.

- ► All students received at least 3 phone calls or private WebEx with their advisor from March 23 to May 10.
- ▶ Most students spoke with their advisors. In some cases, parents spoke with the advisor, which the parents appreciated.
