Here's more news about your college mates and classmates in the service; - with a few excerpts from letters we've received in the past several weeks. More than 170 men and women (two so far) are now in active service. But, first of all, just a bit of news about the campus.

The government has finally issued its orders for college men. All enlisted army reserves may expect to be called about February 1, except medical and pre-medical students. They will be put on active duty at the end of the present college year. Those in V-1 and V-7 of the Navy will also be called, but will get a better break in the length of time they will be sent back to school. The army nor the navy has not yet selected the colleges it will use for the training of these men. The program at Wagner, therefore, for the next year is very uncertain.
