President Norman Smith to end 14-year tenure

He becomes the longest serving President in Wagner's 119-year history as he moves on to a university presidency in London

WAGNER's LONGEST SERVING PRESIDENT is making the 2002 Commencement his 14th and final one closing a chapter of Wagner College's history that many consider to be the most progressive in the history of the College. Dr. Norman Smith moves on to Richmond, The American International University in London where he will assume the presidency beginning in the fall of 2002. "Moving to London is a dream come true for Susan, Caroline and me," said Smith. "We have often day-dreamed about living in England, never believing it could really happen."

When I was approached about the opportunity, Susan and I immediately recognized our one and only opportunity to live in England and we jumped at it. Moving to London also represents an exciting new chapter for our daughter, Caroline, who will be 10-years-old when we move next June. She will spend the second half of her time with us in a setting that provides a wonderfully rich diversity to her childhood."

Richmond University dates back to the 1840's when it was first founded as Richmond College. The institution is largely undergraduate with graduate programs including an MBA. One campus is located in central London near Kensington Palace. The other site is about 20-minutes out of the city in Richmond-upon-Thames, one of England's most desirable suburban locales.

In commenting on his decision to leave Wagner, President Smith noted that he will never really "leave Wagner." "After 14 years, I am indelibly bonded to Wagner and will always be concerned about its welfare. To that end, I will be supportive and involved in any way that helps the College continue to flourish."

Smith reflected that he is gratified with the progress that has occurred at Wagner since his arrival in 1988. "My biggest satisfaction comes from alumni who tell me how proud they have become of their alma mater as a result of the improvements throughout the institution over the past 14 years. He noted, however, that Wagner's evolution has been a team effort involving many who "put their shoulder to the task." "Alumni like Donald and Evelyn Spiro, Peggy Reynolds, Kevin Sheehy, Al Corbin and John Lehmann, along with other important long time supporters including the Megerle family, played a 'giant' role in the success the College has realized throughout the turnaround era of the 1990's. Wagner's extraordinary achievements could not have been realized without passionately committed alumni and friends like them."

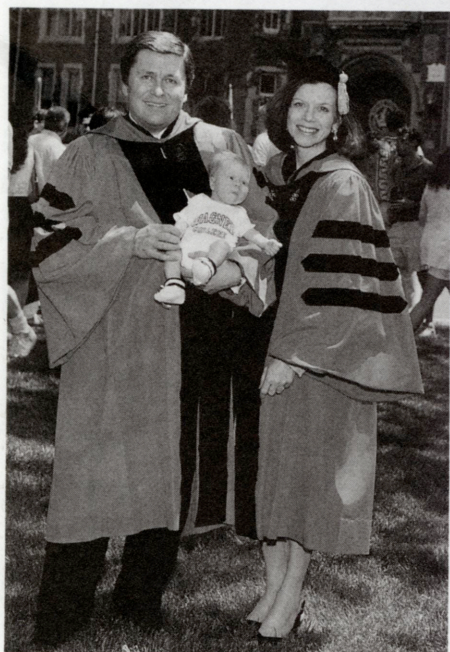

In his final few months at Wagner, President Smith will be focused on "saying goodbye" to all of his Wagner friends and colleagues while concentrating on the unfinished business of realizing a stronger endowment. "The missing piece of an otherwise wonderfully assembled puzzle is Wagner's continued tuition dependence. Wagner is the least endowed of the colleges and universities to which it is now routinely compared. If we are to secure Wagner's top tier status, a much larger endowment must be in place."

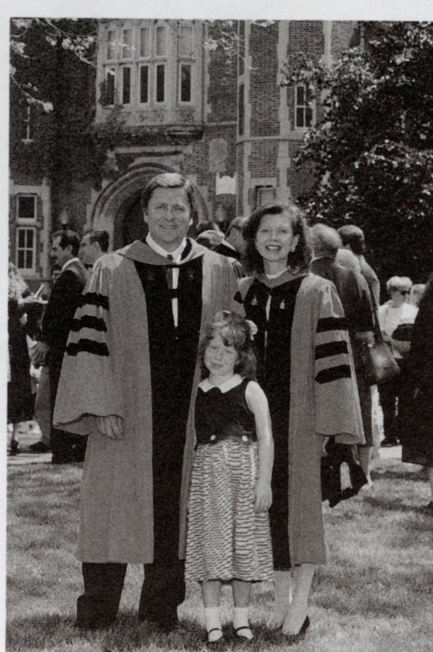
Smith noted that over \$17 million in endowment has been realized in the past year and a half and that he hopes to bring the total to at least \$24 million in time for the 2002 Commencement. "Wagner has proven that it can be among the best and I hope alumni and friends will endorse that aspiration with their commitment to endowing this truly wonderful place," said Smith.



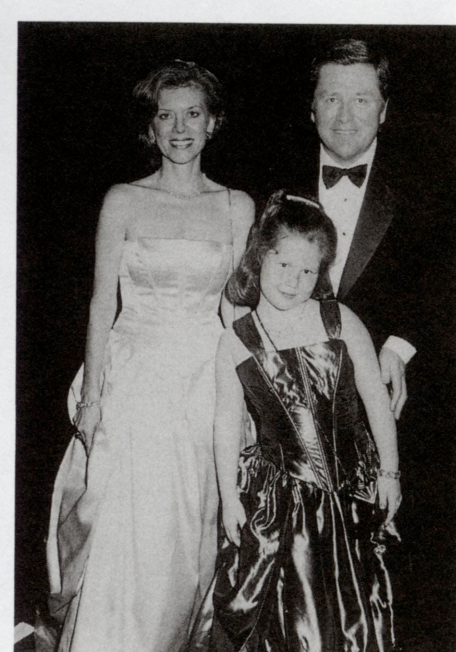

1988-2002 ~ Fourteen Years of Breakthroughs & Achievements

1988 ~ Dr. Smith arrives in May. By October, Les Trautmann '40, Editor of the *Staten Island Advance* reports "Norman Smith came on campus like a strong, fresh breeze on a smothering hot summer's day. He revived the life, rallied the troops, gave new hope and beautified the campus and the immediate neighborhood. Wagner indeed has a leader again. Tough problems remain and dog him, but he has wiped away fears that they won't be overcome."

1989 ~ Dr. Donald Spiro '49, assumes Chairmanship of Board of Trustees and donates \$250,000 for installation of College's first student computing center. His gift represents largest from an alumnus in history and the beginning of over \$10 million in Spiro family giving since 1988.

1990 ~ Student Union, residence halls and classrooms are renovated. Campus walkways and facades are lit with street lamps and flood lights. Local media herald "**Wagner's turnaround elicits accolades**" citing faculty comments that include "I've been here for almost 20 years and I have never seen so many changes take place in so short a period of time. President Smith has accomplished a turnaround that appears to be nothing short of miraculous."

1991 ~ Wagner is fully accredited by Middle States for first time in decades commending "first and foremost, a dynamic and talented new president who made strong, necessary and extremely gutsy decisions which have resulted in the College being the vibrant institution we find it to be and one positioned for a very promising future."

1992 ~ Dr. Donald & Evelyn Spiro contribute Wagner's first \$1 million gift for renovation of Spiro Hall enabling an expansion of the student computing center and upgrades to all classrooms and amphitheaters.

1993 ~ Trautmann Square is dedicated. Augustinian tract is acquired adding 18 adjacent acres and preventing high density development thus preserving a rural atmosphere for the campus while adding playing fields for soccer, lacrosse and softball.

1994 ~ Application rates begin to soar which will lead to a doubling of undergraduate enrollment. Academic quality also skyrockets as Wagner's reputation becomes more widespread.

1995 ~ Operating revenues up \$10 million from three years earlier.

1996 ~ Enrollment growth exceeds 450 students over past four years.

1997 ~ Wagner achieves "top tier" ranking from *U.S. News & World Report's* Best Colleges for first time. Wagner Plan curriculum is introduced. New football stadium opens.

1998 ~ Spiro Sports Center, Wagner's first major construction in decades is underway.

1999 ~ Association of American Colleges & Universities cites Wagner Plan curriculum as one of the most noteworthy new developments in undergraduate education in America. Wagner's business program receives its first accreditation from the Association of Collegiate Schools of Business.

2000 ~ North Hall is renovated and renamed Reynolds House in honor of Trustee William Reynolds who died in 1998. Campus walkways upgraded to brick surfacing through gifts from Trustee Dr. Margaret Bambach Buck Reynolds '40. Classrooms are renovated through a major gift from Richmond County Savings Bank Foundation.

2001 ~ In their "2002 Colleges of the Year" edition, *TIME* magazine cites Wagner College as one of four notable liberal arts colleges in America. Middle States reaccredits Wagner with commendations for "visionary leadership" and "significant progress over the past decade."

2002 ~ The Smith-Spiro era comes to a close.

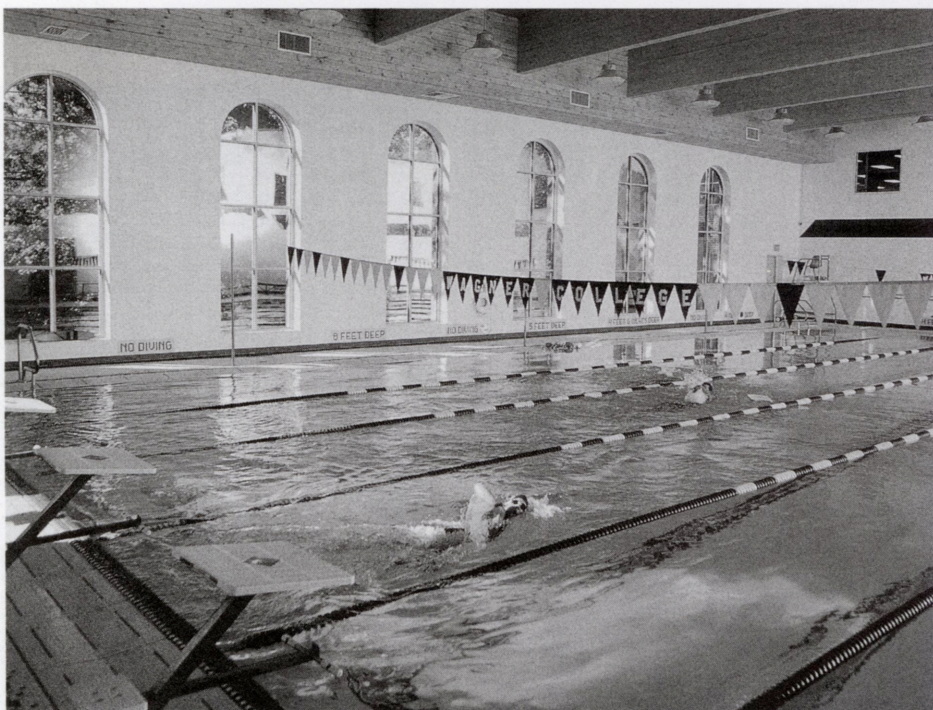

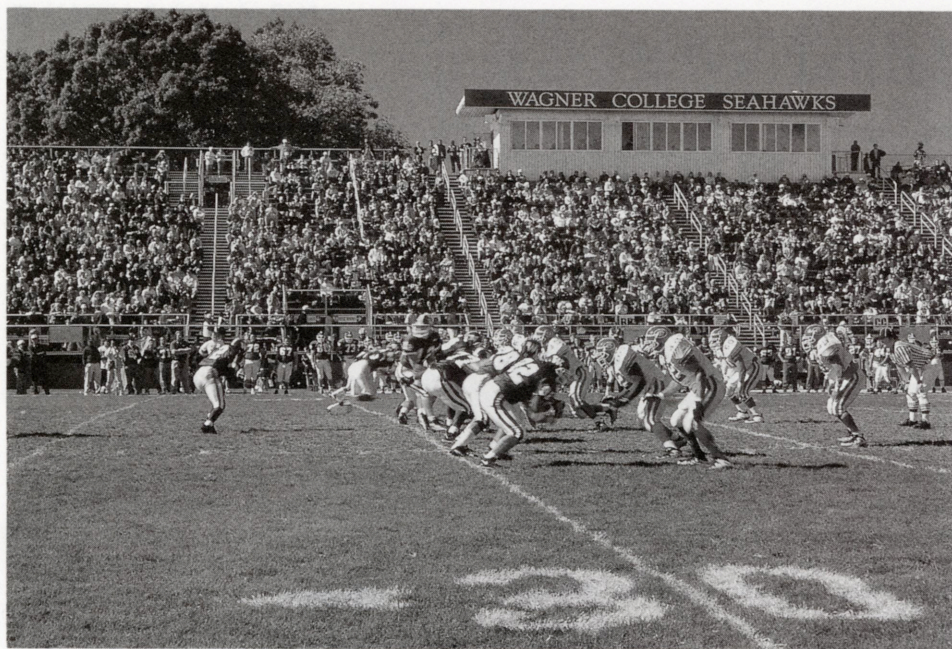

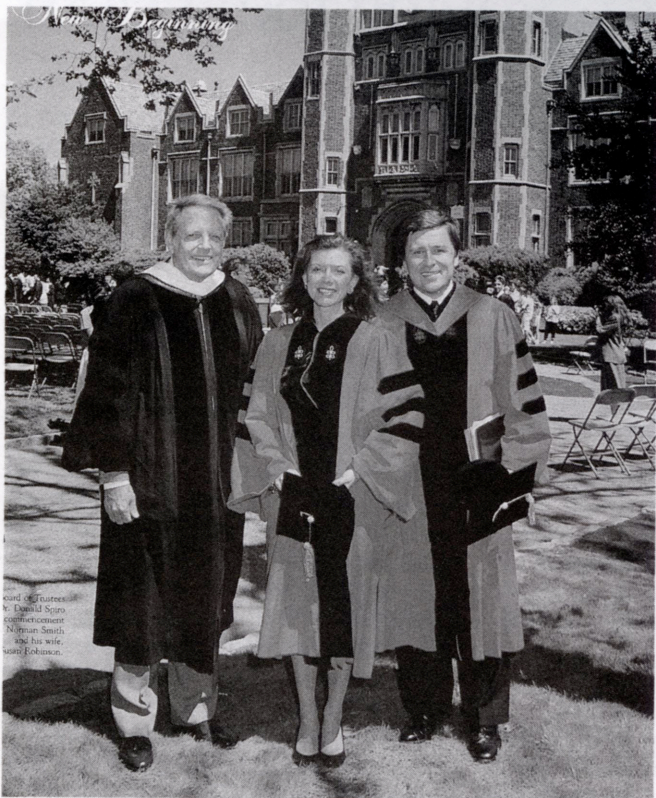

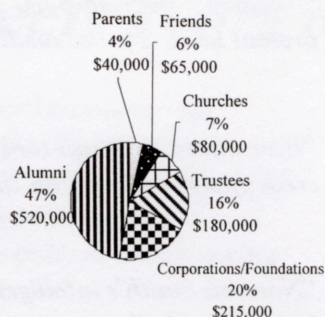
Currently, 75% of alumni that give to Wagner College do so as a result of the calls from the Student Caller Program.

Presidential search under way

Following Dr. Norman Smith's announcement in November that he will be leaving Wagner to assume the presidency of The American University in London, a search committee was formed.

Smith's departure brings to a close an unprecedented 14 years of distinguished service to Wagner.

"His leadership and accomplishments over the years are so significant," said Bob O'Brien, chairman of the Board of Trustees, "that finding a successor seems at first like a daunting task."

The Board, which has the responsibility of selecting the next president, has appointed a search committee co-chaired by Don Spiro '49 and Jay Hartig '67. They were members of the search committee that brought Dr. Smith to Wagner in 1988.

The committee has 16 members and includes Trustees, faculty, administrators,

students and alumni. Louise Repage Kaufman '75 M '78 is representing the National Alumni Association.

The committee has engaged EMN/Witt Kiefer as search consultants. Gary Posner and Lucy Leske are the Witt Kieffer partners leading the project.

The search was announced in the Jan. 11 edition of the Chronicle of Higher Education.

New registrar Michele Dunn is already improving the system

Michele Dunn has joined the Wagner staff as registrar. Previously she had been the acting registrar at St. Mary's College of Maryland.

"Joining the team at Wagner was a great move for me. It had an established office, thanks to Dr. Mildred Nelson, who was an icon at Wagner. I was very excited by what I heard and saw during the course of interviewing."

"Also, I am from the area and have friends and family here so that was a plus," Ms. Dunn noted.

Ms. Dunn oversaw a major renovation of the registrar's offices in Cunard Hall.

"There were structural issues that needed to be addressed," she said. "We decided to use the opportunity to make the layout a little more user-friendly for the students and efficient for the staff."

An initiative that is being lauded by the students and faculty is on-line registration.

"We are moving forward with the initiative to have Web-based registration and access to their records by the students. The timeline is

aggressive as we plan to pilot things in the spring to have full implementation in fall of 2002," Ms. Dunn explained.

Recent alumni will also be able to review their records.

"For the students, it means they'll have access to academic records at any time from any computer. For the faculty, they'll have more time to

advise as registering will be much easier. And for the staff, it will alleviate some of the burden of paper pushing and allow for more personal contact with the students."

A computerized degree audit system is the next initiative. "Advisors and students, with a click of the mouse, will see progress to degree requirements and core fulfillment," announced Ms. Dunn.

Living only a mile from campus, Wagner's new registrar makes her home with her dog, Max and cat, Cleo.

Hard-working season

The Seahawks have capped their third year under head coach Phil Fluhr. They finished another demanding season with a record of 4-14-1 and 2-8 in the Northeast Conference (NEC).

Wagner topped St. Peter's College, Mount St. Mary's College, Long Island University and Howard University. The Seahawks improved from a 1-17-1 record in 2000. With the presence of young talent and upperclassmen support, the women's soccer team is poised to improve in 2002.

Freshman Melinda Suss (Downingtown, Pa.), the Seahawks' leading scorer, tallied six goals on the season and was nominated for Northeast Conference Rookie of the Year.

Sophomore Jennifer Spadafino (Old Bridge, N.J.) totaled four goals and freshman teammate Erin Schubert (Monroe, N.J.) was an impressive addition to the Seahawks with three goals and one assist.

Senior Kristen Lang (Medfield, Mass.) finished her collegiate career and in the 2001 season, started in 18 of 19 games and compiled two assists on 10 shots.

Junior Dana Honcharuk (Edison, N.J.), who compiled a remarkable 164 saves, fiercely protected Wagner's goal.

"With continued hard work and a strong 2002 freshman class next year, we hope to steal a spot in the NEC Championships," said Fluhr.

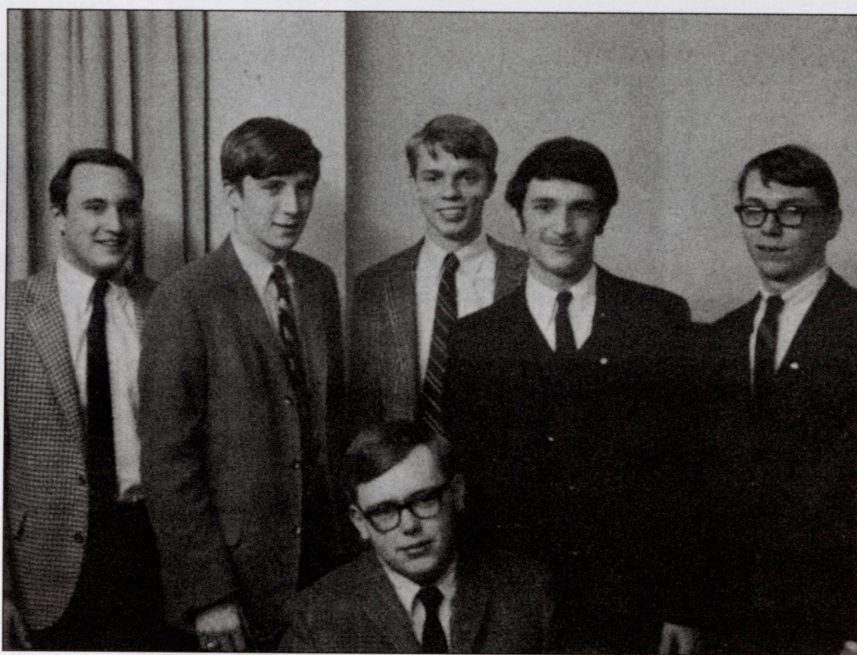

Good grades pay off with a trip to Italy

A faculty-alumnus partnership makes it all possible

A professor of Psychology and the director of the Wagner College Honors Program, Dr. Miles Groth is an accomplished scholar who has built a reputation among students as an engaging and challenging professor. His courses include “Psychology of Men,” “Abnormal Psychology,” and “Jung: Psychology, Mythology, Mysticism.”

But his mission as a faculty member goes beyond the classroom. Last fall, Dr. Groth began brainstorming an idea to reward a small group of eligible honors students for their hard work by giving them the opportunity to study abroad in Venice during the summer. The catch? The trip would be college funded, and the students would be attending the program as if on scholarship. Dr. Groth decided that study abroad supplied the final element in receiving a well-rounded liberal arts education. He realized

that in another country, students would be able to see and experience the things they had been reading and writing about for the past few years. And so, the City-as-Text program was born. Adapted from a similar program organized by the National Collegiate Honor Society, City-as-Text submerges students in the culture of one European city for an extended length of time. “This allows the students to familiarize themselves with the city and better understand the culture,” he said. To kick-start the program, Dr. Groth sent out a series of letters to prominent Staten Island business and political figures. Initially, he was a bit discouraged by a lack of response, but had “no doubt that the program would eventually come together.”

He ran his ideas past fellow faculty members, including adjunct professor and 1960 alum Louis DeLuca. Dr. Groth asked DeLuca if he knew of anyone who would be interested in helping establish a study abroad program in Italy for the honors program. At the time, DeLuca had been playing around with the idea of establishing an Italian-American heritage, or research institution, within the college. It seemed they had stumbled onto an opportunity to develop both programs together.

An alumnus gives back

Louis DeLuca, a longtime resident of Staten Island, has taken to heart the concept of “giving back.” As the CEO of United Activities Unlimited, an organization that specializes in establishing programs dealing with substance abuse for students, DeLuca has been involved in the Staten Island education system for nearly 40 years. A burly, jolly man, DeLuca is active in several other non-profit organizations on Staten Island. He is a coordinator of the Staten Island Children’s Campaign, Board Vice President for Community Resources for the Developmentally Disabled, and decade chair for the Wagner College Fund. DeLuca and Dr. Groth plunged headlong

in the project. DeLuca invited Staten Islanders to get involved with the program while Dr. Groth opened the trip up to his honors students. The program was announced at a luncheon. “I am very proud of being an American,” DeLuca explained. “I am also very proud to be of Italian descent. I want to modify the image of Italian-Americans in today’s culture. I want to highlight all of the things that Italians have brought to our civilization, from the arts to science and astronomy.” Dr. Groth assigned a reading list to the would-be traveling scholars, bought them each an Italy travel guide and brought them to the luncheon to meet the sponsors who would make the trip possible. The entire project, from conception to execution, came together within eight months. “I took a chance and made the reservations not knowing for sure if the money would be there, and in the end it was,” Dr. Groth said. DeLuca raised about \$1,500 per student. “The only people who didn’t give,” explained DeLuca, “were the ones I didn’t ask.” Dr. Groth looks forward to this year’s trip planned for Rome. A new faculty member, Patrizia Palumbo, a native of Italy, has volunteered to oversee the students as they soak up all the city has to offer.

Dr. Frederic P. Cande '69 readily admits that had his youth been ordinary, he would have graduated from Wagner College somewhat earlier.

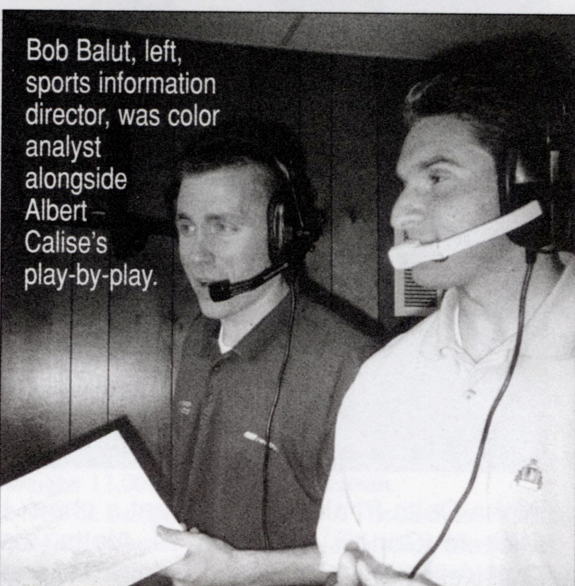
In fact, he and his wife, Estelle, recently celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary.

Kinsey Casey: Up for any challenge

Kinsey Casey, Class of 2002, has made her mark on Wagner College, from being the first student elected to the office of Student Government Association President while living in another country to working on Hillary Clinton's Senate campaign.

Here, the 22-year-old from Helena, Montana, offers insights into her Wagner experience.

LINK: Why did you choose to attend Wagner?

K.C.: I knew I wanted to go to school on the East Coast ever since I was a little girl. During the summer between my junior and senior years of high school, I dragged my mother out here for a major college tour: Boston to New York to D.C. Wagner was the school that really hit me. At the other schools I was in a big group and didn't really get a feel for what the school would be like as a student. At Wagner I was given a personal tour and all of my questions were answered.

LINK: What's your most memorable ...

K.C.: Don't even ask that question. I get asked that a lot. My most memorable experience at Wagner? Where would I start — there have been so many. How long do you want this article to be?

LINK: Then let's start with some of the biggies — South Africa, Hillary ...

K.C.: Working for Hillary Clinton's campaign solidified my interest in politics and the fact that that's what I wanted to do with my future. It was such a great internship. I learned a lot about New York politics compared to Montana, as well as a lot about New

York in general.

LINK: And South Africa?

K.C.: Well, of course studying in South Africa was definitely one of the highlights of my college career. More than anything it's helped me get an idea of what I want to do and where I want to go in the future. It had such an impact on me that I've been discussing attending grad school or law school in South Africa with my professors.

LINK: What originally prompted

you to want to study in South Africa?

K.C.: I wanted to know what it was like to live outside the U.S. I wanted to know what the rest of the world thought of America.

LINK: Now that you've had that experience and with graduation coming up in a few months, what are you planning?

K.C.: I would love to attend law school there, but as for solid plans I'm not sure. Grad school, law school ... the one thing I am sure about is that I

want to work on Capitol Hill at some point.

LINK: Tell us what it was like coming from Montana to New York.

K.C.: Going from small town to city lifestyle? That's Wagner's strength. First I should let you know that I was ready to leave Montana, I think I was one of 10 students from my senior class to attend college out of state. I was really looking forward to coming here. Wagner has that ability to be metropolitan and suburban at the same time. The campus is quiet in a picturesque New England-ish way, while one of the major cultural centers of the world — Manhattan — is only 20 minutes away.

LINK: Does being from Montana make you a minority?

K.C.: (laughing) I think so. Actually there are two of us from Montana at Wagner. That says something about diversity here. We didn't know each other before we got here, but it turns out that even though we're from different towns, we have a mutual friend.

LINK: OK, what about your professors?

K.C.: Wagner professors? They're great, really. If I have a problem or a question I go to their office and ask. Especially Dr. Snow and Dr. Guarasci. I don't know if that's possible at bigger schools. Here they know my name, my major, they care about what I have to say.

LINK: What advice would you give an incoming freshman?

K.C.: Participate. You'll learn so much and meet so many cool people. Don't waste time sitting around your dorm room, get out there and do something.

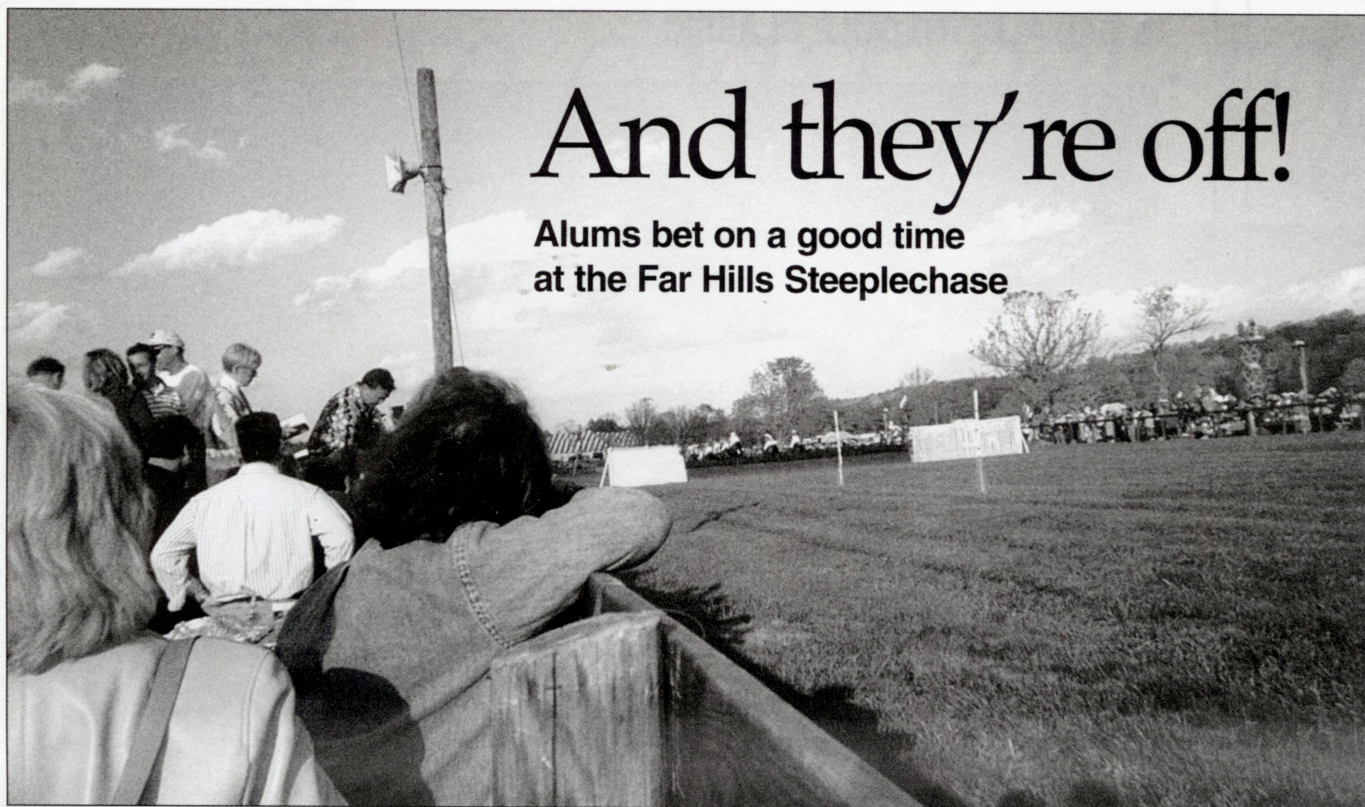

■ THE ANCHOR

Symbol of Wagner's rich history

Wagner's rich history includes strong ties to the Cunard SteamShip Company. The College's original 38 acres overlooking New York harbor were once the estate of Sir Edward Cunard of the cruise ship line that bore his name.

The Rev. Dr. Frederic Sutter, one of the College's earliest graduates and a young pastor in Stapleton at the time, had the responsibility of finding a new site for Wagner as it was outgrowing the facilities in Western New York. He couldn't have selected a better location.

Many alumni recognize that Cunard Hall was one of the few College buildings in the early years, and remember that it served many purposes.

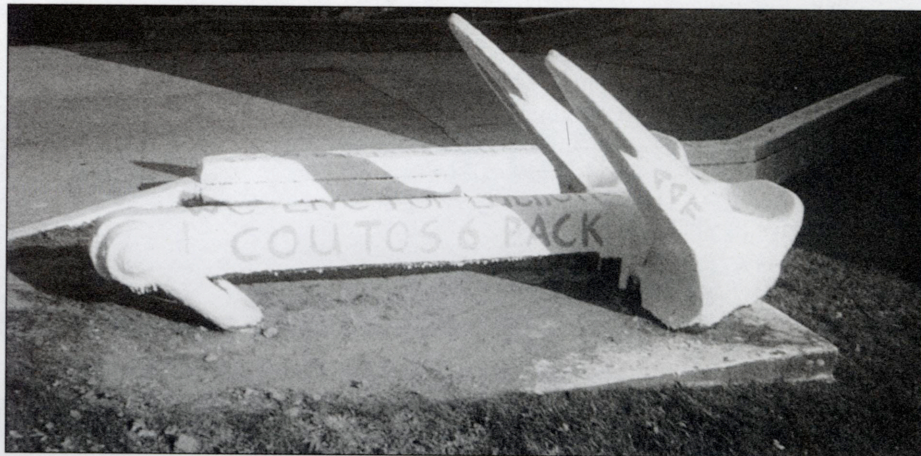
It has been a faculty residence, dining hall, recreation area, classroom, language laboratory, and also housed the admissions, registrar, business and modern language offices.

Forty-five years after arriving on the Hill, the Cunard Steamship Company continued its relationship with the College by donating the now famous anchor.

It was dedicated at the 1963 Homecoming and came from the passenger Cunarder, Media.

Media was part of Cunard's fleet for 14 years and sailed until she was sold in 1961. She was the first passenger-carrying Cunarder built after the war, the first Atlantic liner (and Cunard liner) to be fitted with stabilizers, and the first in the fleet to be named Media.

The anchor weighs 13,000 pounds and, when it first arrived on campus, was supported on a four-foot concrete base that weighed six tons. It was appropriately

positioned in the back of Cunard Hall and has a plaque that reads "12,999 lb. Anchor from the Cunard Liner MEDIA which from 1947 to 1961 sailed the Liverpool/New York service. Presented to Wagner College by the Cunard SteamShip Company Limited. Dedicated October 19, 1963."

Marilyn (Holvig) Schrader '65, a member of the choir and Alpha Omicron Pi sorority, was the 1963 Homecoming Queen. Part of her responsibilities included christening the anchor at the dedication.

"I took a bottle of champagne and broke it on the anchor, as you would a ship. The tradition of painting the anchor immediately followed (within the week). It was a great way for organizations to show their identity," recalled Ms. Schrader.

The tradition of "decorating" the anchor actually began before the dedication when a group of students covered it with shaving cream.

The anchor is currently located in front of Harbor View Hall. To this day, many students and their organizations get to

show off their artistic talents with paints and brushes. Many Greek organizations display their letters and colors and list the names of new members.

Laura Ambrogi, a junior in the Alpha Sigma Alpha sorority, said: "This year was the 100th year anniversary of our national, so all the sisters painted it. It was an amazing feeling of unity. It's a celebration, getting together and painting it, a recognition of the group on campus."

Painting the anchor is a wonderful tradition that allows organizations to literally get their name out there.

Chris Zaki, a sophomore, added: "It brings a group together. Not just the Greeks paint the anchor; any organization can — SGA (Student Government Association,) the radio station, Peer Leaders, etc. It's a great tradition; letting Wagner know an organization is solid, recognized."

Now more than ever, the anchor is a symbol of Wagner College as an institution, letting everyone know that it is solid and recognized.

Seahawk sees the light

The 2001 football season started with much anticipation, especially for one student athlete.

Ryan Castellani, a junior from Peckville, Pa., overcame blindness from a viral infection. Six months ago, he couldn't even walk outside in the bright sunlight, and if he did he needed special sunglasses. But still it was very painful.

Castellani went blind in his right eye after developing acanthamoeba from bad water while showering after the Jacksonville, Fla., football game that ended the 2000 season, and that almost ended his career.

It wasn't so much the pain that he minded but rather the thought of never being able to play football again that plagued him.

It wasn't until May 2001 that the doctors correctly diagnosed the infection, which often causes blindness. Unfortunately, so did the medication. "They found out that

I would go blind from the medication," Castellani said of the diagnosis.

"There'd be so much scar tissue once they killed the virus that I probably wouldn't be able to see and go outside. When they gave me the right medication to bring the infection out, my pupil turned all white. It's just a big cloud when I look out. The infection is basically dead, but it's a matter of getting a new cornea."

Doctors originally thought it would take a year to kill the virus, meaning he would not be able to play this season. That was tough news for a player who was a second team all-Northeast Conference safety last year and a pre-season first-team for safety and special teams.

"I figured I was going to have to redshirt this year," Castellani said. "I was against all odds for the whole summer. I never thought I'd step foot on the field this year. Then, come late July, the doctor said it really improved." That was all he needed to hear. That and the encouraging words of his father Robert.

"The thing that really got me motivated to play was my father," Castellani recalled. "He was the only one telling me I would play this year. He said that I would be against all the odds, but I'd be playing."

Castellani steadily improved from July until the start of the season with the help of a shaded visor on his helmet. He will sit out next season after he receives a corneal transplant in May to restore sight to his right eye. He hopes to return to the field for the 2003 season.

It would be easy for Castellani to feel angry after going blind from simply taking a shower but instead he considers himself very lucky.

"I feel like God gave me this and I can handle it and I'm going to make the best out of it," he said. "Some people can't even see with two eyes. I'm just thankful it didn't happen to the other one."

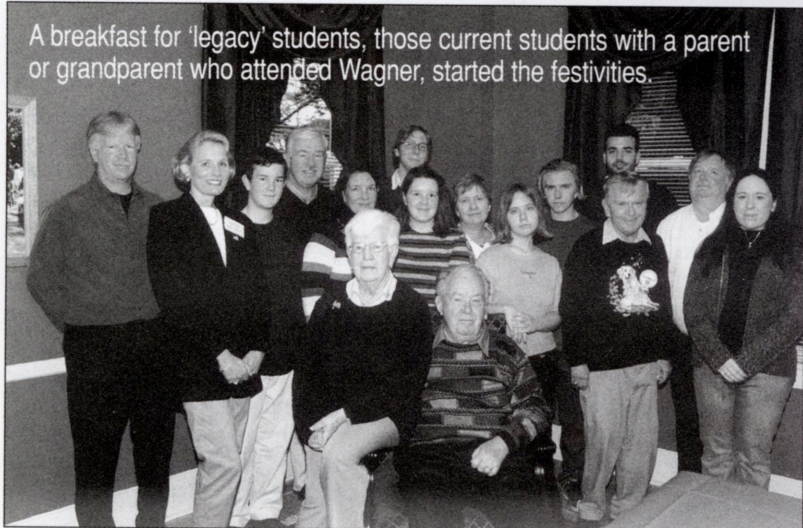

He left a message on his father's voice mail just before 9 a.m., saying he was heading to lower Manhattan because an airplane had hit the Twin Towers.

"Just tell everyone I'm all right," were his last words to his family.

Born in Grymes Hill (SI), he moved to Huguenot (SI) with his family in 1989. He was athletically gifted from a young age. He was a South Shore Little League All Star, competing in the Little League World Series in 1991.

He played junior varsity for Tottenville High School while he was still a student at Bernstein Intermediate, and was on the New York Sharks-Bantam A team, traveling in the U.S. and Canada.

Mr. Cammarata made the varsity team as a sophomore at Tottenville High School, winning sportsman of the team. As a junior in 1995, he won best defenseman title while playing club ice hockey for Tottenville, and was an assistant captain and an All Star for the New York Ice Hockey Association.

At Wagner, he was named Rookie of the Year in 1996, and in 1997 was the youngest named MVP in Wagner College history. That year his team received the Metropolitan Collegiate Conference Championship title. They made the championship game again the next year.

Mr. Cammarata was sworn in as a firefighter on May 3 of last year.

'My backyard is forever changed'

On Sept. 11, the Gamma Pi chapter of Alpha Delta Pi witnessed the tragic events that took place on the World Trade Center. On a campus that overlooks the Manhattan skyline, and whose majority population consists of students from the tri-state area, the devastation occurred as we watched.

To us, it was more than just a horror scene on television. It was mass confusion as we realized that current sisters, alumnae and parents, were amid the disaster sight.

Shock and hysteria were running rampant throughout campus as desperate phone calls were attempted.

Our chapter immediately began calling sisters and alumnae to discover their whereabouts and learned that some narrowly escaped. Mandatory meetings were held to determine if any students were missing.

ADPi sister Jessica Marshak, working two blocks away, was an eyewitness to the tragedy and the last student accounted for.

Trapped on Staten Island due to bridge closures, many of the Gamma Pi members headed to local hospitals after hearing that they were in desperate need of volunteers. Turned away due to lack of identification badges, the only thing they could do was give blood, or go down to the ferry to offer assistance organizing supplies.

"This was the least we could do for our fellow New Yorkers," said Sister Shauna Dignan.

While everyone was running away from the scene, one Gamma Pi was running towards it. Rebecca Honer, a junior at Wagner College and an emergency medical technician with the Hoboken Volunteer Ambulance Corp, began to prepare herself as soon as she saw Tower 1 on fire.

On the way over the bridge to her Rescue Squad and unaware of what she was about to encounter, Becky called her parents and nervously told them, "I love you. We're going into Manhattan."

At her location, she was given a special suit to protect her against chemicals and began to tend to some of the thousands of victims that had been in a ten-block radius of the crashes.

Becky will never forget what she has encountered in the past few months and will always remember the "horrible smell." Gamma Pi will always remember her as a hero.

Besides volunteering at sites and giving blood, the chapter helped in other ways. They raised funds for the American Red Cross, participated in memorial services and made a banner that was proudly displayed on campus.

According to Erika Robinson, Gamma Pi witnessed something that, "we will never forget, our children will never stop hearing and will change history forever."

One month after the attacks, students gathered on Trautmann Square to pray for the victims of Sept. 11. They tied ribbons around a tree and placed flowers at its base as a tribute to the missing and the dead.

Fighting terrorism at home and abroad

■ DR. ARTHUR O. ANDERSON '66, ARMY INSTITUTE'S CHIEF MEDICAL ETHICS OFFICER

Dr. Arthur O. Anderson '66 is the chief medical ethics officer for the Army's Medical Research Institute of Infectious Diseases.

As a result of his career with the Army he knows all too well about the threat of biological and chemical weapons. Since 1974 he has been part of a research team to develop diagnostics, vaccines and drugs related to biological warfare threat agents.

The ethical principles and procedures learned at Wagner gave him the confidence to be responsible for assuring that research involving human subjects at USAMRIID operates ethically, safely and respecting the rights and welfare of participants. He associates his success in medical ethics with what he learned in Philosophy and Ethics courses at Wagner.

Since the anthrax fatalities, he and his department have been very busy. "I had a chance to see the first indication of the Anthrax outbreak when we got a call from Tom Brokaw and Erin O'Connor. The next day we got one of two skin biopsies to look at. The other went to the CDC. Together we made the first anthrax diagnosis and the rest is history," Anderson said.

"Our safety office personnel oversaw the decontamination of the newspaper in Florida and are now busy with Government buildings in D.C.," explained Anderson.

With the fears of new letters, the cross contamination from those already sent, and a lack of Cipro for all Americans, the need to develop new drugs is apparent. That brings up questions about testing and approvals. Usually drugs are tested for efficacy on people who have a disease but with these new infectious disease threats there isn't a core group of patients and what sense is it to deliberately infect healthy people, especially when the disease is highly hazardous?

The F.D.A. is now rushing to put into effect a rule first proposed in late 1999 that would allow data from animal studies to be used in place of human testing when it is impossible or unethical to do tests on

patients.

But the agency is reluctant to relax its standards too much. The FDA faced similar dilemmas when patients with terminal illnesses pushed to use experimental drugs that wouldn't be ready in the normal timeline approval process and so their approval was accelerated.

Louise (Repage) Kaufman '75, vice president of compliance strategy with the pharmaceutical company Schering-Plough, noted, "The FDA has mandated timelines for the review of applications, usually about a year. In some circumstances, if there is a profile that a drug reacts similarly to another, one could file a "paper application."

Anderson said the Army was now going through 40-year-old data on vaccines it developed primarily to protect military personnel, so that these products may be considered by the FDA for civilian applications.

"A whole group of people would have to die in order to prove that this is efficacious," he said. "Totally immoral." Anderson continues his tireless research on our behalf.

■ COL. ANDREW P. FRICK '75, 26TH MARINE EXPEDITIONARY UNIT

Colonel Andrew P. Frick '75 is coordinating the efforts of the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU) as part of Operation Enduring Freedom.

An MEU is an intervention force with the ability to rapidly organize for combat operations in virtually any environment and is unique in that its air and ground combat elements are



combined with combat service support under one commander.

It includes a battalion landing team (the ground combat element made up of infantry, light armored vehicles, artillery and amphibious assault vehicles); a composite helicopter squadron forming the aviation combat element; a combat service support element that provides logistical support in terms of engineering, maintenance, and medical; and a command element.

"If Marines are called upon in the Mediterranean, we would be the first to go," he predicted. "We are the point on the

spear." Frick was right, as his troops joined the 15th MEU as part of the initial US forces to establish the base, Camp Rhino, outside Kandahar, Afghanistan and were present as that last Taliban city surrendered.

They performed successful bombing runs on Taliban convoys and provided close air support.

As America's War on Terrorism continues in Afghanistan, Frick and his troops will continue to play an important role. With the leadership of the Taliban and Al-Qaida still at large, the Marines will leave no stone unturned as they search various sites.

Dr. Martha Megerle, 1908-2002

Dr. Martha Elisabeth Megerle (H'89) died on Feb. 1, 2002. Mother of Wagner Trustees, Dr. George and Dr. Eva Megerle, Martha was for decades one of the College's most ardent advocates and supporters.

Born Martha Daiber in Schorndorf, Gemany, she emigrated with her husband, Eugene, to Staten Island in 1931.

The Sutter family, who was responsible for bringing Wagner College from Rochester to its present Grymes Hill campus, befriended the Megerles upon their arrival.

In a veritable storybook Horatio Alger manner, Eugene developed out of his garage the cosmetic products that became the Wella Balsam enterprise.

As their fame and wealth grew, the Megerles never forgot Wagner College and for decades set the example in giving. Megerle Hall is named in their honor for their advocacy of science education.

The building, which houses the science and math departments, was dedicated in their name in 1976.

"I remember first meeting Martha shortly after arriving at Wagner in 1988," recalls President

Norman Smith. "She, along with her son and daughter, expressed concerns about the College and its difficulties, and informed me that they were going to step away from their decades of extraordinary support.

"Thankfully, they changed their mind and became even more active. Over the past 14 years of my presidency, Martha's example, reinforced by her son, George, and daughter, Eva, have been key to all of the most important initiatives and subsequent successes that the College has experienced in the past decade and a half."

In addition to promoting the sciences at the College, Martha also loved the music programs and in the early 1990s sponsored their European tour, which included a performance in her hometown in Germany which she attended along with the town Mayor.

"She was bright, personable, energizing and, most notably, extremely selfless. She strongly believed that wealth and good fortune should not be hoarded, but shared toward improving the quality of life and education for others.

"Her legacy will always be among the Wagner College legends," concluded President Smith.

The Rev. Lyle Guttu, Wagner chaplain, officiated at a funeral service on Feb. 5 in Tenafly, N.J. Members of the Wagner College Choir, under the direction of Roger Wesby and accompanied by Barbara Wesby, performed at the service.

Wagner's biggest booster donates \$50K for stadium lights

Elsie Love is known as the 'heart and soul of the Touchdown Club'

There's nothing in Elsie Love's background that even hinted at the giant shadow she would cast on Grymes Hill.

She came to Wagner and Staten Island from a small New England town, Lawrence, Mass., shortly after World War II when sports and women were incompatible... when athletics were "too strenuous" for the "weaker sex."

Elsie was a cheerleader during four undergraduate years at Wagner. She's still a cheerleader: She's been at 55 straight Wagner Homecoming games — and is still counting. But Elsie's been much more than a cheerleader.

That was obvious once again this past

summer when the football team was practicing after the sun had set and the heat and humidity had begun to subside.

Elsie donated \$50,000 to the college in memory of her husband Art, her long-time companion at Wagner games who passed away 16 months ago. And, she specified the money was to be used to light the practice field behind the stadium.

"I asked myself, 'What can I do in Art's memory?'"

"The lights are what I felt was needed most," Elsie said, explaining afternoon football practices have been characterized by players arriving late from class, leaving early for class, or missing practice entirely because of class.

"Nothing Elsie does surprises me," said Jack Scholz, the free safety on the undefeated, Lambert Cup-winning 1967 Seahawks who has since had three sons - Jack, Jason and Jamie — play football at Wagner while

earning their degrees.

"Elsie was involved in Wagner football and the Touchdown Club long before I got here," Scholz said. Elsie is the common thread from Jim Lee Howell and Mickey Sullivan to Bob Hicks to Bill Russo and Walt Hameline.

"A Wagner superstar," said former trainer John Knudson, himself a Grymes Hill institution. "She's the heart and soul of the Touchdown Club."

Both Knudson and Hameline remembered when Elsie retired after a 37-year career as a public school teacher on Staten Island.

"She worked as a volunteer in the athletic department, primarily for the football team," Hameline said.

"But only six days a week."

There were also two tours as the first — and only — woman president of the Touchdown Club, terms as the organization's secretary and treasurer, and a 12-year stint

on the Wagner board of trustees — "She was a powerful voice for football," Knudson said.

Officer or no, Elsie was involved in the Touchdown Club's fund-raising, its end-of-season awards dinner, and all parent-fan road-trip arrangements — from Monmouth to San Diego — and everywhere in between.

"Elsie would take care of the new players and their parents to make sure they knew what was going on," Scholz said.

"Sometimes, she sort of adopted players," said Bunny Barbes, whose long-time coaching-teaching career has made him a Wagner institution. Much the way she adopted the football team a half-century ago.

"The lights," Hameline said, "are just one more thing they — Elsie and Art — have done to help the football program."

"But," Scholz added, "it won't be the last."
