NAA Board Begins Work Fred Williamson '64 Leads New National Alumni Association

Fred C. Williamson, Jr. '64 has been selected to lead the new National Alumni Association (NAA) Board of Directors. The Board, comprised of fifteen Wagner alumni, held its first meeting September 26 in Manhattan. Representing a cross section of alumni by class year and gender, each NAA Board member has a specific area of responsibility. Four officers comprise the Executive Committee.

The theme of the 1964 Wagner *Kallista* yearbook was "impact." Mr.

Williamson has truly made a most positive impact on Wagner College. As a student, he was President of Alpha Sigma Phi fraternity, alumni treasurer of his class, and co-captain of the '64 Seahawks football team.

After graduation, he joined the Marines. Serving in Vietnam he earned two coveted Silver Stars and a Purple Heart. Because of his heroism and decorations for bravery in action in Vietnam, he was honored in 1966 at Wagner's Homecoming with the Alumni Special Recognition Award.

He has prolific ties with Wagner - both present and past. Relatives who are Wagner alumni include his brother Raymond '66, sister Joanna '72, and sister Geraldine '79. In addition, his son Scott is a sophomore transfer student from Gettysburg College who played for the Seahawks football team this fall.

Mr. Williamson, who served on the College's Board of Trustees from 1981

to 1986, has been a consistent contributor to both the Cunard Society and the Seahawk Club.

Since 1985, Mr. Williamson has been President and CEO of CDC Contract Distributors, the nation's largest carpet contract firm.

"There's a great new spirit at Wagner. You can see it in the beauty of the campus and feel it when you talk with students and faculty. Our new National Alumni Association encourages all alumni to share in this renewed vitality," says the new NAA President.

Joining Mr. Williamson on the Executive Committee are the NAA Vice Presidents. The Vice Presidents coordinate the activities with the respective Board members in their areas.

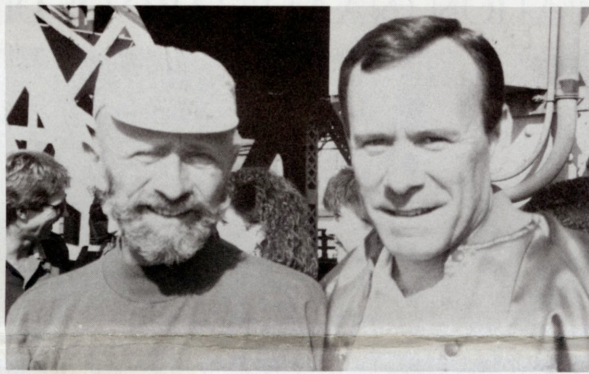

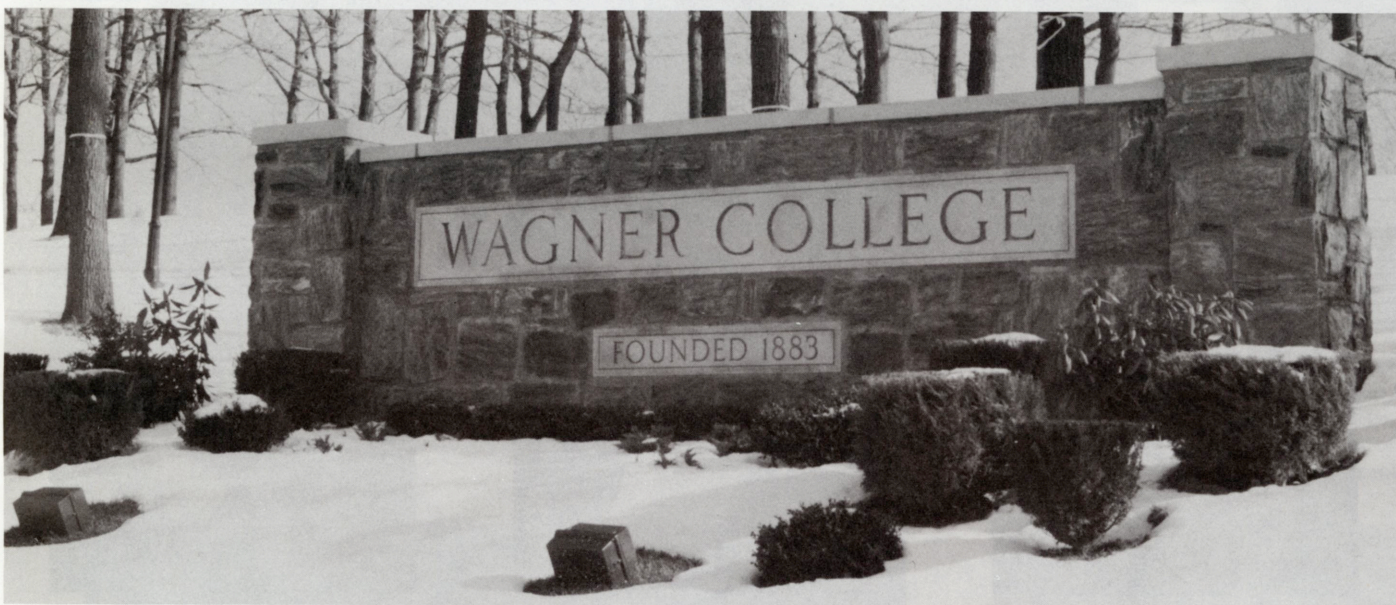

Rich Kotite '66 Named Head Coach of the Phila. Eagles

For the Wagner College community, Kotite's success is more than just another story of a former Seahawk who has made good. Throughout Kotite's career in professional football, the one time all-American tight end, has been a constant on campus. While many other Wagnerians left Grymes Hill to attain success in their chosen fields, Rich Kotite, class of '66, never really left at all.

Even now, after reaching one of coaching's most prestigious positions, no one in the Seahawk athletic department turns a head when they see Kotite taking time to counsel a young assistant football coach.

"The most important gift that Wagner gave to me was the ability to deal with people and to build relationships," says Kotite. "My head coach at Wagner (Bob Hicks) was one of the best influences I've ever had. He's really one of the finest people, I've ever been around."

It's just as common to see Rich Kotite sitting in Sutter Gym cheering for his alma mater as he did 25 years ago while attending Wagner. (He's been spotted at more than one Seahawk home game since he was named head coach).

"He's still the same person now as he was back in 1965," says Jack Minogue

of the Staten Island Advance. Minogue should know, as he's been on the Wagner football beat for 25 years.

Minogue's first season with the Seahawks was Kotite's last, and he hasn't seen anyone better here at Wagner since. "He gave 100 percent of his ability each play. . . he's the best receiver I ever witnessed playing in a Seahawk uniform as far as catching, running patterns, and he was a great blocker too."

Kotite still holds all the major receiving records at Wagner, including 119 career receptions for 2,065 yards. Just think what his numbers would

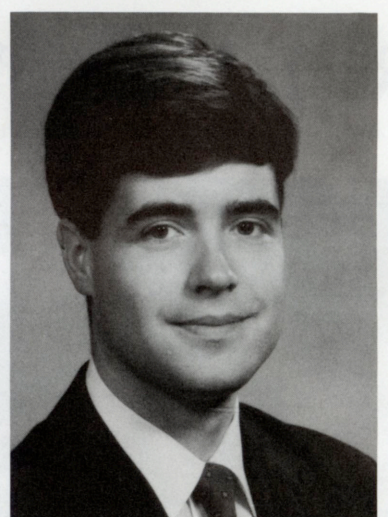

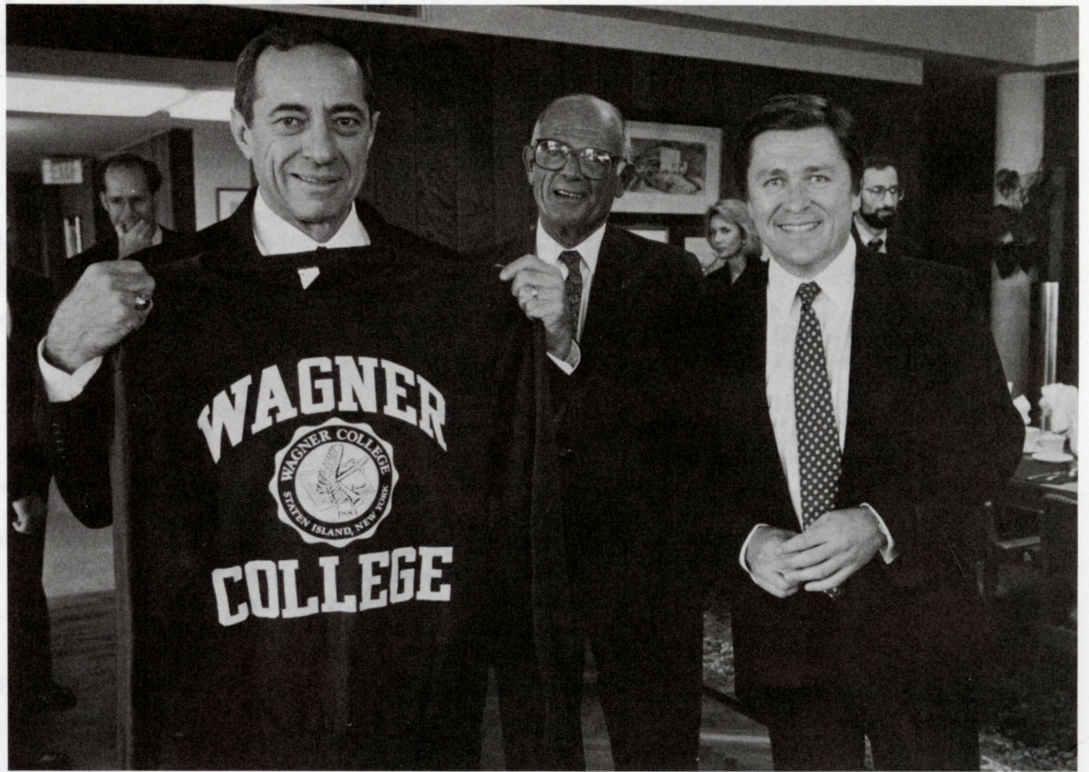

have looked like if he had played four years instead of just three. By far, 1964 was his best season as a receiver with 943 reception yards.

After Kotite left Wagner, he played six seasons of professional football for the New York Giants and Pittsburgh Steelers. His first coaching position came in 1973 at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. He stayed there until 1977 when he returned to the pro's, this time as an assistant coach.

For the next 13 years, Kotite studied and worked as an assistant under some of the best coaches in NFL history. There was Hank Stramm and Sam Rutigliano in the late 1970's and early 1980's and most recently Buddy Ryan, the man Kotite replaced this past January.

Kotite recalled what happened on that day he was asked to replace his boss and become head coach of the Eagles. "It was a difficult day

especially with Buddy being fired," said Kotite. "I met with Braman (Philadelphia Eagle's owner) an hour after he let Buddy go. . . When he asked me to take over, I knew it was a great opportunity for me."

Many colleagues have formulated their opinions on why Kotite, after 13 years as an assistant, was asked to be the man in charge. And though some differ slightly, most all concur it's Kotite's hard work ethic and persistence that has pushed him to the top.

Staten Island Advance Columnist Jay Price says, "I'm not positive, but I'm pretty sure if you look up consistency in any really good dictionary, they have one of those little pencil drawings of Kotite right there next to the definition."

Phil Muschnik, a New York Post columnist has a more vivid recollection of Kotite. "I grew up on Staten Island, within walking distance of the Wagner College campus, as a youngster he provided me with my earliest empirical lessons on the marriage of sports, sportsmen, and sportsmanship," says Muschnik. "Once, before a game on a particularly cold and windy day, he tossed me a dark green Wagner sweatshirt. . . Whenever I saw that Coke commercial which Mean Joe Greene tossed that kid his jersey, I thought of Kotite."

In the off season, when Kotite's not giving someone the shirt off his back, he's attending community events or is acting as chairman for the March of Dimes Celebrity Golf Tournament. Not for the hype, but because he's someone who really cares.

If loyalty and caring are traits a school hopes to instill in its students, then obviously Wagner College did the right thing for Rich Kotite. He's a fine example of someone, no matter how successful, who always has the time to share with others.

Kotite came to Wagner College to attend school and play football, but he found a lot more. He found success, happiness, and most importantly. . . a home.
