

20-YEAR DREAM REALIZED AS WAGNER INDUCTS TWELVE ATHLETIC GREATS INTO HALL OF FAME

Nearly twenty years in the making, the Wagner College Athletics Hall of Fame inducted twelve new recipients during Homecoming festivities October 26. These twelve join the first recipient - Herb Sutter '31, "Mr. Athletics" at Wagner for more than 40 years, who was inducted in 1988.

After an initial idea for a Hall of Fame by former Athletic Director and Seahawk Club Director Mike Walsh in 1972, he enlisted the support of Athletic Trainer John Knudson. Sal and Marie Alberti, class of '57 alumni and longtime Seahawk supporters, donated the trophy cases to handle the more than 50 years of athletic memorabilia. Sal Alberti and Wally Pagan, both alumni and members of the Wagner College Board of Trustees, and Fred C. Williamson, Jr., President, National Alumni Association, adopted the project as an initiative of the alumni.

An alumni committee, acting independently of the College, began meeting to develop selection criteria and to discuss ways to finance the project (donations have been received from several alumni to assist with the expenses). John Knudson, Athletic Trainer for more than 32 years who has maintained contact with a legion of former Seahawk athletes, serves as the chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee. He credits the Hall's "forward leaps" over the last two years to a strong and active alumni committee and the dedicated support of the Director of Athletics, Walt Hameline. "We have more than 50 years of Wagner sports history on which to catch up, so the committee views the first five years of the Hall of Fame as the 'inaugural' years," he points out.

The twelve new Hall of Fame inductees October 26 are these former great athletes and a coach - Florence Grunow Gode '38/basketball; Charles Hellriegel '38/football; Bill Willetts '48/baseball; Charles "Chester" Sellitto '50/football; Charles "Lonny" West '58/basketball; Frank Melos '62/football; George Cruzado '65/football; Henry C. "Hank" Pedro '65/basketball; Rich Kotite '66/football; John Gloistein '68/football; Arnold Obey '68/basketball; and Gela Mazella-Mikalauskas/women's basketball coach 1979-1990.

Florence Grunow Gode '38 was the center on the team coached by Herb Sutter in an era when women's basketball was quite different than today. Three offensive players played half court while three defensive players played on the other half court. Today, she serves as a choir director and enjoys swimming, canoeing and cycling. She and her husband Ralph, who reside in Floral Park, NY, have three children and have six grandchildren.

Charles Hellriegel '38 was primarily noted for his football accomplishments as a right halfback, but he was also a catcher on the baseball team, ran the quarter mile and was a long jumper for the track team. A retired engineer since 1980, he primarily worked on aircraft production. He and his wife Sylvia Ellen reside in Henderson, Nevada. They have two sons - Charles III and Robert John. They are great-grandparents.

The late Dr. Bill Willetts '48 was arguably the best pitcher in the history of Wagner

baseball. Considered the top pitcher in the New York City metropolitan area, he beat St. John's twice in the same season. In his senior year the team finished 17-5; his record was 10-1. After graduation, he went on to medical school and became an oral surgeon. Accepting the award was his widow, Mrs. Anita Willetts, who resides in Highlands, New Jersey.

Charles "Chester" Sellitto '50 was a running back and also played in the secondary for Jim Lee Howell's great teams. During the Homecoming game of 1949 he was selected as the first recipient of the Robb Memorial Trophy, which is still awarded annually to the outstanding player of the Homecoming game. He also played guard on the basketball team, later returning as assistant basketball coach 1959-1966 and head coach 1966-1973. He is retired and lives on Staten Island with his wife Patricia and their three sons Pete, Dean and David.

Charles "Lonny" West '58 was one of Herb Sutter's top players. "In the game that Wagner beat St. John's, Lonny set a record that I think is the most outstanding scoring feat for any Wagner athlete," says Coach Sutter. "That record of 39 points has since been broken, but Lonny did it against a true college powerhouse and in their gymnasium." An inside player, Lonny scored 1512 points at Wagner. He was also a high jumper for the track team, leaping over six feet using the old scissor kick method. He is director of the Mary McLeod Bethune Senior Center, New York City. Lonnie and his wife Joan reside New York City. They have three children - Charles, Christopher and Jacqueline.

Frank Melos '62 was the thunder on the undefeated football team of 1960. He amassed 232 career points at Wagner as a running back and also played cornerback on defense. As the catcher on the baseball team, he was equally aggressive at bat and guarding the plate. A self-employed manufacturer's representative, he and his wife Eleanor have two children, Laurie and Glenn, and reside in Marlton, New Jersey.

George Cruzado '65 started as both a center on offense and a linebacker on defense for the football Seahawks. He was a captain of the undefeated team of 1964 and a winner of the Robb Trophy in the 1963 Homecoming game. He continued his association with Wagner as a football coach for 13 years after graduation. George is currently the chief executive officer of Technical Telephone System, Inc., Staten Island. He and his wife Nina and their daughter Erin reside in Berkeley Heights, New Jersey.

Henry C. "Hank" Pedro '65 was tabbed as a basketball Little All-American (honorable mention) by AP in 1965. Ranking eighth on the all-time Wagner scoring list with 1,298 points, he still holds the school record for 21 field goals in a single game. One of his fondest memories is hitting the game winner in overtime against seventh ranked NYU. He works in sales/marketing with Quick International Courier Co. Hank and his wife Denise reside in Staten Island. They have four children - Gregory, Scott, Lauren and Marcus.

Rich Kotite '66 and '71 is one of the most recognizable names in the annals of Wagner College football. Last January he was named head coach of the National Football League Philadelphia Eagles, after serving as the team's offensive coordinator. He showed up at Wagner in 1963 after spending his freshman year at Miami where he won the heavyweight boxing championship in intramurals. He still holds all the major receiving records at Wagner, including 119 career receptions for 2,065 yards in just three seasons. He was an All-American when he left Wagner and was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings in the NFL and the New York Jets of the old AFL. He played seven seasons of NFL football with the Minnesota Vikings, the New York Giants (twice) and the Pittsburg Steelers. In 1973 he began his coaching career, first at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. Since 1977 he has coached in the NFL, on the staffs of the New Orleans Saints and New York Jets prior to joining Buddy Ryan's Eagles staff in February, 1990. Rich and his wife Elizabeth (the former Elizabeth Corkum, Wagner class of '73) and their daughter Alexandra recently purchased a home in the Philadelphia area.

John Gloistein '68 was a football first team All-American in 1967 on the undefeated Wagner team that only allowed 4.6 points per game and won the Lambert Trophy. A defensive tackle who also played offense in certain situations, he was selected as the player of the year by the ECAC conference awards committee. He was a shot putter for the track team. John is corporate director for Risk Management ADT Limited. He who resides in Boca Raton, Florida with his wife Ellen and their two children, Karen and John.

Arnold Obey '68 scored 1,081 points in his basketball career at Wagner. He earned All-Metropolitan honors. He was also a member of the track team where he ran the 100 and 220, ran a leg in the 4x440 relay, and still holds the school record in the triple jump (44 feet, 11 1/2 inches). He was assistant basketball coach at Wagner 1969-1972 and track coach for a year. An avid runner, he has completed the New York City Marathon 11 consecutive years. He is principal at Public School 31 on Staten Island. He and his wife Cheryl live on Staten Island. They have three children - Celisse, Tonyamaree and Karyn. Their oldest daughter Celisse also played basketball at Wagner and graduated in 1989.

Gela Mazella-Mikalaukas began her 11-year coaching career at Wagner in 1979. She had three 20-win seasons and two 18-win seasons. Her 1983-84 Seahawk team, which compiled a 24-5 record, broke the Wagner basketball men's record by winning 17 straight games. The 1988-89 "triple crown" team, after starting 0-4, finished 22-7. They won the Wagner Christmas tourney after upsetting the 20th ranked team in the nation, Middle Tennessee, in overtime, then went on to win the NEC pre-season conference tourney and the regular season championship. She graduated from Kean College (NJ). In 1983, she was inducted into the Kean College Hall of Fame. One of her most proud accomplishments is that all of her players at Wagner who competed for four years graduated in four years. She and her husband Greg and their two-year old Christopher reside in New Dorp, Staten Island.

The next induction into the Wagner Hall of Fame is scheduled for Homecoming '92, Saturday, October 17. The selection committee, composed of Wagner alumni, will begin meeting early in 1992. TWO ALUMNI NAMED TO BOARD **OF TRUSTEES**


Two more alumni have been named to the College's Board of Trustees. Thomas G. Moles ('65) and Robert C. O'Brien ('66) were selected in 1991 for three-year terms. Mr. Moles entered Wagner in 1961, but had his education interrupted by the Vietnam War and finished through night school. He played football and was active in

several student organizations.

Since 1983 he has been with J. & W. Seligman & Co. Inc. and is now a Managing Director of the corporation, President and Senior Portfolio Manager of Seligman Municipal Fund, and President and Senior portfolio Manager of Seligman Tax-Exempt Fund Services. Mr. Moles is responsible for over \$1.4 billion in tax exempt securities. He is married to Polly Peck Moles ('68). They have two children-Anne and Thomasand reside in East Windsor, New Jersey.

Robert C. O'Brien ('66) was admittedly not an active student at Wagner, working full time at St. Michael's to pay for his college costs. He has become a most active alumnus, however, serving first on the new National Alumni Association Board of Directors prior to being named to the Board of Trustees. He also helped spearhead the campaign for his class of '66 reunion gift to the College.

After Wagner he served as an Army officer during the Vietnam War and was awarded the Purple Heart. He joined Bankers Trust Co. in 1969 where he rose to Managing Director, working with leverage buyouts. He joined Chemical Bank in 1991 as Managing Director. He and his wife Patricia have three children-Corrine, Jessica, and Alix-and reside in Rockville Center, New York.

DR. GEORGE B. STEFANO '67 RECEIVES NATIONAL PROFESSOR HONOR

Dr. George B. Stefano '67, Distinguished Teaching Professor of Biological Sciences at the State University of New York, College at Old Westbury, was selected by the Council for the Advancement and Support of Education (CASE), Washington, D. C. as the 1991 Professor of the Year in New York State. The Professor of the Year program salutes the most outstanding undergraduate instructors in the U.S. - those who excel as teachers and influence the lives and careers of their students. It is recognized as one of the most prestigious awards honoring professors. Texaco Foundation sponsors the New York program and provided a \$1,000 award to Dr. Stefano as the top New York professor.

Dr. Stefano has devoted his career to encouraging minority undergraduates to pursue biomedical careers. In 1978 he established the the Minority Access to Research Center (MARC) on the SUNY/ College at Old Westbury campus and still serves as its director. It is one of only twelve in the U.S. Those students selected to work in his laboratory receive full tuition and also earn more than \$6,000 per year. According to Dr. Stefano, more than 87 percent of his students have gone on to postgraduate study.

He is also Director, Multidisciplinary Center for the Study of Aging and Director of the Old Westbury Neuroscience Institute.

Besides the CASE award in 1991, Dr. Stefano was also elected Executive President of the International Association of Immuno-Neurobiologists based in France. He has also been appointed to the National Science Literacy Conference by HEW Secretary Dr. Louis Sullivan. In the next three years this


committee will develop an administrative policy for science education in the U.S.

A widely published professor, Dr. Stefano's most recent book, is <u>Advances in Neuroimmunology</u>, published by Manchester University Press, which he co-edited with Eric M. Smith.

Upon receiving congratulations from the Wagner College Alumni Office for his CASE Award, Dr. Stefano notified the College that he would be willing to deliver a complimentary guest lecture at Wagner. His lecture on campus Dec. 3, on "Immunosuppresssion: A Neuropeptide Apprach with implication in AIDS and Schistosomiasis", was covered by the "Staten Island Advance" newspaper. It was attended by two biological science classes, faculty, administrators and staff and took place during "AIDS Awareness Week" at Wagner. He also had an opportunity to meet with the science faculty and honors students on his visit. Joining Dr. Stefano was Dr. Elizabeth Paemen from Belgium who had recently earned a doctorate in insect physiology at the University of Louvain, Belgium. She will be studying in Dr. Stefano's laboratory during the next ten months.

Among Dr. Stefano's comments at Wagner Dec. 3 was the fact that the U.S. is in a "national crisis" and is "doing terribly in the sciences". He cited the fact that more and more institutions are dropping the hands-on laboratory experience in favor of class lectures which is helping to create an "anti-science attitude" among undergraduates.

It is not all work and no play for Dr. Stefano. He enjoys being with his 13-year old daughter Michelle and sailing in his 21-foot boat and scuba diving.


